A. Petition to designate Common teasel as a noxious weed in Lancaster County.

B. Petition to designate Cutleaf teasel as a noxious weed in Lancaster County.

MOTION: Smoyer moved and Raybould seconded approval of the petition. Smoyer, Schorr, Raybould, Amundson and Hudkins voted aye. Motion carried 5-0.

C. Amendment to County Contract C-12-0258 with Safety-Kleen Systems, Inc., for the used oil collection program. The amendment renews the agreement for an additional one-year term from May 29, 2014, to May 28, 2015, and reflects a price decrease whereby the City and County will be paid \$0.85 per gallon for used oil collected. (C-14-0288)

D. Amendment to County Contract C-12-0183 with WW Grainger, Inc., for the annual requirements of industrial supplies. The amendment renews the agreement for an additional one-year term from February 1, 2014, to January 31, 2015. (C-14-0289)

E. Grant contract with the City of Lincoln to provide funding for the Adult Recidivism Reduction Project. The County shall receive \$50,000 from the Keno Human Services Prevention Fund. Term of the grant contract is January 1, 2014, to December 31, 2014. (C-14-0290)

F. The County shall pay \$40 per hour, not to exceed eight hours per week, for the services provided. Term of the agreement is July 1, 2014, to June 30, 2015. (C-14-0291)
