- A. A resolution authorizing the installation of traffic signs at the intersections of South 82nd Street and Wagontrain Road; South 82nd Street and Panama Road and South 82nd Street and Hickman Road. (R-08-0056)
- B. A resolution in the matter of authorizing the installation of flashing beacons with "School Speed Limit 35 When Flashing" signs and "End of School Zone" signs on South 68th Street and Princeton Road in the vicinity of Norris School. (R-08-0057)
- C. Applications for Special Designated Licenses from Meier's Cork 'N Bottle to provide liquor beverage service for the following events at Country Pines located at 6305 W. Adams Street, Lincoln, Lancaster County, Nebraska:

- D. An agreement with Robert Byington, M.D. OB/GYN to provide specialized medical care and assistance to Lancaster County General Assistance clients who have pending claims with the Social Security Administration and may be eligible for retroactive Medicaid benefits. The agreement sets forth a reimbursement arrangement in which the County will provide payment for the medical care and Robert Byington, M.D. OB/GYN will reimburse the County if/when the General Assistance client is later determined eligible for Medicaid reimbursement. The agreement is effective upon execution of both parties and contains a 30 day termination provision. (C-08-0409)
- E. A grant contract with the Voices of Hope for funding for two full-time advocates who supply enhanced 24-hour advocacy to domestic violence victims in person or by phone, in the amount of \$58,446, and advocate cell phone support, in the amount of \$1,200. Total amount of the grant contract is \$57,833. The Grantee will contribute \$15,350 in matching funds. Term of the grant contract is June 1, 2008 to May 31, 2009. (C-08-0410)
- F. An agreement with the University of Nebraska, Board of Regents and the Lincoln Housing Authority for operation of the Nutrition Education Program in order to address the nutritional needs of certain limited income persons living in urban housing in Lancaster County. Term of the agreement is September 1, 2008 to August 31, 2009. The County will pay \$19,085 for the services which will be provided by the University. The Housing Authority will also pay \$10,519 for the services, combined with \$9,492 from the United States Department of Agriculture (USDA) Food Stamp Nutrition Education grant for a total of \$39,096. - G. Utility Permit No. 932 for the City of Lincoln to install a 16-inch water main on the north side of Pioneers Boulevard between South 86th Street and Thorn Court to improve water pressure to the Firethorn area. There will be no cost to Lancaster County. (C-08-0412)
- H. An agreement between Lancaster County and Lorena Pulgarin for project coordinator services for the Medical Translation and Interpretation Project. Term of the contract is July 1, 2008 to June 30, 2009. The County's payment for such services will not exceed \$20,000. (C-08-0413)
- I. A contract with MilkWorks to provide, maintain and schedule the use of one breast pump to County employees at no cost to the employee. The County will give ownership of the County owned pump to MilkWorks as compensation for the services. Term of the contract is for the working life of the pump provided by the County as compensation for the services. (C-08-0424)
- J. A grant contract with the Family Violence Council for the management of the project and funding to ensure the implementation and monitoring of the Coordinated Community Response Program, in the amount \$15,000. The Family Violence Council will contribute \$5,000 in matching funds. Term of the grant contract is from June 1, 2008 to May 31, 2009. (C-08-0425)
- K. A grant contract with the Family Violence Council to provide project management of sex offender management efforts, in the amount of \$16,372. Term of the grant contract is from July 1, 2008 to June 30, 2009. (C-08-0426)
