1) MINUTES: Approval of the minutes of the Board of Commissioners meetings held on Thursday, November 14, 2013, (joint meeting with Agricultural Society Board) and Tuesday, November 19, 2013, (regular meeting and one and six-year road and bridge public hearing).

MOTION: Amundson moved and Raybould seconded approval of the minutes. Raybould, Amundson and Smoyer voted aye. Hudkins and Schorr were absent. Motion carried 3-0.

2) CLAIMS: Approval of all claims processed through Tuesday, November 26, 2013.

MOTION: Raybould moved and Amundson seconded approval of the claims. Raybould, Amundson and Smoyer voted aye. Hudkins and Schorr were absent. Motion carried 3-0.

3) **NEW BUSINESS:**

A. Recommendation of the Lancaster County Pension Review Committee to place the following funds on the watch list for purposes of the Lancaster County Employee Retirement and 457 Deferred Compensation Plan Statement of Overall Investment Objectives and Policy: BlackRock Small Cap Growth Equity Instl, Perkins Mid Cap Value T and Mid Cap Value/Systematic Fund.

NEW BUSINESS CONTINUED:

Kerry Eagan, Chief Administrative Officer, said the Perkins Mid Cap Value T and Mid Cap Value/Systematic funds are producing good results, but they still lag behind their benchmarks. The BlackRock fund has changed managers twice in the past year, which warrants putting it on the watch list.

MOTION: Raybould moved and Amundson seconded approval of the recommendation. Amundson, Raybould and Smoyer voted aye. Hudkins and Schorr were absent. Motion carried 3-0.

B. Appointment of Michael J. Tavlin to the Lincoln-Lancaster County Board of Health for a term to expire April 15, 2015.

MOTION: Amundson moved and Raybould seconded approval of the appointment. Raybould, Amundson and Smoyer voted aye. Hudkins and Schorr were absent. Motion carried 3-0.

C. Appointment of Allen G. Blezek, Paula G. Peterson and James Newman for threeyear terms from January 2014 to January 2017 and the reappointment of James Bauman for a two-year term from January 2014 to January 2016 to the Lancaster County Extension Board.

MOTION: Amundson moved and Raybould seconded approval of the appointments and reappointment. Raybould, Amundson and Smoyer voted aye. Hudkins and Schorr were absent. Motion carried 3-0.

D. Recommendation from the Purchasing Agent and County Sheriff to issue a purchase order for seven 2014 Ford police utility vehicles from State of Nebraska Contract #13632OC to Anderson Ford Lincoln Mercury Mazda at an estimated cost of \$200,004. (B-13-0044)

Bob Walla, Assistant Purchasing Agent, corrected the total amount to \$199,654.

Raybould said she would support the purchase but encouraged the Sheriff's Office to find ways to be more economical with vehicles.

Smoyer noted the policy of reusing Sheriff's vehicles in other County agencies.

Amundson said she supported the request and commended the Sheriff's Office for their budget efforts.

MOTION: Amundson moved and Smoyer seconded approval of the recommendation. Raybould, Amundson and Smoyer voted aye. Hudkins and Schorr were absent. Motion carried 3-0.

E. Recommendation from the Purchasing Agent and County Engineer to award contracts to Westover Trucking and RL Tiemann Construction in the total amount of \$192,537.50 for 2014 rock hauling to County stockpiles. (B-13-0045)

MOTION: Raybould moved and Amundson seconded approval of the recommendation. Amundson, Raybould and Smoyer voted aye. Hudkins and Schorr were absent. Motion carried 3-0.

F. Contract between Manpower Group US, Inc., Lancaster County and the City of Lincoln for staffing and professional employment related services. The County will pay for services in accordance with the National Joint Powers Alliance Agreement #021610-MPI on an as needed basis. The agreement is effective through March 18, 2014. (C-13-0577)

MOTION: Raybould moved and Amundson seconded approval of the contract. Smoyer, Raybould and Amundson voted aye. Hudkins and Schorr were absent. Motion carried 3-0.

G. Contract with A Photo Identification for the annual supply of inmate ID wristbands for County Corrections. The County will pay up to \$4,400 for the products and services. Term of the agreement is December 1, 2013, to November 30, 2014. (C-13-0578)
