Advance public notice of the Board of Commissioners Staff Meeting was posted on the County-City Building bulletin board and the Lancaster County, Nebraska, web site and provided to the media on March 14, 2012.

The Chair noted the location of the Open Meetings Act and opened the meeting at 8:33 a.m.

AGENDA ITEM

LEGISLATIVE UPDATE - Gordon Kissel, Kissel/E&S Associates

Gordon Kissel, Kissel/E&S Associates, presented a legislative update and a bills of interest report (Exhibits A & B).

Hudkins arrived at the meeting at 8:35 a.m.

Schorr noted Legislative Bill (LB) 790 which would transfer a judgeship in the 5th Judicial District to the 3rd Judicial District, which is Lancaster County, and asked whether the State plans to allocate funds for the new judgeship. Kissel said it does not.

1 APPROVAL OF THE MINUTES OF THE THURSDAY, MARCH 1, 2012 AND TUESDAY, MARCH 6, 2012 STAFF MEETINGS

MOTION: Hudkins moved and Raybould seconded approval of the minutes of the

March 6, 2012 Staff Meeting. Hudkins, Raybould and Schorr voted aye.

Heier and Smoyer were absent from voting. Motion carried 3-0.

Approval of the Thursday, March 1, 2012 Staff Meeting minutes was held as two of the three Commissioners present did not attend the meeting.

2 ADDITIONS TO THE AGENDA

- A. Microcomputer Request from County Attorney (Exhibit C)
- B. Take-Home Vehicle Policy

MOTION: Hudkins moved and Raybould seconded approval of the additions to the agenda. Raybould, Hudkins and Schorr voted aye. Heier and Smoyer were absent from voting. Motion carried 3-0.

3 LEGISLATIVE UPDATE - Gordon Kissel, Kissel/E&S Associates

Item was moved forward on the agenda.

ADDITIONS TO THE AGENDA

A. Microcomputer Request from County Attorney (Exhibit C)

Kerry Eagan, Chief Administrative Officer, said the County Attorney's Office will need additional computer hardware and software to participate in video arraignments. He said there are sufficient funds in the Microcomputer Fund to fund the request.

MOTION: Hudkins moved and Raybould seconded approval of the request. Raybould, Hudkins and Schorr voted aye. Heier and Smoyer were absent from voting. Motion carried.

D. Social Media Policy

Gwen Thorpe, Deputy Chief Administrative Officer, noted some County departments are posting information in the social media, such as Facebook. She suggested the need for a policy to regulate who is allowed to post information and the content as that information would be considered a public record.

The Chair asked that this item be scheduled for discussion at the next Management Team meeting.

B. Take-Home Vehicle Policy

Copies of an article in the National Association of County Officials (NACo) CountyNews Newsletter (February 27, 2012 edition) titled <u>Counties Look at Take-Home Vehicle</u> <u>Policies</u> were disseminated (Exhibit D).

Raybould presented an estimate of how much the County Sheriff's Department could save if it were to restrict the number of vehicles deputies are allowed to take home following shifts (Exhibit E). She said the reduction in fuel would pay for a new vehicle each year.

MOTION: Raybould moved and Hudkins seconded to explore the possibility of instituting a take-home vehicle policy, with input from the directors and elected officials.

It was suggested the policy be modeled on the ones mentioned in Exhibit D.

Raybould, Hudkins and Schorr voted aye. Heier and Smoyer were absent from voting. Motion carried 3-0.

4 COMMUNITY MENTAL HEALTH CENTER (CMHC) MANAGEMENT CONTRACT AND INVITATION TO NEGOTIATE (ITN) - C. J. Johnson, Administrator, Region V Systems; Dean Settle, Community Mental Health Center (CMHC) Director; Tom Fox and Brittany Behrens, Deputy County Attorneys

Schorr noted one of the recommendations from the Community Mental Health Center (CMHC) Planning Committee was to contract with Region V Systems for management during a transition period of two years as the County looks at different ways of restructuring how it provides CMHC services and an invitation to negotiate (ITN) process.

Tom Fox, Deputy County Attorney, said management of the facility would best be served if the director/executive officer were an employee of the County, noting there is a specific definition of appointing authority in the County Civil Service Act.

In response to a question from Schorr, Fox said it could be classified as an interim director.

C. J. Johnson, Administrator, Region V Systems, suggested a "hybrid" instead. He said he could ask the Region V Governing Board to move him from exempt to non-exempt status so he could be appointed Interim Director of CMHC. Johnson said he could split his time between the two agencies and be paid accordingly. He said the time requirement for CMHC would decrease over time. Johnson noted the Board will need to make a decision regarding an executive structure for the Crisis Center. He added that if employees decide to leave CMHC, Region V could contract with individuals or agencies to carry out those functions or it may have the ability to perform those functions within its own infrastructure.

Fox advised against "messing around" with exempt and non-exempt status, citing the Fair Labor Standards Act.

Settle suggested staff would be best served by keeping the lines of authority clear.

Schorr said she is looking more from a philosophical approach, i.e. whether it is better to appoint someone from CMHC who is familiar with staff and can help with team management or someone from Region V who may be better able to focus on reorganization. Johnson said there are pros and cons to each one.

Raybould suggested the Board try to convince Dean Settle, CMHC Director, to stay on a little while longer to provide stewardship of the agency. She said his oversight could be stepped down over time and Region V's authority and oversight is stepped-up.

Settle said he sees the potential for a conflict of interest in Johnson's "hybrid" proposal and believes there is another option that could be explored. He said there are others in the community who are eminently qualified to serve in an interim capacity and could possibly "morph" into the manager of the remaining emergency services, such as the Crisis Center.

Johnson said this is really not a novel situation. He said Region V went through a transition and had an interim director. There was also a similar situation when the Integrated Care Coordination Unit (ICCU) moved from the County to Region V and was divested.

Schorr said she would like to see the transition process completed by June 30th, which is when Settle's employment is scheduled to end.

Fox noted the position of CMHC Deputy Director is still open and said filling the position could allow for succession.

MOTION: Raybould moved to post the Community Mental Health Center (CMHC) Deputy Director position, with the understanding it will be a temporary position.

Eagan said there are two considerations: 1) Maintenance of CMHC during the transition; and 2) The invitation to negotiate (ITN) process. He said a traditional search for a deputy director would give the impression that the Board intends to go forward as a County agency. Eagan said the Board should be clear that it is looking for a temporary director while it transitions to a better mental health system.

The maker of the motion said she would accept posting the position as an interim director a friendly amendment.

Hudkins thought the motion was premature and did not second it. The motion died for the lack of a second.

Settle noted the Board needs to make a decision regarding the future of the Crisis Center, noting funds will have to be put into infrastructure (fiscal, human resources, etc.) if it is retained.

Discussion then focused on the ITN process. Brittany Behrens, Deputy County Attorney, explained the ITN is similar to a request for proposal (RFP). Raybould asked whether the Purchasing Department would be involved. Eagan said the Purchasing Department will provide support. Vince Mejer, Purchasing Agent, appeared and said he believes there needs to be a memorandum of understanding (MOU) with Region V before his department is involved. Raybould suggested the CMHC Planning Committee's recommendations could serve as the foundation for the MOU.

Board consensus was to schedule further discussion on the March 29th Staff Meeting agenda. Candidates for interim director will be one topic of discussion. A work session to discuss which programs might be retained and who will be involved in the ITN process was also suggested.

The Chair exited the meeting at 9:31 a.m. and the Vice Chair assumed direction of the meeting.

5 LINCOLN COUNCIL ON ALCOHOLISM AND DRUGS (LCAD)
DISSOLUTION - Kit Boesch, Human Services Administrator; Brittany
Behrens, Deputy County Attorney

Kit Boesch, Human Services Administrator, said the Lincoln Council on Alcoholism and Drugs (LCAD) will close its doors to the public on March 31, 2012. She said LCAD will continue to provide services for a two-day conference on substance abuse prevention. Boesch recommended that the County stop all payments to LCAD for general prevention as of March 31,2012 and hold all conference monies to pay those bills. She said the County will remain the fiscal agent for three of LCAD's grants and suggested development of a contract with Region V for prevention planning.

The Chair returned to the meeting at 9:34 a.m. and resumed direction of the meeting.

Brittany Behrens, Deputy County Attorney, said the County has three (3) grant contracts with LCAD that have terms that extend beyond March 31, 2012. The first contract (Contract No. C-11-0735) expires September 30, 2012, the second contract (Contract No. C-11-03734) expires September 29, 2012, and the third contract (Contract No. C-10-0546) was amended to extend the term through June 30, 2012. She recommended termination of the contracts, the first two with effective termination dates of March 31, 2012 and the third, which contains the services related to the conference, will have a termination date of May 31, 2012. Behrens noted there still may be payment processing beyond March 31st for services provided prior to that date. **MOTION:** Raybould moved and Hudkins seconded to issue letters of termination to

the Lincoln Council on Alcoholism and Drugs (LCAD) for three (3) grant contracts with the outlined effective dates. Raybould, Hudkins and Schorr voted aye. Heier and Smoyer were absent from voting. Motion carried 3-0.

A) GRANT APPLICATION ON BEHALF OF SUBSTANCE ABUSE ACTION COALITION (SAAC) TO SUBSTANCE ABUSE AND MENTAL HEALTH SERVICES ASSOCIATION (SAMHSA) (\$50,000 FOR EACH OF FOUR YEARS); B) GRANT APPLICATION ON BEHALF OF COMMUNITY SAFE HAVEN COALITION TO THE U.S. DEPARTMENT OF JUSTICE, OFFICE OF VIOLENCE AGAINST WOMEN (\$400,000) AND SIGNING OF SUPPORT LETTERS; C) \$5,000 GRANT FROM NEBRASKA DEPARTMENT OF HIGHWAY SAFETY FOR SAAC CONFERENCE (MAY 10-11, 2012); D) CONTINUANCE OF ARREST GRANT ON BEHALF OF THE FAMILY VIOLENCE COUNCIL (\$300,000 OVER TWO YEARS) AND SIGNING OF SUPPORT LETTERS; E) JUVENILE JUSTICE PREVENTION FUND REPORT; AND F) KENO PREVENTION FUND RECOMMENDATIONS - Kit Boesch, Human Services Administrator

Kit Boesch, Human Services Administrator, gave an overview of the four grants referred to as Items 6A-6D.

MOTION: Hudkins moved and Raybould seconded to authorize the Chair to sign the grant applications and letters of support for Items 6A, 6B and 6D. Hudkins, Raybould and Schorr voted aye. Heier and Smoyer were absent from voting. Motion carried 3-0.

NOTE: The Board will take action on Item 6C at the March 20, 2012 County Board of Commissioners Meeting.

Boesch discussed the <u>Juvenile Justice Prevention Fund Report (First Quarter: November, 2011 - January, 2012)</u> (see agenda packet), noting 778 unduplicated youth were served through seven (7) different agencies/programs: Court Appointed Special Advocates (CASA), Cedars Youth Services, Golden Warriors Program, Talented Tenth Scholars Program at the Malone Center, The Hub, Lighthouse, and Big Brothers/Big Sisters (see agenda packet).

Boesch also gave an overview of the Keno Prevention Fund recommendations, noting 18 agencies submitted funding requests and 11 were recommended for funding for a total of \$36,715 (see agenda packet). **NOTE:** The Board will take action on the funding recommendations at the March 20, 2012 County Board of Commissioners Meeting.

7 A) ESTIMATE OF ARCHITECT PROPOSAL FOR REMODEL OF

COUNTY ASSESSOR'S OFFICE SPACE; AND B) LEASE OF COUNTY LOT NEAR WAVERLY - Don Killeen, County Property Manager

A) Estimate of Architect Proposal for Remodel of County Assessor's Office Space

Don Killeen, County Property Manager, said Sinclair Hille & Associates Inc. has submitted a proposal to look at the County Assessor/Register of Deeds space for \$1,800. He said Norm Agena, County Assessor/Register of Deeds, has developed a plan that he believes is a workable solution. Killeen said it will involve removal of several walls and systems furniture but Agena does not have pricing to present to the Board yet.

Hudkins said he does not support expending funds for an architectural study to reorganize that office, particularly if it involves the County Clerk's Office. **NOTE:** Agena presented a proposal at the Mid-Year Budget Retreat to expand his department's office space into space currently occupied by the County Clerk's Office.

Schorr said she also has concerns regarding any expansion into the County Clerk's office space. She asked whether his new proposal is to just use systems furniture and not encroach upon the office space of another elected official.

Killeen said he is not sure.

B) Lease of County Lot Near Waverly

Killeen noted the County has leased out farmland near Interstate 80 and North 13th Street for \$125 per acre and must notify the tenant by April 1, 2012 if it plans to make any changes to the lease agreement. He said another farmer has also expressed interest in leasing the property.

Hudkins said cash leases on farmland have increased significantly.

Board consensus was to request sealed bids from both parties, setting the minimum bid at \$175 per acre.

ADDITIONS TO THE AGENDA

C. County Repair and Maintenance Shop

Raybould said she would like to revisit the issue of the County Repair and Maintenance Shop and presented a list of questions she would like answered related to that operation (Exhibit E):

- How many vehicles does the Repair and Maintenance Shop service on a daily basis?
- What is the typical turn around time on repair and maintenance?

- How many vehicles does the Repair and Maintenance Shop service on a weekly basis?
- What are the total revenues that the Repair and Maintenance Shop brings in?
- What is the overhead?
- What is the cost of inventory on hand?
- How often is the inventory audited?
- How many private service contractors do you currently work with?
- What type of vehicles or machinery do they typically service?
- What is the cost to the County for their services?
- What is the savings to the County that the Repair and Maintenance Shop provides?

Schorr said she and Commissioner Heier met with Don Thomas, County Engineer, and he agreed to an audit of inventory. She said she is willing to explore what that would cost.

Raybould indicated she is seeking more of a performance audit. She said a repair and maintenance shop is not a mandatory function and felt the Board could not assess its value without proper data.

Dennis Meyer, Budget and Fiscal Officer, appeared and said he is not sure the County Engineer would agree to that type of audit, adding the end result might be the same, i.e., the costs would just be shifted to the departments that utilize the Repair and Maintenance Shop.

Schorr said County departments are not interested in eliminating those services because of the cost effective way County vehicles are maintained.

Raybould felt the perceived cost savings are based on "false" metrics and said she spoke to an Automotive Sciences Professor at the University of Nebraska who is willing to collaborate that.

Schorr said she will follow-up with the Heier, Meyer and the County Engineer on options for an inventory audit.

Raybould said she will contact the Automotive Sciences Professor to see whether he would be willing to assist the County in that endeavor.

Schorr responded that Raybould will need the majority support of the Board for that.

10 ADMINISTRATIVE OFFICER REPORT

A. Information Services (IS) Work Performed for Lancaster Manor

Eagan said Information Services (IS) provided approximately \$10,000 worth of services to Lancaster Manor during the transition for which they have not been paid. He said the County has received an invoice from Lancaster Manor for the capital improvements made to the facility and said one of the attorneys has suggested the County withhold payment until the issue is resolved. He said Thorpe sent Lancaster Manor an email regarding the matter but has not received a response. Eagan suggested it would be appropriate to follow-up with a letter from the Board.

MOTION: Raybould moved and Hudkins seconded to send a letter to Lancaster Manor, from either the Chair or County Attorney's Office, requesting their immediate attention to this matter. Hudkins, Raybould and Schorr voted aye. Heier and Smoyer were absent from voting. Motion carried 3-0.

B. Letter of Support for Grant Application from the Center for People in Need to Office of Refugee Resettlement

MOTION: Hudkins moved and Raybould seconded to authorize signature by the Chair. Hudkins, Raybould and Schorr voted aye. Heier and Smoyer were absent from voting. Motion carried 3-0.

C. Proposed Guidelines for Guardians ad Litem for Juveniles in Juvenile Court Proceedings

Eagan said he was contacted by Douglas County regarding proposed guidelines issued by the Nebraska Supreme Court that govern guardians ad litem in Juvenile Court proceedings. He said Douglas County has estimated the guidelines could double their costs. Lancaster County's Juvenile Court also has concerns. He suggested the Board submit a written comment expressing concerns and agreed to prepare a draft for the Board's consideration.

D. Arena Tour (Rescheduled for Friday, March 23, 2012 at 4:00 p.m.)

12 DISCUSSION OF BOARD MEMBER MEETINGS

A. Chamber Coffee - Raybould, Smoyer

Raybould said she did not attend.

B. Nebraska Association of County Officials (NACO) Southeast District Meeting - Heier, Hudkins

Hudkins said the main topic of discussion was LB 970 (Terminate the inheritance tax and change income tax rates and calculations). He said they also received a presentation on wellness programs.

C. Information Services Policy Committee (ISPC) - Schorr

Schorr said they were given an overview of projects.

D. Parks and Recreation Advisory Board - Raybould

Raybould said she did not attend.

E. Human Services Joint Budget Committee (JBC) - Schorr, Raybould

Schorr reported they are moving to an on-line application process.

F. Railroad Transportation Safety District (RTSD) - Hudkins, Schorr, Smoyer

Schorr said they discussed the preliminary budget. She said they also discussed a "quiet zone" project in Hickman and a preliminary plan for a large "quiet zone" project along Cornhusker Highway involving crossings at 27th, 33rd and 35th Streets. **NOTE:** A quiet zone is a railroad grade crossing at which trains are prohibited from sounding their horns in order to decrease the noise level for nearby residential communities.

Raybould asked whether funding for the Southwest 40th Street project remains intact. **NOTE:** The project involves a viaduct over railroad tracks near the new Lancaster County Adult Detention Facility (LCADF).

Hudkins said it is still a priority. He said the project along Cornhusker Highway, which he referred to as the Dead Man's Run project, will require the maximum RTSD levy for ten years and said he would want to see the Southwest 40th Street project completed first.

G. Public Building Commission (PBC) Meeting with Mayor - Hudkins

Hudkins said they discussed the Benesch building (825 J Street) purchase, noting the PBC has secured better financing for the purchase.

H. Chair and Vice Chair's Meeting with Mayor - Schorr, Hudkins

Schorr said they relayed concerns regarding: 1) The lack of a signed contract between the City and the arena management company, which has impacted the ability of the Lincoln Convention and Visitors Bureau (CVB) to book convention business; and 2) Billings the County Treasurer has received from Information Services (IS).

I. Public Building Commission - Hudkins, Raybould

Raybould said discussion focused on the purchase of the Benesch Building (see Item 12G).

J. Board of Health - Smoyer

No report.

There were no emergency items or other business.



Lancaster County Board of Commissioners

Legislative Update

March 15, 2012

Today is the forty-fourth day of the sixty day session.

This week the Revenue Committee advanced LB 970 (Cornett) on a vote of 5-3. The amended version of the bill did not include the elimination of the inheritance tax and adjusted the Governor's plan to give a tax cut to Nebraska citizens. The amended plan would cost \$148 million over the next three years. His original plan was to cost over \$327 million. According to the Governor, we can afford this with future reductions in spending. We are delighted that the inheritance tax was not included but we will need to prepare for next year because the Governor will advocate for the elimination again. This became the number one priority for Lancaster County this year and will be again.

We were asked to talk about the bill (LB 790) introduced by Senator Colby Coash. This is the bill that would transfer a judgeship in the 5th Judicial District to the 3rd Judicial District which is Lancaster County. Lancaster County judge's caseloads have increased 60 percent since 1985, while other counties have seen a decrease. The Nebraska Judicial Resources Commission has determined that a 5th Judicial District judgeship should be transferred. The bill was passed by the Legislature and on March 8 on a vote of 38-8. The bill will take effect in July 2012.

The other top priority of Lancaster County is the change requested concerning the retirement plan contributions. This bill (LB 867) introduced by Senator Russ Karpisek is on the agenda about six bills down.



Counties Look at Take-Home Vehicle Policies

With the continuing rise in gas rices and tightening of budgets, nany counties have been reviewng vehicle take-home policies for ounty employees.

Although some see this as a uxury for certain county employees, n many cases, it may be more practial or economical for the county to illow employees to keep a vehicle overnight. A carefully crafted policy can ensure that the right employees are utilizing this practice to efficiently carry out county duties.

A take-home vehicle policy generally identifies the type and the circumstances of county employees who may take vehicles home. Many take-home vehicles are limited to emergency responders or other public safety staff who are on a 24/7 call basis.

Most policies lay out factors for department directors to assess before considering a take-home vehicle such as job responsibilities, productivity, vehicle availability, and the cost to the county of a takehome vehicle versus the reimbursement for use of a personal vehicle. It also provides specific instructions as to how the vehicle may be used and tax reporting rules for employees.

Current Information Snapshots on Take-home Vehicle Policies

King County, Wash.

King County policy establishes three categories of criteria for allowing employees to take home vehicles. The first category includes emergency responders who are required to immediately respond to emergency situations and are called out at least 12 times per quarter. The second category looks at whether there is an economic benefit to the county. For example, the cost of travel reimbursement would exceed the cost of the take-home vehicle or an employee requires a vehicle with special equipment to respond to emergency situations.

The final category concerns contracts that provide the option of approval of a take-home vehicle.

For all of these categories, supporting documentation must be provided to prove the employee's circumstances and the request must be approved by a supervisor and the fleet manager.

Douglas County, Colo.

Take-home vehicles in Douglas

routinely need to respond to emergencies or who have limited access to emergency vehicle pools. They are provided for use while commuting to work and for business purposes during the day.

Department directors must submit a list of staff assigned a takehome vehicle to the county manager for approval. All employees who use a county vehicle are given specific guidance as to the proper use of county vehicles including being prohibited from being used for personal reasons. This policy excludes the sheriff's office and coroner's office.

■ Montgomery County, N.C.

To be considered for taking a vehicle home county employees must have a valid North Carolina driver's license, maintain a safe driving record and receive approval from a department director. Employees are considered if they are required to respond to emergency calls or other unscheduled work for emergency situations on a regular basis. Employees such as maintenance employees who are subject to on-call schedules are also eligible for a take-home vehicle during the period they are on call. Public safety employees may also be assigned a take-home vehicle.

The assignment of vehicles is reviewed annually and department heads are encouraged to consider requirements of the job, productivity, availability of county vehicles and the cost to the county when evaluating take-home vehicle requests.

Ulster County, N.Y.

The policy for Ulster County clearly states that the assignment of a county vehicle is not based on status but upon job function. To be eligible for a take-home vehicle, emergency responders must be called out at least 12 times per quarter or 48 times per year and have no alternative form of transportation, or need a special-equipment vehicle. In addition, employees may be granted a take-home vehicle if there is an economic benefit to the county. The policy also allows the occasional use of a take-home vehicle due to inclement weather or seasonal work by employees. All vehicle requests must be reviewed every six months.

Los Angeles County, Calif.

In addition to the allowance of take-home vehicles for emergency

equipment vehicles, the Los Angeles County policy also includes an allowance for those workers who exceed 5,000 miles of vehicle usage in a calendar year. This number excludes the daily miles for commuting from home.

EXHIBIT

Those employees who travel different parts of the county but do not reach 5,000 miles may also be eligible if work is required after normal business hours.

All employees with a take-home vehicle must sign a form which outlines the county policy, including the use of the vehicle only for business purposes. The form must be renewed each year.

Orange County, Va.

The Orange County policy

County are limited to those who responders or those needing special use policy and tax procedures for employees. County vehicles may not be used for personal business, other than commuting from home to work, without specific written approval from a county constitutional officer. In addition, no passengers are allowed in the vehicle except other county staff or those assisting with county business.

> The policy also provides guidance on how to report the use of the vehicle to the IRS. This guidance includes how to keep mileage logs for tax purposes, how to determine which vehicles and trips are taxable, and how to calculate the annual lease value of the vehicle being used for reporting purposes.

Known as the first new county created in the state of North Carolina, Caswell County was established May 9, 1777. It was carved from Orange County to make governmental agencies more accessible to the area's residents and was named after Richard Caswell, the first governor of North Carolina.

As it remains today, tobacco was the leading agricultural product of the county during the antebellum period. It was in this county that the Slade family discovered the bright-leaf tobacco curing process that revolutionized the tobacco industry and brought great wealth to the region.

The year 1861 saw the start of the Civil War and the completion of the magnificent Caswell County Courthouse. The county also saw the development of various mills (flour and lumber), most dependent upon water power.

The seal shows two tobacco leaves representing how it helped the county prosper and the courthouse built at the start of the Civil War.

Sheriff Vehicle Approval

Recommend reducing the vehicle request from 6 to 3 because of projected budget overage of \$61,072 from mid-year. Recommend keeping vehicles on site after a deputy's shift rather than allowing the deputy to use the vehicle for commuting. Here is a quick analysis using only 55 of the 75 vehicles in their department and the reduction in mileage, fuel and wear comes up to over \$18,000 \$36,000 per year in fuel savings alone.
