The Chair opened the meeting at 8:34 a.m.

AGENDA ITEM

1 APPROVAL OF THE THURSDAY, APRIL 7, 2011 STAFF MEETING MINUTES

MOTION:

Heier moved and Smoyer seconded approval of the April 7, 2011 Staff Meeting minutes. Smoyer, Heier, Hudkins, Raybould and Schorr voted aye. Motion carried 5-0.

2 ADDITIONS TO THE AGENDA

- A. Emergency Medical Services (EMS) Update
- B. Correspondence from Mike Thew, Chief Deputy County Attorney, Regarding Board of Equalization Notices on Property Valuation Protests

MOTION: Hudkins moved and Smoyer seconded approval of the additions to the

agenda. Raybould, Hudkins, Heier, Smoyer and Schorr voted aye.

Motion carried 5-0.

3 LEGISLATIVE UPDATE - Gordon Kissel and Joe Kohout, Kissel/E&S Associates

Gordon Kissel, Kissel/E&S Associates, presented a legislative update and legislative bills of interest report (Exhibits A & B).

Joe Kohout, Kissel/E&S Associates, gave a brief report on the hearing the Legislature's Business and Labor Committee held on Legislative Bill (LB) 397, a bill intended to reform the state's collective bargaining system for public workers. He said most of the support for the bill came from the League of Municipalities and said opponents were led by the Omaha, Lincoln and State Chambers of Commerce and Dave Nabity of the Omaha Alliance for the Private Sector. Douglas County testified in a neutral position.

Heier said he, Commissioner Schorr, Kerry Eagan, Chief Administrative Officer, Kissel and Kohout met with Senator Lathrop, Chair of the Business and Labor Committee, to discuss the Board's concerns regarding the bill. **NOTE:** The Board had identified its primary concerns as: 1) Levy lid adjustments for underachieving schools; 2) Cost of an actuary for pension plan; and 3) Freezing of wages until below comparability.

Kohout said Senator Lathrop seems open to adjusting the array number and suggested the Board work with the Nebraska Association of County Officials (NACO) on this issue.

There was general consensus to propose the array number be limited to five to seven.

Raybould said she would also like input from John Cripe, Classification and Compensation Manager, and agreed to contact him on behalf of the Board.

Kohout noted that the wage freeze has also been an issue for counties but said Senator Lathrop has indicated he intends to keep that component intact.

Eagan said he has forwarded the fiscal note on the bill to the Personnel Department.

Concerns were expressed regarding the fiscal impact of having to maintain two pay systems, subpoena power and the rules of evidence under the proposed legislation.

DISCUSSION OF BOARD MEMBER MEETINGS

A. Region V Governing Board - Smoyer

Smoyer said discussion focused on the budget.

B. Public Building Commission (PBC) - Hudkins, Raybould

Hudkins reported that measures will be taken to better secure the parking area underneath the County-City Building and the tunnel between the building and the north parking lot.

C. Board of Health - Schorn

Schorr said there was a legislative update and a presentation on sexually transmitted diseases.

D. Justice Council - Heier, Smoyer

Heier said they discussed the inmate population, pre-sentence investigations, and DUI's (driving under the influence offenses).

Smoyer noted LB 667 (Change provisions governing motor vehicle homicide, alcohol violations involving minors, driving under the influence of alcohol or drugs, bail, ignition interlock devices, and administrative license revocation) will require individuals charged with a DUI to be booked into jail which will increase the County's costs.

Dean Settle, Community Mental Health Center (CMHC) Director, appeared and asked that someone with expertise in the area of behavioral health or substance abuse treatment, like Travis Parker, CMHC Deputy Director, be appointed to the committee.

ADDITIONS TO THE AGENDA

A. Emergency Medical Services (EMS) Update

Schorr said the Lancaster County Medical Society decided not to renew its contract to provide medical oversight services for emergency medical services and the EMS Oversight Committee has been working to set up a new oversight system, including the hiring of a new medical director.

Hudkins suggested the Board consider providing funds to facilitate getting the rural fire districts to work under one medical director.

4 POTENTIAL LITIGATION - Mike Thew, Chief Deputy County Attorney

MOTION: Heier moved and Hudkins seconded to enter Executive Session at 9:06 a.m. for the purpose of protecting the public interest with regards to potential litigation. Smoyer, Heier, Hudkins, Raybould and Schorr voted aye. Motion carried 5-0.

The Chair restated the motion for the record.

Schorr exited the meeting.

MOTION: Hudkins moved and Raybould seconded to exit Executive Session at 9:24 a.m. Raybould, Hudkins, Heier and Smoyer voted aye. Schorr was absent from voting. Motion carried 4-0.

5 SALARY REQUEST (DR. SANAT ROY) - Dean Settle, Community Mental Health Center Director

Dean Settle, Community Mental Health Center Director, noted he recently informed the Board that Dr. Sanat Roy agreed to increase his hours at CMHC by 15-20 hours a week, be on-call 24 hours per day, 7 days a week, and respond to the unit on weekends (see March 10, 2011 Staff Meeting minutes). He said Dr. Roy is now in charge of all outpatient services, admissions at the Crisis Center and all medication orders. Settle said he had initially proposed that Dr. Roy receive an additional \$150 per week for the 24/7 coverage but would like to amend that amount and pay Dr. Roy an additional \$245 per week for his on-call responsibilities.

Schorr returned to the meeting at 9:28 a.m.

MOTION: Hudkins moved and Raybould seconded to grant the request, provided it not exceed \$12,740 annually.

Eagan said the increase opens up a number of issues, as Dr. Roy is a salaried employee. He suggested that Settle consult the County Attorney's Office.

FRIENDLY AMENDMENT: Heier offered a friendly amendment to stipulate that approval is continent upon resolving the issues through consultation with the County Attorney's Office and Personnel Department.

The maker of the motion and the seconder accepted the friendly amendment.

ROLL CALL ON THE MOTION AS AMENDED: Smoyer, Heier, Hudkins, Raybould and Schorr voted aye. Motion carried 5-0.

NOTE: Copies of the following document were also disseminated (Exhibit C): <u>Community Mental Health Center, Statement of Revenues and Expenditures, July 1, 2010 through March 31, 2011</u>.

6 DRIVEWAY FOR KADAVY PUBLIC AGRICULTURAL ATTRACTION - Josh Kadavy; Doug Pillard, Design Division Head, County Engineering

Discussion took place with Josh Kadavy and Doug Pillard, Design Division Head, County Engineering, regarding access to a proposed pick-your-own pumpkin farm with agricultural related activities on Kadavy's property on North 14th Street and Bluff Road (Exhibit D). It was noted that Kadavy's original application for a driveway permit was rejected by the County Engineer's Office, due to site distance concerns. Kadavy submitted a revised site plan that was deemed acceptable by the County Engineer's Office but has indicated he would prefer the original location. as it provides more opportunity for parking near the road.

In response to a question from Hudkins, Pillard said stopping distance on a gravel road is deemed to be 500 feet. The driveway that was originally proposed is 479 feet from the crest of the hill.

Raybould suggested temporary signage as a possible solution, noting traffic to the property will be seasonal.

MOTION:

Hudkins moved and Heier seconded to ask the County Engineer's Office to reconsider the original driveway permit application with the following conditions: 1) Elevate the driveway to provide better visibility; 2) Limit exit to right turn only; and 3) Provide signage in both directions. Hudkins, Raybould, Smoyer, Heier and Schorr voted aye. Motion carried 5-0.

ACTION ITEMS

A. Discontinuance Directive Form and Contract Discontinuance Agreement for The Hartford 457 Deferred Compensation Plan

MOTION:

Hudkins moved and Smoyer seconded to authorize signature by the Chair. Smoyer, Heier, Hudkins, Raybould and Schorr voted aye. Motion carried 5-0.

7 BUDGET UPDATE - Dennis Meyer, Budget and Fiscal Officer

Dennis Meyer, Budget and Fiscal Officer, asked whether the Board wants to continue its interlocal agreement with the State of Nebraska Probation Administration for two probation officers to provide additional pre-sentence investigation report services. **NOTE:** The County funds one of the probation officers at a cost of \$50,000 and the State funds the second.

Mike Thurber, Corrections Director, appeared and explained that the goal was to decrease the length of time it takes to complete pre-sentence investigations (PSI's) of inmates housed by the Lancaster County Corrections Department. He said they had hoped to reduce the turnaround to 30 days but only succeeded in reducing it to 45 days.

Gene Cotter, Chief Probation Officer, Adult Probation, appeared and said a regular PSI typically takes 63 days to complete. His department completed 1,500 regular PSI's last year and are on pace to do 2,100 this year. He said jail PSI's typically take 45 days to complete. Cotter said probation officers performed 325 jail PSI's last year and will likely perform just under 600 this year. Cotter said if the County decides to withdraw its share of funding the State could do so as well, which will lengthen the time it takes to complete the work.

Thurber noted the Board has asked departments to make budget reductions and said this is one expense he believes could be eliminated.

Troy Hawk, Court Administrator, Lancaster County District Court, appeared and discussed scheduling of sentencings.

MOTION: Raybould moved to defer a decision until the department budget hearings and finalization of the budget and direct Gene Cotter, Chief Probation Officer, Adult Probation, to plan for different funding scenarios.

The motion died due to the lack of a second.

MOTION: Heier moved and Hudkins seconded to withdraw the County's funding of one (1) probation officer, in accordance with the interlocal agreement with the State of Nebraska Probation Administration.

The Chair asked Hawk to relay to the State of Nebraska Probation Administration that the Board feels this is a State responsibility and hopes that the State continues to fund these positions.

ROLL CALL: Hudkins, Heier, Smoyer and Schorr voted aye. Raybould voted nay. Motion carried 4-1.

Norm Agena, County Assessor/Register of Deeds, appeared and said he is moving forward with preparations for a county-wide revaluation in 2012 and plans to reassign two of his field staff to assist with the data entry work. He said he did not fill two vacancies last year and said if there are further reductions to his budget he will have to eliminate two more positions. Agena said 90% of the data entry work could be eliminated if the department purchased 10-15 field (electronic) devices. He estimated the cost at \$120,000 and said that is roughly equivalent to salaries and benefits for two staff positions.

Rob Ogden, Chief Field Deputy Assessor/Register of Deeds, appeared and said there would also be a small software maintenance cost per year.

Agena said reducing the data entry work would allow him to reassign two of those positions to field work.

In response to a question from Schorr, Agena said he submitted a budget at 102% of last year's budget.

Hudkins asked Agena whether the purchase of field devices would assist him in reducing his budget request to 97% of last year's budget, as the Board had requested.

Agena said he would still have to eliminate two positions.

Smoyer asked whether Agena could hire temporary staff, at less cost, to assist with the data entry work.

Agena said he lacks the funds to do so.

Ogden added that they cannot hire temporary staff if there are layoffs.

MOTION: Heier moved to fund the purchase of field devices for the County Assessor's Office out of the Keno Fund, up to \$120,000.

Ogden said they will have more accurate information regarding the cost of the devices in a couple of weeks.

Schorr cautioned that there will other items the Board might want to consider funding through the Keno Fund.

The maker of the motion withdrew his motion.

Agena said he needs to know definitively by July 1st whether the Board intends to reduce his budget so he can plan accordingly.

Schorr asked whether any of the other departments have submitted budgets with large increases.

Meyer said 14 of the 34 General Fund budgets are over 100% of last year's budget.

Heier asked how the County Board will reduce its own budget to meet the request for a 97% budget.

Eagan said the Board will not be able to do so because the budget is only comprised of salaries and benefits and the Board is statutorily prohibited from reducing the salary of an elected official during their term.

In response to a question from Raybould, Eagan said an elected official could make a donation back to the General Fund.

Meyer said the County Board's budget is below 100% because of insurance changes.

Hudkins inquired about the budget for County Board operations.

Gwen Thorpe, Deputy Chief Administrative Officer, said the Administrative Services budget is at 96.10%.

Meyer said a number of items were eliminated from that budget to achieve that number that will require Board approval.

8 ACTION ITEMS

A. Discontinuance Directive Form and Contract Discontinuance Agreement for The Hartford 457 Deferred Compensation Plan

Item was moved forward on the agenda.

9 CONSENT ITEMS

There were no consent items.

10 ADMINISTRATIVE OFFICER REPORT

A. Lancaster County Logo for Sherman Field Banner

Board consensus was to use the Lancaster County's logo, which features a star, on the banner.

B. Nebraska Association of County Officials (NACO) Walk for Your Life Challenge (June 1 - September 30, 2011)

Board consensus was to participate in the program and to ask Minette Genuchi, Administrative Assistant to the County Board, to serve as coordinator.

C. National Association of County Officials (NACo) Prescription Discount Card Program

Thorpe discussed the differences between the National Association of County Officials (NACo) Rx Card and the Coast2Coast Rx Card (discount prescription card programs) (see agenda packet). She noted that membership in NACo, which is required to

participate in their program, has been eliminated in the budget proposal. Thorpe said there are other discount prescription programs available and agreed to research the matter further.

Legislative Update

April 14, 2011


Today is the sixty-fourth day of the ninety-day session.

This week Speaker Flood with approval from the Executive Board designated LB 84 and LB 397 as Speaker Super priority bills. This means that the bills and their amendments may be organized by the Speaker. This is an important distinction for both bills because it ensures that amendments will be ordered to allow the bills to get into the form needed. As you may recall when LB 84 was debated on General File they were unable to get to the amendments because of procedural activity. There will be an amendment of LB 84 that will reduce the amount from ½ increase to ¾. This will reduce the amount to counties from \$12 million to about \$8 million. The bill will be discussed next Tuesday and it should take all day.

LB 397 (Lathrop) is the bill on reform of the CIR. The hearing was held yesterday. Last week we were asked to discuss our concerns with the array and freezing aspects contained in the amendment with Lathrop. We organized a meeting and we had Commissioners Schorr and Heier along with Kerry Eagan meet with the senator.

Yesterday the Legislature advanced LB 628 (Cook). LB 139 was included in an amendment by Senator Lautenbaugh. LB 139 was of interest to Lancaster County because it provided authority for a county official to sell all other types of surplus, obsolete property that has a value of less than \$2500 with approval by the board.

LB 277 (Coash) is on the consent calendar. Consent calendar was to be taken up today if the Legislature made progress on Select File. They did not meet the Speaker's goal so he adjusted the agenda. They are on Select File today and will have consent sometime later in the session. LB 277 amends the Nebraska Visitors Development Act to provide that the governing body of a county, with the advice of the visitors committee, may use County Visitors Improvement Fund to promote, encourage, and attract visitors to the county. It was introduced on our behalf.
