# 5) OLD BUSINESS:

- A. An agreement with Lutheran Family Services of Nebraska, Inc. to provide non-physician substance abuse treatment services for males placed in the Lancaster County Adult Drug Court. Term of the agreement is July 1, 2008 through June 30, 2009. The County will pay up to \$28,120 for the services. (C-08-0332)
- B. An amendment to an interlocal agreement with the City of Lincoln, under County Contract No. C-05-0300, for grading, paving and bridge construction of Southwest 40th Street from West A Street north to the existing City limits. Both parties wish to add to the agreement the authority for the City to acquire right-of-way for the project outside the City limits and to use condemnation to do so if necessary. (C-08-0347)

# 5) OLD BUSINESS CONTINUED:

C. A lease agreement between Lancaster County and the Healthy Families Project for approximately 712.5 square feet of office space in Trabert Hall, located at 2202 South 11th Street, Lincoln, Nebraska. Term of the agreement is July 1, 2008 through June 30, 2009. The Healthy Families Project will pay the County \$564.07 per month for the leased space. (C-08-0360)

# 6) **NEW BUSINESS**:

- A. A resolution in the matter of authorizing the Lancaster County Board of Commissioners Chair to sign an application for assistance from the Recreational Trails Program for construction of a motocross facility at the Abbott Sports Complex and to agree to comply with the terms and conditions of the program. (R-08-0049)
- B. A resolution authorizing the installation of two directional signs for the Country Pines Banquet Facility and Vineyard. One sign will be located on Northwest 84th Street just south of West Adams Street for northbound traffic. One sign will be located on West Adams Street 300 feet west of 6305 West Adams Street for eastbound traffic. The signs will be erected from August 2008 through the completion of the City's reconstruction project of West Adams Street and Northwest 56th Street, estimated to be in August 2009. Upon completion of the City's project the signs will be removed. (R-08-0050)
- C. A resolution in the matter of changing the fee for the approval of Special Designated Licenses. (R-08-0051)
- D. A resolution in the matter of directing the Lancaster County Engineer to conduct a study regarding the vacation of a portion of Southwest 86<sup>th</sup> Street between West Saltillo Road and West Bennet Road, and by vacating a portion of West Saltillo Road between Southwest 84<sup>th</sup> Street and Southwest 86<sup>th</sup> Street. (R-08-0052)
- E. An interlocal agreement between Lancaster County and Educational Service Unit (ESU) No. 18 for educational services to youth detained at the Youth Services Center. Term of the agreement is August 1, 2008 through July 31, 2009. The County will reimburse the ESU up to \$989,080 for the services provided. (C-08-0369)
- F. Contract with the Lincoln Area Agency on Aging (LAAA) for the Harvest Project, the provision of mental health, substance abuse and aging services to elderly residents of Lancaster County. LAAA will provide Specialized Care Managers to work 40 hours per week to assist in the provision of the services. The County will pay \$70,000 for the services and the term of the contract is July 1, 2008 to June 30, 2009. (C-08-0370)

#### 6) **NEW BUSINESS CONTINUED:**

- G. An agreement with L.A. Young, Inc. for professional services of a nurse practitioner to assist in the provision of psychiatric services at the Community Mental Health Center. Term of the agreement is July 1, 2008 through June 30, 2009. The County will pay \$60 per hour for no more than 32 hours per week. A Business Associate Agreement is also attached to the Agreement to comply with Health Insurance Portability & Accountability Act (HIPAA) Regulations. (C-08-0371)
- H. An agreement between Lancaster County, Region V Systems and Cornhusker Place of Lincoln-Lancaster County, Inc. for Cornhusker Place to assist the County and Region V by including in the services it presently provides, the detention of individuals who are in Emergency Protective Custody (EPC) in cases in which detention at Cornhusker Place is appropriate. The agreement is effective July 1, 2008 and will expire on June 30, 2009. Any party may terminate the agreement by giving 60 days written notice. (C-08-0372)
- An addendum to the contract between Lancaster County and Spectramedia, Inc. found at County Contract Number C-07-0356, for the purchase of microfilming supplies, on an as needed basis. The addendum renews the contract for an additional one year term beginning August 15, 2008 and ending August 14, 2009. (C-08-0373)
- J. An agreement between the Nebraska Department of Health and Human Services and Lancaster County on behalf of the Lancaster County Human Services Department. The County will organize and sponsor two different sets of four community education forums regarding new Americans by October 31, 2008. The County will be paid \$4,890 for the service. The term of the contract is July 14, 2008 to November 30, 2008. (C-08-0374)
- K. A unit price contract between CleanMax and the Public Building Commission, the City of Lincoln and Lancaster County for carpet and upholstery cleaning under \$25,000. The term of the contract is July 1, 2008, through June 30, 2009, with an option to renew for three additional one year terms. (C-08-0375)
- L. Agreement with the Nebraska State Department of Roads for State Recreation Road Project under Project No. SR-60(1) in the Branched Oak Lake State Recreation Area for improvements to a road which has deteriorated. The estimated cost of construction is \$80,360. The County shall be responsible for 10% of the construction costs and the State shall be responsible for 90% of the construction costs. The County shall provide all costs for preliminary surveys, plans, specifications, advertising, award of contract and supervision and inspection of construction activities. (C-08-0376)

- M. Agreement with the Nebraska State Department of Roads for State Recreation Road Project under Project Nos. SR-6(1) and SR-71(7) in the Blue Stem/Kildeer State Recreation Areas for improvements to a road which has deteriorated. The estimated cost of construction is \$122,100. The County shall be responsible for 10% of the construction costs and the State shall be responsible for 90% of the construction costs. The County shall provide all costs for preliminary surveys, plans, specifications, advertising, award of contract and supervision and inspection of construction activities. (C-08-0377)
- N. Request from James L. Haszard, pursuant to Resolution No. 4630, for payment of 25 percent of the reimbursement of Social Security benefits paid to Lancaster County on behalf of Patti Schulte. Lancaster County received the sum of \$5,135, and Mr. Haszard is requesting an attorney fee of \$1,283.75.
- O. Request from the Lancaster County Public Defender, to set the salary for Jennifer Houlden, having completed her probationary period, at \$53,500 per year, effective August 1, 2008.
