AGENDA ITEM

1 APPROVAL OF THE MINUTES OF THE TUESDAY, SEPTEMBER 29, 2011 STAFF MEETING

MOTION:

Heier moved and Smoyer seconded approval of the minutes of the September 29, 2011 Staff Meeting. Raybould, Heier, Smoyer, Hudkins and Schorr voted aye. Motion carried 5-0.

MOTION:

Heier moved and Smoyer seconded approval of the additions to the agenda. Hudkins, Smoyer, Heier, Raybould and Schorr voted aye. Motion carried 5-0.

3 JAIL CONSTRUCTION UPDATE - Chuck Richter, Sampson Construction Company; Greg Newport, The Clark Enersen Partners; Mike Thurber, Corrections Director

Chuck Richter, Sampson Construction Company, gave an update on construction of the new Lancaster County Adult Detention Facility (LCADF) (see Exhibit B for progress photographs).

Mike Thurber, Corrections Director, said installation of the fiber optic network will begin next week. He also reported that bids for paving work related to the intersection at the entrance of the facility will close on October 12th, adding it is anticipated that the work will be completed by the end of the year.

Board consensus was to invite the Mayor; City Council; Lancaster County Senate Delegation; County Elected Officials; the Judiciary; law enforcement; and Larry Dix, Nebraska Association of County Officials (NACO) Executive Director, to tour the facility following the October 25th County Board of Commissioners Meeting.

There was also consensus to invite those attending the Tri-County Meeting on November 3rd to tour the facility following that meeting.

ADDITIONS TO THE AGENDA

A. Grand Opening of Abbott Motocross Trail (Exhibit A)

Hudkins agreed to speak on behalf of the Board at the event.

C. Request from the Lincoln Chamber of Commerce for a Member of the Board to Address the Nebraska Federation of the Blind (NFB) 2011 State Convention on October 15, 2011

The Board declined the request, as Board members have other commitments on that date.

4 REUSE OF THE OLD JAIL - Don Killeen, County Property Manager

Don Killeen, County Property Manager, asked whether the County would like to retain ownership of the Old Jail Complex (605 South 10th) or transfer it to the Public Building Commission. He suggested moving forward with a Request for Proposals (RFP) for architectural services to see how Corrections' functions will fit with re-use of the space. Possible uses include records storage, courtrooms, the morgue and bringing Adult Probation and the County Attorney's Child Support Division back to the government campus.

Raybould suggested formation of a committee to look at space needs. Killeen said the Committee's work could be coordinated with the RFP process.

Schorr suggested this would be an appropriate discussion item for the next Management Team Meeting. There was consensus to move the meeting from October 13th to the 20th, due to a conflict with the Nebraska Association of County Officials (NACO) Legislative Conference in Kearney, Nebraska.

ADDITIONS TO THE AGENDA

B. Re-Roofing Options for Former Attention Center for Youth

Killeen said Topher Hansen, Director, CenterPointe, Inc., has informed him CenterPointe may be able to utilize up to \$15,000 in Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD) funds for the project (see August 25, 2011 Staff Meeting minutes). He said they have received additional bids and it appears the cost could be in the \$33,000 range. Killeen suggested the Board allow CenterPointe to proceed with the project and abate their rent for the remainder of the year to make up the difference. The Board concurred with the suggestion and asked Killeen to bring back a proposal.

RETURNING TO ITEM 4

MOTION:

Hudkins moved and Smoyer seconded to authorize Don Killeen, County Property Manager, to work with the Purchasing Department in preparing a Request for Proposals (RFP) for refurbishing the old jail space. Hudkins, Smoyer, Heier, Raybould and Schorr voted aye. Motion carried 5-0.

ADMINISTRATIVE OFFICER REPORT

B. Citizen Recognition

Heier said he believes the Board should recognize citizens that have made significant contributions to the City or County.

Gwen Thorpe, Deputy Chief Administrative Officer, agreed to develop a template for a recognition resolution.

There was consensus to have nominations limited to submission by Board members.

DISCUSSION OF BOARD MEMBER MEETINGS

A. Visitors Promotion Committee (VPC) - Smoyer

Smoyer reported discussion of the Abbott Motocross Trail (see Item 2A).

5 MALCOLM ABANDONED RIGHT-OF-WAY, DEED TO RURAL FIRE DISTRICT - Brittany Behrens, Deputy County Attorney; Ken Schroeder, County Surveyor

Discussion took place regarding a request from the Malcolm Rural Fire Department for the County to deed its portion of a vacated street plus an additional piece of property that abuts property owned by the County (county shop) and the Fire Department (a ditch) to the Fire Department without consideration (see correspondence in the agenda packet and photographs in Exhibits C & D). It was noted County Engineering recently surveyed the County's property with a couple of revisions.

Denise Saathoff, Legal Counsel for the Malcolm Rural Fire Department, appeared and said the Fire Department has been maintaining the ditch since the Village of Malcolm ceased maintenance and will continue to do so.

Brittany Behrens, Deputy County Attorney, said the County would not be required to follow the process to declare the property surplus because there would still be a public purpose.

MOTION:

Hudkins moved and Raybould seconded to direct the County Attorney's Office and County Engineering to prepare a quit claim deed to transfer the property to the Malcolm Rural Fire Department, subject to the approval of the Malcolm Rural Fire Department. Raybould, Heier, Smoyer, Hudkins and Schorr voted aye. Motion carried 5-0.

ADMINISTRATIVE OFFICER REPORT

B. Chamber Coffee - Raybould, Smoyer

Smoyer said they discussed redistricting plans.

REDISTRICTING - Dave Shively, Election Commissioner; Marvin Krout, Planning Director; Nicole Fleck-Tooze, Long-Range Planning Manager; Brandon Garrett, Planner

Smoyer discussed his proposed plan for redistricting labeled as Option D (Exhibit E). The plan, which resembles a donut, moves Raybould's district to the center with the

other Commissioners' districts on the perimeter. **NOTE:** Three options, labeled as Options A, B and C, had previously been provided to the Board (Exhibit F). Smoyer noted each district would have an incorporated city or town.

In response to a question from Schorr, Smoyer said some of the shifts were made to avoid dividing precincts. Dave Shively, Election Commissioner, said some precincts are oddly shaped to prevent splitting districts for State Legislators, the Board of Regents or State Board of Education.

Raybould expressed concern that her district would lack a rural component and said she believes it is important for each district to contain a "slice" of the City. She said the districts Smoyer has crafted are not equitable in terms of population or percentage distribution and asked Smoyer why he discarded the recommendations from the Planning Committee. Smoyer said his plan provides for future growth, stating minimal redrawing of the districts will be required in ten years if the Planning Commission is correct in its predictions of growth patterns. He said population, not land mass, distribution is relevant, and said the plan is within a 5% deviation. Raybould disagreed that it is within 5%, noting her district is at 103.8% and Schorr's is at 97.2%. Smoyer said minor alterations can be made to even out those numbers.

Hudkins said he would like to retain Fallbrook, a residential and commercial neighborhood currently in his district. He would also like to keep his district boundary as close to South 27th & "O" Street as possible.

Raybould said she believes Option C would help Hudkins retain the Capital Beach area and South 27th Street and is a more balanced plan in terms of percentages.

Marvin Krout, Planning Director, said the Board will need to identify one plan by consensus and hold a public hearing.

Raybould requested additional time to study Option D.

Krout said the Planning Department is willing to continue to work with Board members in exploring options.

Raybould asked the other members of the Board whether Option D is a "done deal" or if they would be willing to consider other plans.

Schorr said she would also like some time to consider Option D as it is a philosophical change.

Heier said he likes Option D but would like to "tweak" the numbers.

There was general consensus to schedule further discussion in two weeks.

COUNTY BOARD DISTRICTS: OPTION A




