1) <u>MINUTES:</u> Approval of the minutes of the Board of Commissioners meeting held on Tuesday, June 5, 2012.

MOTION: Hudkins moved and Raybould seconded approval of the minutes. Hudkins, Raybould, Heier, Smoyer and Schorr voted aye. Motion carried 5-0.

3) SPECIAL PRESENTATIONS:

A. Commissioners' Award of Excellence for May 2012 to Sondra Kirchhoff, Clerk of the District Court.

The clerk read the nomination for the record. Kirchhoff gave examples of some of the activities she developed for her office. Heier presented a plaque to Kirchhoff who thanked everyone for the award. 4) OLD BUSINESS:

A. An amendment to County Contract C-11-0367 with Metro Building Services, Inc., for cleaning services at the Cherrycreek Road facilities.
