The Chair called the meeting to order at 10:30 a.m. and the location of the Nebraska Open Meetings Act was announced.

1) PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE

2) <u>MINUTES:</u> Approval of the minutes of the Board of Commissioners meeting held on Tuesday, May 27, 2014.

MOTION: Smoyer moved and Raybould seconded approval of the minutes. Schorr, Raybould, Amundson, Smoyer and Hudkins voted aye. Motion carried 5-0.

3) CLAIMS: Approval of all claims processed through Tuesday, June 3, 2014.

MOTION: Raybould moved and Amundson seconded approval of the claims. Raybould, Amundson, Smoyer, Schorr and Hudkins voted aye. Motion carried 5-0.

4) **SPECIAL PRESENTATION:**

A. Recognition of Kit Boesch, Human Services Director, for receiving the Closing the Gap Award from the Community Mental Health Endowment of Lincoln – Lori Seibel, Community Health Endowment President/CEO.

Item was held until later in the meeting.

5) **PUBLIC HEARING:**

A. Site approval request from Prairieland Dairy to develop a solid waste compost facility.

The Chair opened the public hearing.

Dan Rice, Prairieland Dairy General Manager, was administered the oath. He explained that the DEQ (Department of Environmental Quality) requires local approval for the site, which would expand composting from 10,000 yards to 100,000 yards of outside waste. Rice addressed a previous concern about truck traffic, stating that trucks may now only travel on 134th Street, passing only Prairieland Dairy residences. He discussed food waste sources from Norris Public Schools, Lincoln Public Schools and ConAgra, as well as local yard waste sources. Rice announced Prairieland Dairy Days would be held on June 28, 2014; the annual open house educates the public on agriculture and draws around 5,000 people each year.

Sara Hartzell, County Planner, was administered the oath. She explained that a special permit was approved for this application in preparation for the site approval. After that, Prairieland Dairy submitted a letter requesting local site approval, which resulted in the public hearing. Official action would probably need to be taken and a form would need to be completed to show approval.

The consensus was to take official action at the next staff meeting (Thursday, June 5, 2014) or at the next Board of Commissioners meeting (Tuesday, June 10, 2014).

The Chair closed the public hearing.

6) **OLD BUSINESS**:

A. Agreement between Region V Systems and Lancaster County, on behalf of the Community Mental Health Center, to fund a research professional to conduct a process evaluation of the transition of behavioral health services from the Community Mental Health Center to new service providers. Lancaster County will reimburse Region V Systems \$25,000 toward the cost of the services provided under Research Agreement #68595. The agreement is effective upon execution until the work outlined in Research Agreement #68595 is complete. (C-14-0268)

MOTION: Raybould moved and Smoyer seconded approval of the agreement. Raybould, Amundson, Smoyer and Hudkins voted aye. Schorr voted nay. Motion carried 4-1.

7) **NEW BUSINESS**:

A. Resolution in the matter of transferring appropriations from the General Fund Miscellaneous Budget to various General Fund agencies. The amount to be transferred is \$359,249. (R-14-0028)

Dennis Meyer, Budget & Fiscal Director, explained that funds are built into a contingency, expenses are tracked and additional appropriations are made to various departments at the end of the year. Legal services caused the Courts' budgets to fluctuate and taking over STOP (Safety Training Option Program) added to Community Corrections' budget.

NEW BUSINESS CONTINUED:

MOTION: Raybould moved and Schorr seconded approval of the resolution. Raybould, Amundson, Smoyer, Schorr and Hudkins voted aye. Motion carried 5-0.

B. Resolution concurring with the recommendation of the Nebraska Department of Roads to accept the bid of Trafcon, Inc., for Federal Aid Project No. HRRR-STWD(92) and authorizing the Chair of the Lancaster County Board of Commissioners to execute the necessary contracts. (R-14-0029)

MOTION: Smoyer moved and Amundson seconded approval of the resolution. Amundson, Smoyer, Schorr, Raybould and Hudkins voted aye. Motion carried 5-0.

C. Interlocal agreement with the State of Nebraska Probation Administration for two probation officers to provide additional presentence investigation report services to decrease the time needed to complete presentence investigations of inmates housed by the Lancaster County Corrections Department. The County will pay \$49,000 for the services. Term of the agreement is July 1, 2013, to June 30, 2014. (C-14-0271)

MOTION: Schorr moved and Raybould seconded approval of the agreement. Smoyer, Schorr, Raybould, Amundson and Hudkins voted aye. Motion carried 5-0.

D. Grant contract with Lincoln Public Schools for \$43,367 to fund an Education Transition Specialist as part of the juvenile offender reentry program. LPS will document \$55,183 in matching funds. Term of the agreement is July 1, 2014, to June 30, 2015. (C-14-0272)

MOTION: Amundson moved and Schorr seconded approval of the contract. Schorr, Raybould, Amundson, Smoyer and Hudkins voted aye. Motion carried 5-0.

E. Amendment to County Contract C-13-0362 with CEDARS Youth Services, Inc., for CEDARS' Day and Evening Weekend Reporting Centers program. The amendment increases the number of slots available from May 15, 2014, to June 30, 2014, and increases the funding provided for the program. (C-14-0273)

MOTION: Smoyer moved and Raybould seconded approval of the amendment. Raybould, Amundson, Smoyer, Schorr and Hudkins voted age. Motion carried 5-0.

F. Amendment to County Contract C-13-0316 with Pepsi-Cola of Lincoln for vending services. The amendment adds fit pick pricing and reduces the commission on snack foods from 15% to 10.5%. (C-14-0274)

MOTION: Schorr moved and Raybould seconded approval of the amendment. Amundson, Smoyer, Schorr, Raybould and Hudkins voted aye. Motion carried 5-0.

G. Approval of a fee agreement for services of the Law Offices of Pansing Hogan Ernst & Bachman LLP. (C-14-0275)

NEW BUSINESS CONTINUED:

MOTION: Raybould moved and Amundson seconded approval of the agreement. Smoyer, Schorr, Raybould, Amundson and Hudkins voted aye. Motion carried 5-0.

H. Acceptance of a Deputy Sheriff Captains' temporary retirement buyout program application and agreement between the County of Lancaster, Nebraska, and Mark K. Kelly, an employee of the Lancaster County Sheriff's Office. Mr. Kelly's resignation is effective July 25, 2014. (C-14-0276)

MOTION: Amundson moved and Smoyer seconded approval of the application and agreement. Schorr, Raybould, Amundson, Smoyer and Hudkins voted aye. Motion carried 5-0.

1. Refund request from Hillcrest Country Club for 2013 personal property tax.

Scott Gaines, Deputy County Assessor/Register of Deeds, recommended approval of the refund request, explaining that the tax was double paid by the lessor and lessee.

MOTION: Smoyer moved and Amundson seconded approval of the refund request. Raybould, Amundson, Smoyer, Schorr and Hudkins voted aye. Motion carried 5-0.






