- 1) **MINUTES:** Approval of the minutes of the Board of Commissioners meeting held on Tuesday, September 4, 2007. (A copy of these minutes is on file in the office of the Lancaster County Clerk or can be accessed at <a href="http://www.lancaster.ne.gov">http://www.lancaster.ne.gov</a>).
- 2) **CLAIMS:** Approval of all claims processed through Tuesday, September 11, 2007.

### 3) **SPECIAL PRESENTATIONS:**

A. Presentation of the Commissioners Award of Excellence for August, 2007 to Jeffery Payne with the Lancaster County Corrections Department.

### 4) **PUBLIC HEARINGS:**

A. County Special Permit No. 07032, requested by Doug Barry for Radix, Inc., for authority to operate a youth athletic club and semi-public building on a 20-acre parcel, generally located at Southwest 14th Street and West Wittstruck Road, Lancaster County, Nebraska. This is proposed to be a church-based youth athletic club with a main building and activities located in the wooded area of the 20-acre parcel. A 20,000 square foot building is proposed to accommodate up to 50 persons (youth), operating from two to five days per week, primarily in the summer months. (See New Business Item 6A for correlating resolution.)

### 5) **OLD BUSINESS**:

A. Request from Don Thomas, Lancaster County Engineer, for a one step pay increase for Alex Olson due to exceptional circumstances.

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### 6) **NEW BUSINESS:**

- A. A resolution in the matter of County Special Permit No. 07032, requested by Radix, Inc., for authority to operate a youth athletic club and semi-public 20,000 square foot main building on a 20-acre parcel generally located at Southwest 14<sup>th</sup> Street and West Wittstruck Road, Lancaster County, Nebraska. (R-07-0087)
- B. A resolution in support of a grant application to the Recreational Trails Program for the purpose of constructing a motocross facility at the Abbott Sports Complex. (R-07-0086)
- C. A contract between Lancaster County and ABC Seamless Siding for siding, fascia and gutter replacement at Lancaster Manor. The contract shall be effective upon execution. The work on the siding and fascia will be completed by October 30, 2007 and the gutter work will be completed by November 15, 2007. The cost to the County is \$47,623.10. (C-07-0353)
- D. A contract between Lancaster County and AMS Imaging, Inc. for the purchase of microfilming supplies on an as needed basis. Term of the contract is from August 15, 2007 through August 14, 2008 with an option to renew for two, one-year periods. The price of the microfilming supplies is according to the accepted proposal of AMS Imaging which is attached to the contract. (C-07-0354)
- E. A contract between Lancaster County and Anacomp, Inc. for the purchase of microfilming supplies on an as needed basis. Term of the contract is from August 15, 2007 through August 14, 2008 with an option to renew for two, one-year periods. The price of the microfilming supplies is according to the accepted proposal of Anacomp, Inc. which is attached to the contract. (C-07-0355)
- F. A contract between Lancaster County and Spectramedia, Inc. for the purchase of microfilming supplies on an as needed basis. Term of the contract is from August 15, 2007 through August 14, 2008 with an option to renew for two, one-year periods. The price of the microfilming supplies is according to the accepted proposal of Spectramedia, Inc. which is attached to the contract. (C-07-0356)
- G. Change Order No. 1 to County Contract No. C-07-0138 with Brandt Excavating, Inc., in the amount of \$10,800, for erosion control at County Structure A-138. Soil conditions at the site have proven unstable and will require additional rip-rap material to stabilize the toe of the embankment. The change order will establish a basis of payment for concrete rip-rap. (C-07-0357)

### 6) **NEW BUSINESS CONTINUED:**

- H. A risk and information analytics group application and agreement with LexisNexis for computerized access to public records from over 15,000 sources. The access to public records will be used by the County Attorney's Office for Child Support Enforcement. Term of the agreement is from October 1, 2007 to September 30, 2008. The County will pay a flat rate fee of \$280 per month. (C-07-0358)
- I. A memorandum of understanding with the 14 counties of Region One Coordination and Communications (ROCC) for the following:
  - Formalize the ROCC
  - Establish and coordinate planning, exercise and training (PET) activities and interoperable communications within the Region in order to expedite efficient deployment of resources on a regional basis for public safety and regional emergency management response
  - Coordinate with other counties in the Region regarding the use of grant funds for the regional PET process and equipment.

Lancaster County maintains oversight and authority of its own jurisdiction regarding emergency management, and has sole control and discretion regarding the use of any grant funds provided to Lancaster County for emergency management functions. (C-07-0359)

- J. An interlocal agreement between Lancaster County and the City of Hickman, in the amount of \$339,148.80, for construction of Project No. C55-S-401(6), Hickman Viaduct, relocation of City owned utilities and the establishment of maintenance responsibilities thereafter. (C-07-0360)
- K. A subdivision agreement between Lancaster County and Robert and Ninette Lookabaugh regarding County Final Plat No. 07024, Lakewood Hills, on property generally located at North 84th Street and Agnew Road. (C-07-0361)
- L. An amendment to an agreement between Lancaster County and David Thompson, Attorney at Law, under County Contract Number C-05-0371. The amendment allows David Thompson to assume juvenile cases assigned by the Public Defender, except for abuse and neglect cases, for the period extending between September 12, 2007 and October 5, 2007. The amendment is necessary due to an immediate staffing shortage at the Public Defender's Office. The cost to the County is \$7,020. (C-07-0362)
