MOTION: Amundson moved and Raybould seconded approval of the minutes. Schorr, Raybould, Amundson and Smoyer voted aye. Hudkins was absent. Motion carried 4-0.

2) CLAIMS: Approval of all claims processed through Tuesday, November 19, 2013.

MOTION: Raybould moved and Amundson seconded approval of the claims. Raybould, Amundson, Schorr and Smoyer voted aye. Hudkins was absent. Motion carried 4-0.

A. Introduction of Pamela L. Dingman, Proposed Appointee for Lancaster County Engineer. (See 4A for correlating item.)

Pamela Dingman introduced herself and thanked the Board for the opportunity.

B. Commissioners Award of Excellence for October to Janice Maginn, Mental Health Crisis Center.

SPECIAL PRESENTATIONS CONTINUED:

Scott Etherton, Community Mental Health Crisis Center Director, introduced Janice Maginn and Anita Leonard, Maginn's supervisor. The Clerk read the nomination for the record. Leonard praised Maginn for her work. Schorr presented a plaque to Maginn who thanked the Board for the award.

C. Southeast Community College (SCC) Annual Report – Dr. Jack Huck, SCC President.

Jack Huck distributed and discussed the 2012-2013 Annual Report (Exhibit A) and the 2012-2013 Placement Report (Exhibit B).

4) **NEW BUSINESS**:

A. Appointment of Pamela L. Dingman as Lancaster County Engineer, effective December 14, 2013.

Schorr noted that Commissioner Hudkins also supported the appointment.

B. Recommendation from the Purchasing Agent to award a four-year contract to Waste Connections of Nebraska, d/b/a Midwest Refuse, for waste hauling services for Lancaster County, the City of Lincoln and the Lincoln-Lancaster County Public Building Commission at an estimated cost of \$85,000. (B-13-0043)

Bob Walla, Assistant Purchasing Agent, said there would be separate contracts for waste hauling and recycling. The recycling contract is forthcoming.

MOTION: Raybould moved and Amundson seconded approval of the recommendation. Schorr, Raybould, Amundson and Smoyer voted aye. Hudkins was absent. Motion carried 4-0.

C. Contract with NMC, Inc., for two articulated frame four-wheel drive motor graders. Total cost after trade-in is \$397,356. (C-13-0570)

MOTION: Amundson moved and Schorr seconded approval of the contract. Raybould, Amundson, Schorr and Smoyer voted age. Hudkins was absent. Motion carried 4-0.

D. Agreement between Hamilton Equipment Company and Lancaster County, on behalf of the Lancaster County Engineering Department, for rental of a Bobcat S750 skid loader for \$195 per month. Term of the rental agreement is one year from the date of execution. (C-13-0571)

NEW BUSINESS CONTINUED:

E. Amendment to County Contract C-10-0228 between G&M Window Services, LLC, Lancaster County, the City of Lincoln and the Lincoln-Lancaster County Public Building Commission for the annual requirements of window cleaning services. The amendment adds services for the City Parking Services Division, Red One Garage. (C-13-0572)

MOTION: Raybould moved and Amundson seconded approval of the amendment. Schorr, Raybould, Amundson and Smoyer voted aye. Hudkins was absent. Motion carried 4-0.

F. Contract with the Office of Probation Administration to expand the Day, Evening and Weekend Reporting Center Program by adding six additional slots. Probation Administration will pay the County \$83,333 for the additional slots. Term of the agreement is November 1, 2013, to June 30, 2014. (C-13-0573)

MOTION: Schorr moved and Raybould seconded approval of the contract. Schorr, Raybould, Amundson and Smoyer voted aye. Hudkins was absent. Motion carried 4-0.

G. Amendment to County Contract C-13-0295 with Vest Psychiatric Services for professional services of a nurse practitioner to assist in the provision of psychiatric services at the Community Mental Health Center. The amendment allows Tina Vest to provide six additional hours of service per week. (C-13-0574)

MOTION: Raybould moved and Amundson seconded approval of the amendment. Raybould, Amundson, Schorr and Smoyer voted aye. Hudkins was absent. Motion carried 4-0.

H. Acceptance of State Grant Award 13-CB-516 from the Nebraska Commission on Law Enforcement and Criminal Justice in the amount of \$201,895 for Lancaster County Community Aid. (C-13-0575)






Enrollment




Statistics based on Full-time Equivalent Students (FTEs.)

2013-2014 Expenditures




2013-2014 Revenue



The epitome of a humanitarian

June graduate Christine Fiala always helping someone

Christine Fiala is the epitome of a humanitarian.

In fact, when one door was closed because of a lack of education, she opened

Fiala graduated from Southeast Community College in June 2013 with an Associate of Science degree. She began studying toward a Bachelor of Science degree in Nursing at the University of Nebraska Medical Center's Lincoln Campus in August.

Her goal after graduating in 2015?

"I plan to seek employment at a hospital in Lincoln for a couple of years to pay off my student loans and save some money," Fiala said. "I would then like to join Doctors Without Borders, or another relief aid organization, and work as a nurse in refugee camps and disaster-stricken areas throughout the world and help those who are going through a time of tragedy or disaster. I want to be the one to bring healing, comfort and hope in a time of pain and despair."

Fiala's resume reveals a history of providing help to those less fortunate. When she earns her BSN, she will have cleared a hurdle that once prevented her from providing aid.

"I wanted to find something that would pay my flights to volunteer," she said. "I researched Doctors Without Borders, and the organization requires a minimum of an RN degree for the work in which I'd like to do. I also could use this degree in Nebraska to earn money while helping people at home. So I found it a wise choice to return to school while I was at a crossroads and nobody was relying on my services overseas. I am now studying as hard as I can and gaining as much knowledge as possible so I can bring the best care to help alleviate the pain and suffering of so many people in need throughout the world."

Fiala graduated high school in 1997 and performed in seven European countries for three weeks with Nebraska Ambassadors of Music. She then moved to Australia that summer through a program called World Experience in Agriculture, a program through FFA. She stayed with and worked for host families on their farms throughout the country for one year.

She returned for a second year, from October 1999 to October 2000, through a program called BUNAC USA (British



Universities North America Club), which allowed her a one-year work permit.

"I returned to the same family farms to visit, but I also found another job, from an online jobsite, in the outback on a 250,000acre station in the northwest corner of New South Wales called Borrona Downs," Fiala said. "I had the opportunity to muster cattle and sheep by helicopter, motorbike and horseback. This was an amazing opportunity unlike any other."

Before she started school at SCC in January 2011 she returned to Australia for a 10-year reunion trip to visit all of her host families and friends.

Missionary work, Fiala said, has always been in her thoughts.

"I found a paper from my elementary school that asked us what we wanted to be when we grew up," she recalls. "My reply was something to the order of model, actress, marine biologist, and work at an orphanage in a poor country. After high school I fulfilled a few other dreams, like living in Australia, working at a cattle ranch in the Rocky Mountains of Colorado, and working at homeless shelters for children here in Nebraska (Cedars Home for Children). It was after I worked for rafting trips in Grand Teton National Park, Wyoming that I decided that I have accomplished most of what I wanted, and now it was time to do something more with my life."

Just 22 years old, Fiala researched orphanages online and found directions to Orphanage Emmanuel, operated by a couple from California, in Guaimaca, Honduras. It was a large orphanage (270 children, which increased to 450 before Fiala left in 2005) with a lot of need for help.

After teaching herself as much Spanish as she could in one month, she embarked on her first volunteer trip in January 2002. After her first trip of three months, she returned

three more times for longer periods during the course of the next three years.

"I helped build another orphanage and worked with a couple of nurses at their medical clinics for the poor, mainly assisting in pharmacy work, but also in every other area possible such as dental assisting for visiting overseas dentists and clerical work," Fiala said.

But in October 2005 she decided to take a different path and move to Africa to work with Mother Teresa's sisters, the Missionaries of Charity. Fiala began at their homes for the dying with approximately 1,500 patients. She cleaned wounds, changed dressings and bathed and fed patients.

After a month there Fiala was moved to take charge of the antiretroviral medicines (AIDS medications) at their AIDS orphanage for 450 children. There was only one nurse at the time, a doctor from Italy, and the superior sister, Jan Maria, who also was a doctor from Slovakia. Fiala worked from 5 in the morning until 10 at night that first year.

"We did not have children's dosages in a lot of medicines, so I had to cut big tablets with scissors and dump and divide capsules by razor blade into smaller doses, which was very time consuming," she said. "I cut, mixed and administered the medicines. Along with the AIDS, a lot of children also had tuberculosis, so those meds were given in the mornings as well. I also administered physical therapy and took kids for chest X-rays. A lot of the time I had to prepare and administer the meds by candlelight due to frequent electricity outages."

Fiala returned to the orphanages multiple times because she felt it was "God's path for me in life."

"There is such desperate need in the poor countries of this world," Fiala said, "I didn't realize or understand it until I saw and lived it for myself. The people are so desperate for help and so grateful that you are there to help them. It is such a rewarding experience to be the one to give them what they need."

In Ethiopia, Fiala was heavily relied upon due to the low number of medical staff. Through the years, improvements were made.

"When I started there was one nurse," she said. "By the time I left there were about five nurses rotating through. It allowed them to have enough staff to take over the medicine

Long-time LPS guidance counselor returns to school, becomes RN

"Having served Lincoln Public Schools for 31 years as a middle school counselor and coach, I often encouraged students to follow their dreams. If you allow it, life has a way of making a path for you.

"In June 2006, my Mom died of cancer, and I made the decision that cancer wasn't going to make me a victim. I decided to honor my Mom by retiring and becoming a nurse so that I could love other mothers and daughters through their disease.

"In 2010, I found myself sitting across from a former student of mine. However, we were now in the same role as students in the Associate Degree Nursing program. I soon realized that I had taken my 20-year-old brain for granted when I was getting my first degree in the 1970s and 80s. My younger classmates could quickly absorb the teachings of the day while I read and reread the material to grasp the concepts. My classmates all readily accepted me, studied with me and some have become life-long friends.

"Establishing a relationship with patients and their families as I work as an RN on the Traumatic Brain Injury Unit at Madonna Rehabilitation Hospital is extremely satisfying. Many of the patients are with us for 30 days or more, and knowing that I have a small part in their healing when they are being discharged is very gratifying.

"Studying the rigorous and challenging nursing curriculum on a quarter system







Instructor's viewpoint

Freshman English class leaves lasting impression on Kara Gall

A dynamic high school English instructor helped Kara Gall find her voice.

Today, the developmental English instructor at SCC is working to ensure that each of her students finds their voice, too. Gall was so influenced by her ninth-grade English instructor, Norma Scholes, that she adopted a teaching philosophy that mirrors that of her mentor.

"I credit Mrs. Scholes and her early willingness to listen and honor my ideas," Gall said. "I didn't know it then, but this early experience became critical in my philosophy of teaching. Beyond creating a culture of excellence and high standards in the classroom, humanizing my students' experience is my pedagogical imperative."

Gall and English Department colleague Phip Ross developed an accelerated class called College English Studies that has proven to be effective in helping students who struggle with English. Their research told them that the more levels of developmental courses a student must go through, the less likely that student is to ever complete college English or math. A random survey of SCC students indicated that only 21 to 37 percent of those enrolled in developmental English courses at SCC went on to pass Composition I.

"This needs to change," said Gall, the 2011-2012 Wekesser Outstanding Faculty Award recipient at SCC. "Phip and I saw evidence that reducing exit points through accelerated coursework led to a greater success rate than our current model, and we developed an accelerated English course that would give students the skills needed to succeed in Composition I."

After teaching the 7.5-credit class for four quarters, Gall said she was excited about the future of the course and how SCC's English Department might use the model of acceleration and blending the instruction of reading, writing and critical thinking to help developmental students succeed in English and flourish in their programs of study.

"Phip and I will continue teaching the accelerated class in upcoming quarters, and in fall 2013 I will be piloting a combined reading and writing class, with the goal of helping students develop both their reading and writing skills in one six-credit class," she said.



When Gall began college at the University of Nebraska-Lincoln, she said she lost her voice and her "crutch."

"I couldn't sit quietly at the back of the classroom and expect my instructors to call me out of my shell. If I didn't speak up, I would be lost. I didn't speak up. I was lost."

The next year she took a few classes at SCC and fell in love with the small environment. She transferred to Nebraska Wesleyan University, earning a degree in 1997.

"At Nebraska Wesleyan I was assigned a personal advisor who quickly learned my name," she said. "My instructors and advisors had that same quality that Mrs. Scholes had: They began a conversation with me, based upon my writing, about my life, my ideas, my experiences, my values, and my identity."

Gall moved to the San Francisco Bay area and taught kindergarten and worked for the University of California Natural Reserve System. Through all these changes she found her voice in writing, so much so that in early 2002, she decided to return to school for her Master of Arts degree in English, with an emphasis in Creative Writing.

Today, Gall gets excited when her

students begin to understand what she is trying to teach them.

"It's a special gift to witness students develop their voices and step into their own power," she said. "I also just love reading a good story. Every quarter there is at least one piece of student writing that leaves me inspired and hopeful. Every student walks through SCC's doors with a story to tell. I try to impart the skills that will help them communicate that story to the world."

Gall said her freshman English class in high school transcended writing.

"That writing project marked the first time in my role as a student that I felt seen as a whole person," she said. "I didn't have much of a voice at home. But in the classroom, for the first time, my words were not only listened to, but valued. My instructor began a conversation with me, based upon my writing, about my life, my ideas, my experiences, my values, and my identity. She listened, following up with questions that helped me shape not only my writing for the project, but my sense of self as both student and individual."

English, particularly writing, gave Gall a voice she didn't have elsewhere in her life. Teaching, she said, is a rewarding experience that is difficult to describe.

"I am inspired by the little shifts that occur when students realize they have power, not just over their own learning, but over their lives," Gall said. "The confidence to succeed in a particular assignment, which grows from learning very real skills that may have mystified them for years, gives them confidence to believe they can succeed in the class and in college, and ultimately achieve their dreams and goals. It's a special gift to witness students develop their voices and step into their own power."

She's also thrilled to be teaching at SCC.

"I love that SCC is such a studentfocused institution," Gall said. "We get to see students acquire hands-on, applied skills that they can take into the workforce and earn a decent living. Students who might not otherwise have the opportunity to access an education can do so here. Furthermore, the accessibility of a community college

From Page 26 education makes our student body population incredibly diverse.

"This is one of my favorite parts of working for SCC. Our students come from so many different backgrounds and have had so many interesting, unique experiences. These make for such a rich learning environment. In the same class, I might have a refugee student from Iraq, Congo, or Sudan, an immigrant from Mexico, a foreign exchange student from China, a student fresh out of high school, a 60-year old guy who is retraining after an injury in the workforce, a widowed grandmother who is taking classes just for fun, several working parents, a deaf student, a homeless student, you name it. We all really learn a lot about the world just from interacting with each other."

To that end, Gall continues to ask the question, "How can I keep students interested in my class?"

"I ask that question within the period of each class session, throughout the quarter, and between quarters," she said. "What works for one group of students might not work for others. The ground is always shifting. I am continuously reinventing my courses. What I have learned, though, is that students seem to be most interested when they have a stake in what they are learning and when they can see how the content of a course applies to their lives, either personally, academically, or professionally."

Gall incorporates numerous learning activities to help students understand the concepts they're learning.


"I approach course content and students themselves with a degree of seriousness and rigor," she said. "It's not that I don't want to have fun or that I don't want students to have fun; the fun can only begin once we have all committed to learning the material. I support them and encourage them while simultaneously challenging them and holding them accountable. Some students have never been 'taken seriously' by anyone in the academic world before. I expect them to work hard to learn the skills outlined in my course syllabi, but I will be there to help them when they get stuck."

preparation and administration. They also were able to hire a pharmacist and laboratory employees," Fiala said.

Helping children and seeing how appreciative they were was satisfying, Fiala

"I remember being so tired all the time," she said. "But when I would enter the children's dorms, kids would run to me with hugs from every direction. When I'd bring the medicine in the evenings, the little kids would be chanting 'Christina, Christina' and have huge smiles on their faces. They were so happy to see me and to receive a couple of seconds of one-on-one attention. To be the person to give them love and hugs and put a smile on their face and ease a little of their pain and suffering was the most satisfying part of my job."

Fiala's work in the orphanages came with numerous other challenges, including financial and her own health issues.

"But there was no comparison between what I had to the situation the kids were born into," Fiala said. "I would get over whatever illness I contracted in a matter of time. But the children were born with HIV and will have to live with it for the rest of their lives through no fault of their own."

Other challenges she faced were more like dangers and included fighting between the government and civilians resulting in a lock-down situation at the compound, which caused food to run short and bodies to begin piling up.

"Our food was becoming short while I was at the homes for the dying, so the bodies were piling up because we couldn't transport them safely to the burial site," Fiala said. "It was a pretty serious situation that had everyone worried for what was to come. Eventually, life slowly began to emerge in the city again, but uprisings would occur sporadically."

Fiala was caught in a riot about two months later while on her way back to the orphanage with chest X-rays.

"I got booted out of the minibus taxi at a roadblock, along with the rest of the people inside, while the driver turned around and went the other direction," Fiala said. "I had to run across the riot alongside the countless police with their batons and guns. I made it to the other side with my heart about pounding out of my chest and caught a minibus taxi that was turning around going back in the direction of the orphanage. It was pretty much the scariest situation I have encountered while volunteering."

Fiala has seen first-hand the face of poverty while serving as a volunteer in third-world countries during the course of eight years, and it's not pretty.

"I have seen the unnecessary suffering of so many innocent victims of war, poverty and illness," she said. "My volunteer experience has changed my life forever. It has made me grateful for every meal I eat, for everything I possess. I'm grateful for schools, for every peaceful day here in the U.S. without war or danger outside my doorstep, and to be able to live in an area where you can go to sleep at night without worrying about intruders coming to rob or harm you."

Fiala vows never to take anything for granted.

"I know how hard life is for most of the world," she said. "Life in poverty also taught me that family, friends and people are the most important things in this world. Material items have little to no value to me. My relationships with people mean the most.

"Volunteering has changed everything about me forever. It has opened my eyes to the unfortunate suffering of numerous people throughout the world. It is very hard to live a plush and cushy lifestyle while being home for school, knowing what is going on out there. I will never be the same person again."
