The Chair noted the location of the Open Meetings Act and opened the meeting at 8:30 a.m.

Diego Moreno, a University of Nebraska-Lincoln (UNL) student who will be serving as an intern in the County Board's Office, was introduced.

AGENDA ITEM

1 APPROVAL OF THE MINUTES OF THE TUESDAY, JANUARY 19, 2012 STAFF MEETING

MOTION: Heier moved and Hudkins seconded approval of the minutes of the

January 19, 2012 Staff Meeting. Hudkins, Smoyer, Heier, Raybould and

Schorr voted aye. Motion carried 5-0.

2 ADDITIONS TO THE AGENDA

MOTION: Hudkins moved and Smoyer seconded approval of the additions to the agenda. Raybould, Heier, Smoyer, Hudkins and Schorr voted aye. Motion carried 5-0.

3 LEGISLATIVE UPDATE - Gordon Kissel and Joe Kohout, Kissel/E&S Associates

Gordon Kissel, Kissel/E&S Associates, presented a legislative update and legislative bills of interest report (Exhibits C & D).

Discussion took place regarding Legislative Bill (LB) 970 (Terminate the inheritance tax and change income tax rates and calculation). It was noted that Deb Schorr, County Board Chair; Dennis Meyer, Budget and Fiscal Officer; Terry Wagner, Lancaster County Sheriff; Kit Boesch, Human Services Administrator; and Judy Halstead, Lincoln-Lancaster County Health Department (LLCHD) Director, plan to testify in opposition to the bill at the Revenue Committee's hearing.

MOTION: Heier moved and Smoyer seconded to submit a letter to the Legislature's Revenue Committee in opposition to Legislative Bill (LB) 970, with signature by all members of the Board. Smoyer, Hudkins, Raybould, Heier and Schorr voted aye. Motion carried 5-0.

NOTE: See Exhibits E-G for the Board's letter to the Revenue Committee and Boesch and Halstead's planned testimony.

Joe Kohout, Kissel/E&S Associates, noted that Senator Wightman introduced LB 1102 (Change inheritance tax rates and exemption amounts) as an alternative measure.

Kerry Eagan, Chief Administrative Officer, noted the following:

- LB 881 (Change medical services payment provisions relating to jails and correctional facilities) does not address Corrections' concerns regarding responsibility for pre-incarceration medical service costs in situations where there is an injury that was not caused by the arresting agency.
- The Nebraska Association of County Officials (NACO) has requested comment regarding LB 975 (Adopt the Fair Bidding Act).

- Sheli Schindler, Youth Services Center (YSC) Director, will testify on LB 972 (Transfer the youth rehabilitation and treatment centers from the Office of Juvenile Services to the Department of Correctional Services). There does not appear to be a fiscal impact to the County.
- LB 1099 (Change expense provisions under the Nebraska Juvenile Code) would shift guardian-ad-litem costs to the State.

Dean Settle, Community Mental Health Center (CMHC) Director, appeared and said Scott Etherton, Crisis Center Program Manager, has done an analysis of LB 988 (Provide a rate of payment for certain medical services in emergency protective custody situations). He said he will continue to monitor the bill.

Andy Stebbing, County Treasurer, appeared and gave an overview of LB 769 (Change provisions relating to application for and issuance of operators' licenses and state identification cards).

MOTION: Hudkins moved and Raybould seconded to support Legislative Bill (LB) 769. Raybould, Heier, Smoyer, Hudkins and Schorr voted aye. Motion carried 5-0.

4 JAIL CONSTRUCTION UPDATE - Mike Thurber, Corrections Director; Chuck Richter, Sampson Construction Company; Greg Newport, The Clark Enersen Partners

Chuck Richter, Sampson Construction Company, gave an update on construction of the new Lancaster County Adult Detention Facility (LCADF) (see Exhibit H for progress photographs). He said finishes are being completed in many areas and systems testing will take place next month.

Hudkins inquired about cabling. Richter said they are working to get the pathway finished.

Mike Thurber, Corrections Director, said they are still working on furniture, fixtures and equipment (FF&E) issues and the radio system design. He also reported that payments to the District Energy Corporation (DEC) for heating and cooling of the facility will begin this year.

Heier added that the DEC will adjust the amount of payback because it saved \$4,000,000 in construction costs and received a \$5,000,000 grant.

Schorr inquired about landscaping. Thurber said that work will being in the spring. Greg Newport, The Clark Enersen Partners, noted the work is covered by a warranty.

5 BOARD OF CORRECTIONS QUARTERLY MEETING - Mike Thurber, Corrections Director

Separate minutes.

ADDITIONS TO THE AGENDA

A. Framing of the County Board Photograph

Minette Genuchi, Administrative Assistant to the County Board, appeared and estimated the cost of printing a new photograph of the Board at \$4.50 and framing at \$110.00. She said the framing cost is comparable to what the City Council paid to have their photograph framed. Schorr felt the cost was excessive and said she will research other options.

- B. Employee Recognition Breakfast (May 22, 2012 at Windsor Stables Reception Center)
- M. Genuchi said the cost for the breakfast will be \$11.00 per person. Gift certificate amounts will remain the same as last year: \$25 for employees with 10 years of service; \$50 for employees with 15 or 20 years of service; and \$100 for employees with 25, 30, 35, 40, 45 or 50 years of service.
 - C. Determining Planning Commission Members

Heier questioned why the County Board is limited to one nomination for the Planning Commission and the City has eight nominations.

Raybould noted 91% of the population resides within the City of Lincoln's three-mile zoning jurisdiction.

MOTION: Heier moved to research the arrangement.

Eagan explained that the County Board and City Council must approve all nominees before appointment and the rationale was that although the County Board only brought forward one name, it had veto power over the other eight names. He agreed to research the agreement.

The maker withdrew his motion.

D. Correspondence from Sue Kirkland, Clerk of the District Court, Regarding a Proposed Agreement between the County and District Courts to Assist Each Other When Needed (Exhibit A)

Eagan said the agreement has been forwarded to the County Attorney's Office for review.

E. Super Commons Meeting with the City Council and Lincoln Public Schools (LPS) Board of Education (Exhibit B)

A scheduling conflict with the Lancaster County Correctional Facility Joint Public Agency (JPA) meeting was noted. Schorr, who is a member of the JPA, said she will be absent on February 28th and asked staff to make sure there will still be a quorum of that body. If not, the JPA meeting will need to be rescheduled.

ACTION ITEMS

A. Microcomputer Request C#77162, \$8,494.77 from the Microcomputer Request for Four (4) Microcomputers and One (1) Laptop Computer for County Extension

Eagan explained that the request does not exceed the budgeted amount and will not require Board action.

ADMINISTRATIVE OFFICER REPORT

A. Old Jail Reuse Steering Committee

Eagan noted that Hudkins, Raybould and Smoyer have all expressed interest in serving on the Committee. Hudkins said he will withdraw his request to serve on the Committee. The Chair asked that Bob Walla, Assistant Purchasing Agent, provide clarification regarding the purpose of the Committee, the process and projected timeline.

B. Intern Projects

It was noted that Moreno will be working on an annual report for the County. A property inventory report was also suggested as a potential project.

6 UNCLASSIFIED EMPLOYEE AND CHIEF DEPUTY ELECTED OFFICIALS SALARIES - Doug McDaniel, Personnel Director; Nicole Gross, Compensation Technician

Doug McDaniel, Personnel Director, presented current salary information for the directors, deputy directors, bailiffs, child support referee and district court law clerks and 1% and 2% increases for those positions (Exhibit I).

Schorr said she is not prepared to make a decision on salaries as Lancaster County is currently faced with a potential loss of \$6,000,000 in inheritance tax revenue (see Item 3). Smoyer added the Board should have a better idea of where the legislation is going by early March. Schorr urged those in attendance to relay concerns regarding the impact of the legislation to Senator Cornett, sponsor of bill.

Dennis Keefe, Public Defender, appeared and said he believes the real issue is whether the County values these services and are they comparable. He said attorneys' salaries are falling behind the competition. Keefe said there is also a fairness issue regarding the chief deputies' salaries, noting they are no longer treated the same as the elected officials.

Smoyer said he believes elected officials should have more options to set salaries within their departments, provided it fits within their approved budgets.

Joe Kelly, County Attorney, appeared and said Paralegal II's in his department make the same salaries as some line attorneys, once longevity pay is factored in. He said it will be difficult to retain quality attorneys if that issue is not addressed. Kelly suggested the Board consider step increases for attorneys in the future.

Terry Wagner, Lancaster County Sheriff, appeared and asked when the information from the comparability study would be made available and whether the Board would be asking for salary recommendations.

Schorr noted there is a new personnel director and staffing changes and said they may not have been familiar with all of the components to the process.

Raybould said benefits should also be factored into a comparison. She said statistics from the Nebraska Department of Labor (NDOL) indicate the County is at market for entry level attorney salaries. Raybould said the low for an entry level position is \$42,328 and the high is \$85,010. She said it also breaks out salaries in terms of all practice, private practice, business and government. The salary for an entry level government attorney is shown as \$50,000. Raybould said the data also conveys the number of candidates in the pool and said the majority of the candidates are looking for starting attorney positions in the range of \$35,000 to \$60,000 per year.

Doug Cyr, Chief Administrative Deputy County Attorney, appeared and said he viewed the NDOL statistics Raybould has referred to and it indicates the average compensation for an experienced attorney is approximately \$146,000 in Omaha, approximately \$130,000 in Lincoln and approximately \$126,000 in the entire State. He said there are a number of experienced attorneys in the County Attorney's Office who have not reached the \$100,000 ceiling. Cyr said there is also a significant variance in entry level salaries based on whether they are in the eastern or western part of the State.

Raybould said private sector information was thrown in and said that is a different entity altogether. She said benefits are also an important part of the equation.

Cyr said he believes Raybould is jumpings back and forth between the public and private sector to find the lowest comparable to supports lower salaries and pensions. He noted the County currently has a bill before the Legislature proposing to reduce employees' pensions. Cyr said it was based on comparables in the private, not public sector, and said every county that was used in the salary array for Lancaster County has a defined benefit pension plan.

Schorr said she believes the Board has made it clear that it wants to delay a decision for approximately six weeks and would like the Personnel Department to bring back a comparabilities and the elected officials' salary recommendations.

7 COUNTY CORONER AUTOPSY SERVICES AND FEES - Joe Kelly, County Attorney; Doug Cyr, Chief Administrative Deputy County Attorney

Joe Kelly, County Attorney, noted his office switched autopsy services two years ago to the group that performs autopsies for Douglas and Sarpy County and Council Bluffs, Iowa. The cost is approximately \$125,000 a year and includes a standard fee per autopsy, a morgue charge, toxicology fees and an autopsy set-up fee (see schedule of fees in Exhibit J). He added they are working to eliminate the autopsy set-up fee which will help reduce costs. **NOTE:** The County had previously contracted with Dr. Matthias Okoye at a cost of approximately \$325,000 a year. Kelly said the County Clerk's Office had expressed concern that there is not a contract in place.

Doug Cyr, Chief Administrative Deputy County Attorney, said Nebraska Revised Statute §23-1820 gives Kelly, who serves as the County Coroner, the authority to hire a coroner's physician. He said the schedule of fees must be approved by the County Board.

MOTION: Heier moved and Raybould seconded to approve the schedule of fees. Raybould, Heier, Smoyer, Hudkins and Schorr voted aye. Motion carried 5-0.

8 EMERGENCY OPERATIONS CENTER TOUR - Doug Ahlberg, Emergency Management Director

Doug Ahlberg, Emergency Management Director, extended an invitation to the Board to tour his department's new office space in the 233 Building (former Lincoln Police Department Building).

Board consensus was to schedule the tour on February 2nd, following the Staff Meeting.

9 ACTION ITEMS

A. Microcomputer Request C#77162, \$8,494.77 from the Microcomputer Request for Four (4) Microcomputers and One (1) Laptop Computer for County Extension

Item was moved forward on the agenda.

12 PENDING

There were no pending items.

13 DISCUSSION OF BOARD MEMBER MEETINGS

A. General Assistance (GA) Monitoring Committee - Hudkins, Raybould

Raybould said they discussed prescription drug costs and how the Community Mental Health Center (CMHC) impacts GA.

B. Keno Human Services Prevention Fund Advisory Committee - Schorr

Schorr said they received requests totaling \$125,000 but there is only \$60,000 to

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allocate. She noted that the escrow fund is approaching \$1,000,000.

C. Community Mental Health Center (CMHC) Advisory Committee - Raybould

Raybould said discussion focused on the CMHC Planning Committee's preliminary recommendations. She said consumers are concerned and there is low staff morale. Raybould said Region V does not have statutory authority to serve as interim management team and said Dean Settle, CMHC Director, indicated the Region V Governing Board is not fully aware of what is going on with CMHC. Smoyer, who serves on the Region V Governing, said C. J. Johnson, Region V Systems Administrator, has kept them apprised.

Schorr suggested that the CMHC Planning Committee present their recommendations to the Board at the February 16th Staff Meeting.

14 EMERGENCY ITEMS AND OTHER BUSINESS

Schorr said she attended the Emergency Medical System Oversight Administration (EMSOA) Meeting on Monday. She noted there had been an issue relating to whether emergency room (ER) doctors serving on the EMSOA Board who provide emergency medical oversight to other entities within Lancaster County have a conflict of interest and said the City Attorney's Office is drafting a conflict of interest statement for them to sign.

15 ADJOURNMENT

MOTION: Heier moved and Raybould seconded to adjourn the meeting at 10:51 a.m. Raybould, Heier, Smoyer, Hudkins and Schorr voted aye. Motion carried 5-0.


Hi Deb,



Lancaster Board of Commissioners

January 26, 2012

Today is the fifteenth day of the sixty-day session.

Today in the Revenue Committee is LB 970 (Cornett). The bill is the Governor's proposal to reduce three separate taxes. First, the individual state income tax would be reduced by lowering current tax rates and expanding current income brackets. The bill would also reduce the current top corporate income tax rate from 7.81% to 6.70% which would match the top individual income tax under the proposal. Finally, the bill proposes to repeal the inheritance tax in its entirety. This is the tax that is imposed upon beneficiaries of decedents. In 2007, the State repealed the estate tax, which was the tax that had been imposed upon assets of the person who passed away. Commissioner Schorr will be there to represent Lancaster County. The fiscal impact on Lancaster County is estimated to be about \$6 million.

There are two bill in Judiciary Committee today of interest. The first is by Senator Brad Ashford LB972 and the second is by Senator Amanda McGill which is LB 787. LB 972 would transfer the oversight and control of the Kearney and Geneva from the Office of Juvenile Services (under the Department of Health and Human Services) to the Department of Corrections. The intent is to allow the Department of Health and Human Services to focus on children impacted by neglect and abuse within the child welfare system.

Senator Amanda McGill is carrying one of our priorities in LB 787. Staff secure detention facilities are institutions used for placement of low-risk juvenile law violators and status offenders. Although the Nebraska Juvenile Code specifically refers to staff secure detention facilities as an authorized type of non-secure detention, there are no statutory provisions defining these facilities or how they should be regulated. Given the function of the staff secure detention, general oversight should be placed with the Jail Standards Division of the Nebraska Commission on Law Enforcement. Sheli Schindler will present testimony on behalf of Lancaster County.

Finally, the Appropriations Committee heard testimony this week on a bill that would appropriate 1.2 million to assist in renovating Lincoln's Centennial Mall. The bill is sponsored by Senator Bill Avery. The number is LB 859. The bill would authorize an one-time payment to the Centennial Mall Project Fund.



Dear Senator Cornett:

The Lancaster County Board of Commissioners is strongly opposed to the proposal to eliminate the inheritance tax under LB 970. The loss of this revenue would have a devastating impact on the ability of Lancaster County to provide adequate services to its residents, and will result in a direct shift to the property tax. Consider the following facts:

- Lancaster County collected \$6,685,528 of inheritance tax for FY 2010-11, which is equivalent to a property tax levy of 3.5¢ per \$100,000 of value, or almost 14% of the entire property tax levy for FY 2010-11
- For the last three (3) budget years the County has averaged inheritance tax collections of \$5,837,931
- All inheritance tax revenue is deposited into the County's general fund to cover operating expenditures, thereby providing direct property tax relief
- Since FY 2007-08 other revenues have decreased dramatically:
 - \$2.5 million decrease of interest income
 - \$3 million reduction from the loss of state aid and jail reimbursement
- Real property values have risen only slightly during this period, averaging .43 %per year

In spite of stagnant property valuations and decreasing revenues, the Lancaster County Board has managed to keep the levy at the same rate of 26.83¢ for the last three (3) years by cutting costs, increasing efficiencies, deferring equipment maintenance/replacement, deferring building maintenance, and most significantly, deferring needed road maintenance and upgrades. However, this trend is not sustainable, and additional revenue cuts could seriously impact the ability of County officials to discharge their mandated duties.

At the same time the cost and demand for basic services has steadily increased, especially in the area of public safety, which accounts for more than 55% of the County's budget. Due to heavy caseloads an eighth district court judge was added in Lancaster County in 2011, and the Legislature is now contemplating adding another judge to the County Court serving Lancaster County. Caseloads in the Lancaster County Separate Juvenile Court are also running at capacity, and a new judge may be necessary in the near future. Additional judges means additional work for the County Attorney, Public Defender, and Sheriff. A steadily increasing population is also

stretching Sheriff resources to the limit, and increases will become necessary for basic law enforcement services. Due to overcrowding, Lancaster County was required by Jail Standards to build a new jail. This facility will open in July of 2012 and will add 39 new County employees.


Against this background of rising costs and diminishing revenue, an unnecessary additional revenue decrease of \$6 million is being proposed for Lancaster County. A reduction of this size simply cannot be absorbed by cutting costs. For example, the County could eliminate all spending for public health, community mental health treatment, and the social safety net, amounting to approximately \$5 million, and still not realize enough savings to cover the loss of revenue. Moreover, these programs are preventative in nature and save tax payer money in the long run. Without these programs significant spending increases would be necessary for law enforcement, the court system, the jail, emergency protective custody, and general assistance. More importantly, without these programs the quality of life in Lancaster County would suffer greatly.

Inevitably, the property tax rate will need to be increased substantially to make up for the loss of essential funding caused by the elimination of the inheritance tax. This is bad news for the average property tax payer. Although LB 970 has been advertized as a tax savings for the hard working Nebraska tax payer, in fact just the opposite is true. In a worse case scenario, the County would need to replace most of the lost inheritance tax revenue with a corresponding increase in the property tax levy, a 3.5¢ increase that would increase property taxes by approximately \$35 per \$100,000 of value. The average value of a residential parcel in Lancaster County is \$146,000, so the owner would pay an additional \$52 per year. In comparison, this same property tax payer would probably pay little or no inheritance tax. Simply stated, LB 970 will result in a tax increase on hard working Nebraskans, not a decrease.

Another misconception is that the inheritance tax discourages businesses from locating in Nebraska. There is no support for this assertion. The inheritance tax is paid by individuals, not companies. And to the contrary, it is more important to businesses to locate in a stable community with adequate infrastructure, a low crime rate, and an effective social safety net - all of which are jeopardized by the elimination of the inheritance tax.

The citizens of the State of Nebraska are best served when state and local government work together to solve problems and provide essential services. Since the Legislature creates duties and responsibilities for counties, the Legislature must also provide adequate funding to perform these duties. Elimination of the inheritance tax deprives counties of a critical funding source, while leaving in place the same statutory responsibilities. Replacement funding can only come from one place, the pockets of hard working Nebraska property tax payers.

Testimony against LB 970

The Human Services Administration for Lincoln/Lancaster County strongly opposes LB 970, eliminating the inheritance tax. Should you do this, an unexpected, perhaps even invisible set of collapsing dominos occurs.

First, Lancaster County loses \$6 million. This is the same county that lost \$3 million over the past two years from the loss of state aid and jail reimbursements. When that happened, every department in the county government was cut to the core. The budget for contractual human services went from \$2.2 million to \$1.3 million and five agencies were totally cut from county funding. If the County loses another \$6 million, they will still need to cover the required responsibilities of law enforcement, courts, and emergency services. Beyond that the dominoes begin to fall. You just heard Commissioner Schorr say "we could eliminate public health, community mental health and the social safety net".

The social safety net is about people who need assistance to be productive citizens in this state. It is a net that needs to be strong enough to assist:


- The 600 adults in Lancaster County who are currently waiting for substance abuse treatment services that are at maximum capacity
- The 11,000 residents receiving mental health services this year
- The 7500 men, women & children who were provided emergency shelter beds this year

While LB 970 may indirectly cause the elimination of services, it doesn't eliminate the NEED for those services and the people don't just go away. Instead they end up in higher cost placements like jail and hospitals. And if you think the child welfare system is full now...wait until the dominoes fall.

Another misperception is that the inheritance tax discourages businesses from locating in Nebraska. I'll tell you what <u>really</u> discourages businesses from re-locating to counties in NE: neighborhoods with high crime rates; downtowns with large visible homeless populations; overgrown and unsafe parks; and no services for families. Human Services are an essential

component of the infrastructure of a strong, vibrant county. Counties have an economy based on the belief that this safety net exists.

Eliminating the inheritance tax has significant negative ramifications. Right or wrong, counties have come to depend on it. But it is the responsibility of our Legislative body to ensure citizens of this state have equal access to health care, mental health services, and emergency services rather than to impede County government from providing them. By repealing the inheritance tax you will indirectly cripple counties providing these necessary services. I would hope this committee would have the courage to say NO to LB 970.



Testimony in Opposition to LB 970 Revenue Committee January 26, 2012

Good afternoon Senator Cornett and members of the Revenue committee, my name is Judy Halstead, I am the Health Director for City of Lincoln and Lancaster County. I am testifying today on behalf of the Health Department and the City of Lincoln in opposition to LB 970.

As Commissioner Schorr testified, services within my department, provided to the residents of Lincoln and Lancaster County are at risk because of this proposal. YOUR health and the health of your constituents are at risk because of this proposal as well. When you are in Lincoln serving your constituents, I and my staff are serving and protecting you. When you and your family come to Lincoln for Husker football games and eat in the fine food establishments in Lincoln, you can be assured my staff inspected and permitted the establishment and the nearly 1200 others in Lincoln – in addition to the 13,000 food handlers we have trained and permitted to assure they are not spreading food borne illnesses to you.

When your students have come to Lincoln for FFA or for State basketball and have crossed streets in downtown Lincoln, our injury prevention staff has looked out for them with sponsoring the City's first pedestrian countdown lights to help reduce injuries to our pedestrians in the City. When they used the pool at the hotel, we made sure there were trained and certified Pool Operators overseeing the pool to make sure the pool water quality was where it should be so disease didn't spread from the pool.

We monitor communicable diseases in Lincoln on a daily basis. We receive and review lab reports for instances of contagious diseases that might make you and every person sitting at your table sick. We will know quickly if we have an outbreak of measles or pertussis or mumps. And in my Department we provide 18,000 immunizations a year to make sure that children attending the same family activities at the zoo and at the children's museum near you are protected and don't share their diseases with you. Without funding from our County, we can't continue the daily surveillance and the vigilance we maintain. Without the funding we can't continue to protect the community with immunizations for diseases we know can be prevented.

My department receives over \$3,000,000 a year from Lancaster County, to take care of those who don't have the resources to meet their own dental needs and medical needs. Through nurse home visitation, we prevent high risk pregnant women from poor pregnancy complications due to lack of care, and we have tremendous outcomes in preventing abuse and neglect. We prevent the spread of disease in child cares in Lincoln, through health consultation — and for the five years we have had the program fully operational we have not had a communicable disease outbreak in a child care in Lincoln. This one program helps keeps children in care and their parents working, not missing work because their child is sick. And, we help assure your child or grandchild doesn't get a tattoo in a hotel room or at a "tattoo party" in an apartment through the "friend of a friend" by regulating and shutting down practitioners who are not licensed.


All of these programs provided by my staff are funded in whole or in part through funding from Lancaster County. These are services that touch the poorest of the poor in my community, the wealthiest in this City and they touch you and your constituents who travel to Lincoln. We provide you with the knowledge that public health is protecting the residents of Lincoln and Lancaster County, but we are also protecting you. Many will tell you stories of why the funding is important to them today and I hope you will leave here today knowing how eliminating the inheritance tax funding will impact each of you and your families during your time in Lincoln as well.




