The location announcement of the Nebraska Open Meetings Act was given and the meeting was called to order at 9:30 a.m.

1) MINUTES: Approval of the minutes of the Board of Commissioners meeting held on Tuesday, June 28, 2011.

MOTION: Smoyer moved and Hudkins seconded approval of the minutes. Hudkins, Raybould, Smoyer and Schorr voted aye. Heier abstained. Motion carried 4-0 with one abstention.

2) **CLAIMS:** Approval of all claims processed through Tuesday, July 5, 2011.

MOTION: Hudkins moved and Smoyer seconded approval of the claims. Raybould, Heier, Smoyer, Hudkins and Schorr voted aye. Motion carried 5-0.

3) **SPECIAL PRESENTATIONS:**

A. "Marseille: White Corded Quilting" exhibit report – Maureen Ose, Communications Coordinator for the International Quilt Study Center & Museum.

Maureen Ose reported on the quilt exhibit (Exhibit A). She discussed the costs involved and the outcome of the event. Ose noted the exhibit is available on-line at www.quiltstudy.org.

4) OLD BUSINESS:

A. Promotion of Sarah Newell from Attorney I to Attorney II at an annual salary of \$63,687, effective June 28, 2011.

4) **OLD BUSINESS CONTINUED:**

Dennis Keefe introduced Sarah Newell and gave an overview of her history. Newell discussed her work in public interest law.

MOTION: Heier moved and Smoyer seconded approval of the promotion and salary. Smoyer, Hudkins, Raybould, Heier and Schorr voted aye. Motion carried 5-0.

5) **NEW BUSINESS**:

A. Special designated license applications from the Lancaster County Agricultural Society, Inc., to provide liquor beverage service at events at the Lancaster Event Center, 4100 N. 84th Street, Lincoln, on August 4, 5, 9 and 12, 2011.

Ron Snover, Lancaster Event Center Managing Director, said the applications cover events at the Lancaster County Fair: Demolition Derby, Figure 8 Races, Bush Tractor Pulls and Monster Truck Nationals (Exhibit B). Schorr confirmed that Snover read the letter of recommendations from the County Sheriff.

Julie Burton, Lancaster Event Center Assistant Managing Director, said admissions tickets are now available at Russ's Market, SuperSaver and Casey's General Stores. She said extra advertising is being done this year.

Snover said the County Fair runs August 4-13. He discussed the new fans and concrete work being done with the grant approved at last week's County Board meeting.

MOTION: Heier moved and Hudkins seconded approval of the special designated license applications. Hudkins, Raybould, Heier, Smoyer and Schorr voted aye. Motion carried 5-0.

John Austin discussed the need for bus service to the Lancaster Event Center. Hudkins said this issue was discussed with the Director of Public Works who is looking at extending a route to the Event Center. Schorr encouraged Austin to contact StarTran about the need for this service.

B. An amendment to Amusement License No. 2011-0001 for the Linh Quang Buddhist Center, 3175 W. Pleasant Hill Drive, Lincoln, to add a new event on Sunday, July 10, 2011.

Schorr explained this is an amendment to the original amusement license, which adds a concert not previously listed.

MOTION: Raybould moved and Smoyer seconded approval of the amendment. Raybould, Heier, Smoyer, Hudkins and Schorr voted aye. Motion carried 5-0.

C. A political subdivision tort claim filed against Lancaster County Corrections by Terry
 D. Dunn for lost property in the amount of \$6.

MOTION: Heier moved and Smoyer seconded denial of the tort claim based on the department director's recommendation. Heier, Smoyer, Hudkins, Raybould and Schorr voted aye. Motion carried 5-0.

D. A lease agreement between Lancaster County and Starting Point for sober living units. The County will expend Pretrial Release Program Enhancement grant funds in the amount of \$525 per month per unit. (C-11-0387)

Kim Etherton, Community Corrections Director, said the current sober living units are full; this expands on the current units. The grant is for two years, and up to 12 participants can be in the program at a time. Etherton explained that the Pretrial Release program requires individuals to have a home for monitoring purposes. Many of the participants do not have a home and must remain in the County Jail until their trials begin; this provides a place to live and the case management support they need.

MOTION: Raybould moved and Hudkins seconded approval of the agreement. Smoyer, Hudkins, Raybould, Heier and Schorr voted aye. Motion carried 5-0.

E. An addendum to a service provider agreement with Certified Payments No. 1, Ltd., to add American Express to the credit card processing system for the Lancaster County Treasurer. (C-11-0388)

MOTION: Heier moved and Raybould seconded approval of the addendum. Hudkins, Raybould, Heier, Smoyer and Schorr voted aye. Motion carried 5-0.

F. A resolution in the matter of directing the County Engineer to conduct a study regarding the vacation of Lot 2, in the Southwest Quarter of Section 4, Township 7 North, Range 6 East of the Sixth Principle Meridian, Lancaster County, Nebraska. (R-11-0045)

MOTION: Smoyer moved and Raybould seconded approval of the resolution. Raybould, Heier, Smoyer, Hudkins and Schorr voted aye. Motion carried 5-0.

G. Utility Permit No. 1034 for Windstream Communications to have 2½ miles of fiber optics cable installed in the north ditch of Saltillo Road between S. 40th Street and approximately ½ mile east of S. 70th Street. There is no cost to the County. (C-11-0374)

Hudkins questioned if the cable installation would be monitored. Ken Schroeder, County Surveyor, said it would be. He stated there was a conflict on the application so he made a note to go six feet deep in all the culverts.

MOTION: Hudkins moved and Smoyer seconded approval of the utility permit. Heier, Smoyer, Hudkins, Raybould and Schorr voted aye. Motion carried 5-0.

H. Utility Permit No. 1035 for Windstream Communications to have ¼ mile of underground fiber optics cable installed in the north portion of Branched Oak Road going west from Hwy 77. There is no cost to the County. (C-11-0375)

MOTION: Smoyer moved and Hudkins seconded approval of the utility permit. Smoyer, Hudkins, Raybould, Heier and Schorr voted aye. Motion carried 5-0.

1. A recommendation from the Purchasing Agent and the County engineer to award a contract in the amount of \$37,457 to Sapp Brothers Petroleum for lubricants for the County Engineering shop. (B-11-0028)

MOTION: Hudkins moved and Smoyer seconded approval of the recommendation. Hudkins, Raybould, Heier, Smoyer and Schorr voted aye. Motion carried 5-0.

J. An amendment to County Contract No. C-08-0433 between American Fence of Lincoln, the City of Lincoln, Lancaster County and the Lincoln-Lancaster County Public Building Commission for fencing services. The amendment renews the contract for an additional one-year term from July 1, 2011, to June 30, 2012, and verifies compliance with the Employee Classification Act. (C-11-0376)

MOTION: Raybould moved and Smoyer seconded approval of the amendment. Raybould, Heier, Smoyer, Hudkins and Schorr voted aye. Motion carried 5-0.

K. An amendment to County Contract No. C-09-0359 between Total Tool, the City of Lincoln, Lancaster County and Lincoln-Lancaster County Public Building Commission for the annual supply of power and hand tools. The amendment renews the contract for an additional term from August 1, 2011, to July 31, 2012, and verifies compliance with the Employee Classification Act. (C-11-0394)

MOTION: Smoyer moved and Hudkins seconded approval of the amendment. Raybould, Heier, Smoyer, Hudkins and Schorr voted aye. Motion carried 5-0.

S. An amendment to County Contract No. C-10-0372 with L.A. Young, Inc., for the services of a nurse practitioner at the Community Mental Health Center. The amendment renews the agreement for an additional one-year term from July 1, 2011, to June 30, 2012, and increases Ms. Young's compensation from \$65 per hour to \$68 per hour. (C-11-0379)

MOTION: Heier moved and Raybould seconded approval of the amendment.

Raybould questioned if the increase was part of the original contract. Brittany Behrens, Deputy County Attorney, said Items 5S and 5T show salary increases, which were requested by Dean Settle, Community Mental Health Center Executive Director. Hudkins questioned if this was an ongoing contract with automatic increases. Behrens said the contracts are renewed each year but do not contain automatic increases. The consensus of the Board was to discuss the item further at a staff meeting.

The motion was withdrawn.

KK. The setting of the salary of Richard Grabow, Deputy Lancaster County Attorney, in the amount of \$56,000 per year, effective July 5, 2011.

Joe Kelly, County Attorney, explained that Richard Grabow would fill an open position in the Child Support Division. Grabow discussed his move from private practice to the County Attorney's Office. Doug Cyr, Deputy County Attorney, expressed the importance of filling the open position.

MOTION: Smoyer moved and Raybould seconded approval of the salary. Hudkins, Raybould, Heier, Smoyer and Schorr voted aye. Motion carried 5-0.

T. An amendment to County Contract No. C-10-0464 with Dr. Patricia Bohart, MD, for the services of a psychiatrist at the Community Mental Health Center. The amendment renews the agreement for an additional one-year term from July 1, 2011, to June 30, 2012, and increases Dr. Bohart's compensation from \$100 per hour to \$105 per hour. (C-11-0395)

U. A renewal application for an adult day services license with the Nebraska Department of Health and Human Services for the Midtown Center in connection with the Community Mental Health Center. The County will pay \$300 for the renewal license. (C-11-0396)

V. A cooperative agreement with the State of Nebraska, Department of Health and Human Services, for child support enforcement (Lancaster County Child Support Referee) for the period of July 1, 2011, to June 30, 2012. (C-11-0380)

W. An agreement with BryanLGH Medical Center, on behalf of its Independence Center, for non-physician substance abuse treatment services for adolescents placed in the Lancaster County Juvenile Drug Court. The County will pay up to \$18,400 for the services. Term of the agreement is July 1, 2011, to June 30, 2012. (C-11-0397)

X. A grant contract with Voices of Hope in the amount of \$61,027 to provide funding for program coordinating of the Violence Against Women Act (VAWA) grant program, "Improved Response to Violence against Latina and African American Women". Term of the contract is December 1, 2010, to November 30, 2012. (C-11-0381)

GG. Acceptance of a grant award from the Nebraska Commission on Law Enforcement and Criminal Justice for the HUB LEAP Project; Grant No. 11-JS-0423. The County shall receive \$13,000. Term of the grant award is July 1, 2011, to June 30, 2012.

MOTION: Raybould moved and Smoyer seconded approval of the grant award. Hudkins, Raybould, Heier, Smoyer and Schorr voted aye. Motion carried 5-0.

HH. A mini grant application by the Lancaster County Sheriff's Office and mini grant award from the Nebraska Office of Highway Safety for the purchase of three in-car camera systems. The cost to the Nebraska Office of Highway Safety is \$10,500. Cost to the County is \$5,235.

Terry Wagner, County Sheriff, said these are replacement cameras. The Nebraska Office of Highway Safety matches the County's dollars 2 to 1. Schorr asked what happens to the old cameras. Wagner said the cameras generally have a five-year life span and then become unusable.

The agreement sets forth a reimbursement arrangement in which the County will provide payment for the medical care and Omega Surgery Centers, LLC, will reimburse the County if/when the General Assistance client is later determined eligible for Medicaid reimbursement. The agreement is effective upon execution of both parties and contains a 30-day termination provision. (C-11-0386)
