- A. A resolution in the matter of County Change of Zone No. 07005 from AGR Agricultural Residential to AG Agricultural, requested by Michael Vrchota, to allow the subdivision of Lot 43 creating an east lot and a west lot on property generally located at the northwest corner of Southwest 84<sup>th</sup> Street and West Pioneers Boulevard, Lancaster County, Nebraska. - B. A program resolution with the State of Nebraska, Department of Roads for roadway lighting located at South 120<sup>th</sup> and "A" Streets in Walton, Nebraska. The County's share of the project will be 20 percent which is estimated to be \$1,300. (R-07-0020)

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- C. Applications for Special Designated Licenses from <u>Hillcrest Country Club</u> to provide liquor beverage service in connection with golf tournaments to be held at 9401 "O" Street, Lincoln, Lancaster County, Nebraska. - D. A license agreement and lease agreement with Evare LLC for a financial software program, Evare Desktop, to be utilized by the Lancaster County Treasurer's Office. The County will pay \$3,000 for a one year lease beginning June 1, 2007. (C-07-0110)

A grant contract with the Rape Spouse Abuse Crisis Center for funding for the community-driven initiatives to address violence against women among diverse and traditionally under served populations while strengthening legal advocacy services for victims of domestic abuse and dating violence, in the amount of \$66,781. Term of the grant contract is January 1, 2007 to December 31, 2008. (C-07-0111)
- F. An interlocal agreement with the Village of Firth for one Sheriff's deputy for law enforcement services within the corporate limits of the Village of Firth. Term of the agreement is April 1, 2007 through March 31, 2008. The County will be reimbursed at the overtime rate of pay for the deputy assigned to duty. The County will also be paid 48.5 cents per mile for the Sheriff's vehicle used in the provision of these services. (C-07-0112)
- G. An interlocal agreement with Merrick County for the safekeeping, care and sustenance of juveniles while at the Youth Services Center. Lancaster County will be reimbursed \$244.50 per youth, per day. The agreement is effective upon execution and has a 30-day termination provision. (C-07-0113)
- H. An agreement with Cole Layer Trumble Company for the support and maintenance of the OASIS software used by the County Treasurer's Office. Term of the agreement is January 1, 2007 to December 31, 2007. The County will pay \$17,325 for the services. (C-07-0114)

- I. An agreement between the Lancaster County Engineering Department and Lincoln Electric System, in the amount of \$59,532, for relocation of utility facilities in connection with a construction project at West "A" Street from Southwest 84<sup>th</sup> Street to the Burlington Northern Sante Fe Railroad; Project No. C55-M-405(1). (C-07-0115)
- J. Utility Permit Number 846 allowing the City of Lincoln to construct a sewer line in connection with a new development generally bounded by Adams, North 98<sup>th</sup> and Holdrege Streets. This will be at no cost to the County. (C-07-0116)

  - \* \$3,000 to Indian Center, Inc.: Multicultural Primary Prevention (PRIDE) which provides for working with 100 Native American youth and families to reduce truancy and dropout rates.
  - \* \$1,000 to Lincoln Housing Charities: Expanding Horizons which provides summer enrichment for 115 youth at the Carol Yoakum Family Resource Center.
  - \* \$3,750 to YWCA: Parents Center which provides 25 teen moms tools and education to become self-sufficient.
  - \$3,580 to KZUM Radio: 'Parents Journal Radio Program' which provides underwriting for the national program on parenting, child development and prevention of 'at risk' behaviors.

- \$4,500 to Lincoln Medical Society Foundation: MAP Emergency Assistance Fund. MAP assists low income access to medication. (3,000 individuals served in 2006.)
- \* \$5,000 to Lincoln Council on Alcohol and Drugs: 'I Have Hope Campaign' which provides a 24 month public education campaign to increase acceptance of substance abuse treatment.
- \* \$5,857 to Voice of Hope: Family Violence Support and Therapy Groups which provides support to on-going groups serving 350 women in 2007. Art therapy will also be added for children.
