Comprehensive Plan Amendment No. 08015, by the Director of Planning, to amend the "Community Facilities" chapter of the 2030 Lincoln-Lancaster County Comprehensive Plan to reflect the need and intent of Lancaster County to construct a new adult corrections facility in the area of Southwest 40th Street and West O Street. - A. A grant contract with The Hub, Inc. to assist in the general operation of Project H.I.R.E., a sixteen week program designed for young people who are in need of employment skills, in the amount of \$34,711. Term of the grant contract is July 1, 2008 through June 30, 2009. (C-08-0449)
- B. Reconsideration of Resolution No. R-08-0067 regarding the replacement of Attachment "A" which amends Article 1, Section 6 of the Lincoln-Lancaster County Air Pollution Control Program Regulations and Standards. Attachment "A" amends Article 1, Section 6 by increasing the notification fees for the National Emissions Standards for Hazardous Air Pollutants asbestos projects. The current Attachment "A" was provided in error and does not list the correct fee change. It is requested that the correct Attachment "A", listing the intended and accurate fee change, replace the incorrect version of Attachment "A".

A resolution in the matter of Comprehensive Plan Amendment No. 08015, by the Director of Planning, to amend the 'Community Facilities' chapter of the 2030 Lincoln-Lancaster County Comprehensive Plan to reflect the need and intent of Lancaster County to construct a new adult corrections facility in the area of Southwest 40th and West 'O' Streets. (R-08-0076)
- B. A resolution amending Section X of County Resolution No. 06-0005, Procedures for the inspection of on-site water supply systems and on-site wastewater treatment systems prior to the sale, transfer or conveyance of property. The amendment increases fees for evaluation and review of property transfer inspector reports and necessary site visits by the Health Director as provided in Attachment A. (R-08-0069)

6) **NEW BUSINESS CONTINUED:**

- C. A resolution amending Resolution No. R-08-0074 regarding County Special Permit No. 08030: Sagebrook Estates Community Unity Plan, on property located at North 176th Street and Holdrege Street, Lancaster County, Nebraska. The amendment replaces the language of one 'Site Specific Condition' with more specific language. The new language requires providing purchasers of lots within 330 feet of the pipelines with notification of the location of the pipelines and with educational material regarding pipeline safety. (R-08-0077)
- D. An interlocal agreement with the City of Hickman for one sheriff's deputy for law enforcement services within the corporate limits of the City of Hickman. Term of the agreement is from September 1, 2008 to August 31, 2009 and the County will be reimbursed up to \$75,033.86. (C-08-0475)
- E. An interlocal agreement with the City of Hickman for law enforcement services within the City, as needed by the City. The sheriff will assign one deputy for duty and provide one sheriff's cruiser. Term of the agreement is from November 1, 2008 to October 31, 2009. The County will be reimbursed at the deputy's overtime rate for the services provided and will be reimbursed 58.5 cents per mile for the cruiser maintenance. (C-08-0476)
- F. A network provider contract with the Regional Behavioral Health Authority (Region V) for the provision of certain behavioral mental health services at the Community Mental Health Center. Term of the agreement is from July 1, 2008 to June 30, 2009 and the County will be reimbursed up to \$3,072,072 for the services. (C-08-0477)
- G. An interlocal agreement with the State of Nebraska, Office of Probation Administration for electronic monitoring services as part of the operation of the Lancaster County Juvenile Drug Court. Term of the agreement is July 1, 2008 through June 30, 2009 and the County will pay \$8,000 for the services. (C-08-0478)
- H. A contract amendment to the subscriber agreement and order form between Lancaster County, the City of Lincoln and Thompson West for Westlaw computerized legal research found at County Contract No. C-08-0286. The amendment increases the number of users from 60 to 65 and expands the services provided to include Municipal Law and Legal Research Library modules. The monthly charge for the services will increase from \$1,148.25 to \$1,319.75 and will bring the overall total monthly charge for the West agreement to \$2,930.50. The monthly charge is divided proportionally between the City and the County. (C-08-0479)
