Advance public notice of the Board of Commissioners Staff Meeting was posted on the County-City Building bulletin board and the Lancaster County, Nebraska, web site and provided to the media on April 9, 2014.

The Chair noted the location of the Open Meetings Act and opened the meeting at 8:34 a.m.

AGENDA ITEM

1 APPROVAL OF THE MINUTES OF THE APRIL 3, 2014 STAFF MEETING

MOTION: Smoyer moved and Raybould seconded approval of the minutes of the

April 3, 2014 Staff Meeting. Smoyer, Schorr, Amundson, Raybould and

Hudkins voted aye. Motion carried 5-0.

2 ADDITIONS TO AGENDA

A. Lease Rate for Community Mental Health Center (CMHC) Building (Exhibit A)

B. Strategic Purchasing Council

MOTION: Amundson moved and Smoyer seconded approval of the additions to the

agenda. Schorr, Raybould, Amundson, Smoyer and Hudkins voted aye.

Motion carried 5-0.

3 **LEGISLATIVE UPDATE -** Gordon Kissel and Joe Kohout, Kissel/E&S Associates (Legislative Consultants)

Joe Kohout, Kissel/E&S Associates, presented a legislative update, noting bills that relate to the County's legislative priorities and other legislation of potential interest to the County (Exhibits B and C). He noted Legislative Bill (LB) LB 464, which made cleanup changes to the 2013 Session's LB 561 was passed, as amended, last night.

NOTE: LB 561 changed provisions and transferred responsibilities regarding the juvenile justice system.

Sheli Schindler, Youth Services Center (YSC) Director, appeared and thanked Kohout for his efforts regarding LB 464.

Raybould noted a ballot initiative was passed in Oregon in 1996 prohibiting the Oregon Legislature from enacting unfunded mandates and asked Kohout for his thoughts on the matter. Kohout said he believes there will be opportunities to discuss unfunded mandates during the interim and to explore different options.

ADDITIONS TO THE AGENDA

B. Strategic Purchasing Group

Schorr reported on the Strategic Purchasing Group which is exploring cooperative bidding. The group is made up of representatives of the purchasing departments of the City of Lincoln/Lancaster County, University of Nebraska-Lincoln (UNL), Southeast Community College (SCC), Lincoln Public Schools (LPS), Lincoln Electric System (LES), Douglas County/City of Omaha, Sarpy County and the State of Nebraska. Schorr and Leirion Gaylor Baird, Lincoln City Council, are also attending the meetings.

Raybould noted the National Association of County Officials (NACo) has large contract processes which could be of benefit. Schorr said she will bring that up to the group.

ACTION ITEMS

A. Community Aid Enhancement Grant Application (\$76,773 Requested for Evidence Based Programming)

Sara Hoyle, Juvenile Justice Coordinator, appeared and said Lancaster County was asked to submit an application to provide evidence based programming for the State and this grant will provide the funding to do so.

MOTION: Smoyer moved and Amundson seconded to authorize signature by the Chair. Amundson, Raybould, Smoyer, Schorr and Hudkins voted aye. Motion carried 5-0.

B. Juvenile Accountability Block Grant (JABG) Grant Application (\$74,400 Requested to Fund a Full-Time Attorney in County Attorney's Office)

Hoyle noted a cash match of \$8,000 is required.

Joe Kelly, County Attorney, appeared and said the grant would fund the attorney that is working with the truancy courts, truancy diversion and the pre-screening and pre-trial diversion aspect of law violations.

In response to a question from Schorr, Kelly said the position will be in the budget request for next year.

MOTION:

Schorr moved and Amundson seconded to authorize signature by the Chair. Smoyer, Schorr, Raybould, Amundson and Hudkins voted aye. Motion carried 5-0.

ADDITIONS TO THE AGENDA

A. Lease Rate for Community Mental Health Center (CMHC) Building (Exhibit A)

Don Killeen, County Property Manager, appeared and said he proposed a lease rate of \$12.00 a square foot to Lutheran Family Services (LFS) for space on the first floor of the Community Mental Health Center (CMHC) Building, noting a rate of \$6.00 a square foot was proposed for the lower level (conference room). **NOTE:** LFS took over core services from CMHC. He said that rate was based on the appraisal of the building, adding an income approach shows a range of \$10.50 to \$12.90 a square foot. Killeen said LFS pointed out the County had reduced the lease rate for CenterPointe, Inc., which took over day rehabilitation services from CMHC, at MidPointe (formerly known as the Midtown Center) from \$8.50 to \$7.50 a square foot. He said he then proposed a rate of \$11.00 a square foot for the first floor but LFS indicated it had always assumed a lease rate of \$10.00 a square foot for the first floor and would like the lower level at no cost. LFS also requested to move from a month-to-month to a rolling 90-day lease term.

MOTION:

Schorr moved and Smoyer seconded to authorize a lease rate of \$10.00 a square foot for the first level and \$6.00 a square foot for the lower level conference room space for Lutheran Family Services (LFS) at the Community Mental Health Center (CMHC) Building. Amundson, Raybould, Smoyer, Schorr and Hudkins voted aye. Motion carried 5-0.

4 DISTRICT COURT CLERK REPLACEMENT EMPLOYEE - Troy Hawk, Clerk of the District Court

Troy Hawk, Clerk of the District Court, noted he came to the Board last fall and discussed a request from Judge Karen Flowers that he loan one of his employees, a court services clerk, to serve as her bailiff (see September 19, 2013 Staff Meeting minutes). **NOTE:** Judge Flowers was planning to retire at the end of 2013 and her bailiff was leaving to accept another position, which left her without a bailiff. It was understood that the individual might not be retained by Judge Flowers' successor and would return to the Clerk of District Court's Office if that occurred. The Board allowed him to backfill the vacancy with the understanding his staff would increase by one-full time equivalent (FTE) if the person serving as bailiff returned to his office.

Hawk said he learned last week that the person loaned to the District Court will remain a bailiff when the new judge takes the bench and will not be returning to the Clerk of the District Court's Office. He noted he indicated last fall that he would not replace that clerk if the individual remained a bailiff. However, due to staff reductions (2.5 employees) made by his predecessor over the last few years to meet the Board's request for budget cuts, there is a staff shortage in his office. Hawk said a new judge was brought in during that time which increased the office's workload and supervisors are doing front-line work instead of their supervisory duties to help keep up with the workload. He requested authorization to hire an additional full-time court services clerk, noting there are funds in his budget to cover the position for the remainder of this budget year. The position was also included in the budget request for next fiscal year.

Schorr asked whether a decision could be delayed until after the departmental budget hearings. Dennis Meyer, Budget and Fiscal Officer, appeared and said that is up to the Board, but cautioned if the Board decides to approve the position now, it will be difficult to go back on that decision if the Board looks to make budget cuts later on. Hawk said he would like to move ahead with the hiring, explaining there is a short amount of time remaining in which he can fill the position with one of the applicants that interviewed for the position last fall.

MOTION:

Raybould moved and Amundson seconded to authorize the Clerk of the District Court to hire a court services clerk, stipulating that any surplus funds in the Clerk of the District Court's budget must be returned to the General Fund. Schorr, Smoyer, Amundson, Raybould and Hudkins voted aye. Motion carried 5-0.

5 EXTENSION BUILDING FIRE ALARM PANEL - Gary Bergman, County Extension Unit Leader; Don Killeen, County Property Manager

Gary Bergman, County Extension Unit Leader, said the fire alarm system at the County Extension Building (444 Cherrycreek Road) did not pass inspection and needs to be replaced (cost of \$8,845.10). **NOTE:** The system will also cover County Engineering.

MOTION: Amundson moved and Raybould seconded to authorize the expense.

It was noted the Building Fund will be the payment source.

ROLL CALL: Raybould, Schorr, Smoyer, Amundson and Hudkins voted aye. Motion carried 5-0.

ADMINISTRATIVE OFFICER REPORT

A. Time line for 605 Building (Former Jail Facility) Renovation Bids

Killeen discussed the time line for the renovations to the 605 Building (see agenda packet).

Raybould, who serves on the Public Building Commission, noted Alfred Benesh & Company was given a 12-month notice to vacate the building they occupy at 825 J Street and has indicated they will require the full period to relocate their business. **NOTE:** The Crisis Center will be relocated to the Benesh Building.

B. Appointment to Commissioners' Award of Excellence Committee

MOTION: Schorr moved and Smoyer seconded to reappoint Minette Genuchi, Administrative Assistant to the County Board, to the Commissioners' Award of Excellence Committee. Smoyer, Amundson, Raybould, Schorr and Hudkins voted aye. Motion carried 5-0.

6 VISITOR PROMOTION COMMITTEE (VPC) VISITOR
IMPROVEMENT FUND GRANT RECOMMENDATIONS: A) LIED
CENTER FOR PERFORMING ARTS - FRIENDS OF LIED
(\$258,808.58); AND B) NEBRASKA HIGH SCHOOL SPORTS HALL
OF FAME FOUNDATION (\$19,780) - Julie Lattimer, Visitors Promotion
Committee (VPC) Chair; Jeff Maul, Lincoln Convention and Visitors
Bureau (CVB) Executive Director

A) Lied Center for Performing Arts - Friends of Lied (\$258,808.58)

Julie Lattimer, Visitors Promotion Committee (VPC) Chair, gave an overview of the request, noting it is part of the Lied Center's ongoing revitalization in conjunction with its 25th Anniversary during the 2014/2015 season. The Lied has already completed \$6,000,000 in renovations, additions and upgrades. She said the funding request is for five project components:

•	Front Canopy	\$89,545.50
•	LED Signage Around the Canopy	\$64,500.00
•	Lighting Workroom/Carson Theatre	\$53,819.00
•	Main Auditorium Digital Sound Board	\$25,362.08
•	Lobby Audio Sound	\$25,582.00

NOTE: See agenda packet for further details regarding each component.

Lattimer said the VPC considered the following information: 1) The building is owned by the University of Nebraska; 2) The Lied Center is considered an auxiliary and receives little financial support from the University; and 3) There are plans to begin funding an endowment.

Raybould asked whether the Lied Center pays rent to the University of Nebraska for the building. Jeff Maul, Lincoln Convention and Visitors Bureau (CVB) Executive Director, said they don't have that information. He added there are University Foundation revenues that go into their operating budget.

Lattimer said most past improvements have been funded from the 44% of their income that is raised by the Lied Foundation and there is an annual \$100,000 capital improvement fund in their budget for maintenance and upgrades. She said the Lied indicated this should be their last campaign for improvements and they will be able to maintain the current upgrades with their annual budget. The Lied does not have data supporting the number of visitors who spend the night in Lincoln after a performance but has purchased new ticketing software through a grant that will assist in acquiring that information in the future.

Lattimer said the VPC questioned why this request is the only funding source for these projects, according to the grant request. The VPC also considered which of the projects are capital expenses versus improvements that might bring in additional visitors. She said the VPC recommends funding in the amount of \$25,362.08 for the main auditorium digital sound board and \$64,500.00 for LED signage around the canopy, contingent upon the Lied Center finding additional funding for the front canopy project.

Dennis Meyer, Budget and Fiscal Officer, estimated there is \$400,000 available in the Visitors Improvement Fund.

Schorr asked whether a County Commissioner was present at the VPC meeting when the requests were discussed. Smoyer, who serves on the VPC, said he was unable to attend the meeting. It was noted Kerry Eagan, Chief Administrative Officer, was in attendance.

MOTION:

Smoyer moved and Amundson seconded to adopt the Visitors Promotion Committee's (VPC') recommendation to approve funding for the Lied Center in the amount of \$25,362.08 for the main auditorium digital sound board and \$64,500.00 for LED signage around the canopy, contingent upon the Lied Center finding additional funding for the front canopy project. Smoyer, Amundson, Raybould, Schorr and Hudkins voted aye. Motion carried 5-0.

NOTE: A contract will be brought forward at a regular County Board of Commissioners Meeting for approval.

B) Nebraska High School Sports Hall of Fame Foundation (\$19,780)

Lattimer said this is the second request from the Nebraska High School Sports Hall of Fame Foundation for funding in the amount of \$19,780 to complete an informational kiosk and audio/visual system. She said the Hall of Fame is located in the Nebraska School Activities Association (NSAA) headquarters building in the Lincoln Haymarket area. Lattimer said the VPC had concerns regarding: 1) Lack of a set project completion date and a solid promotion/marketing plan; 2) Regular operating hours do not include weekends; and 3) The facility does not generate hotel room nights. The VPC recommends denial of the request with the recommendation that the applicant resubmit their request when they have a more solid marketing, signage and tourism component in place.

MOTION: Schorr moved and Smoyer seconded to accept the recommendation from

the Visitors Promotion Committee (VPC) regarding the funding request from the Nebraska High School Sports Hall of Fame Foundation.

Eagan said he will draft a letter of denial.

ROLL CALL: Schorr, Raybould, Amundson, Smoyer and Hudkins voted aye. Motion carried 5-0.

C. Microcomputer Request No. 115671, \$1,198.52 from the Board of Equalization (BOE) Budget for PC and Monitor for County Clerk

Cori Beattie, Deputy County Clerk, said the request is to replace a surplus computer that is at least 10 years old that is used for Board of Equalization duties. She added there is money in the BOE budget to cover the expense.

MOTION: Raybould moved and Amundson seconded approval of the request. Amundson, Raybould, Smoyer, Schorr and Hudkins voted aye. Motion carried 5-0.

Raybould exited the meeting at 9:51 a.m.

Hudkins said they discussed the time line for renovation of the 605 Building (former jail facility).

C. Meeting with Mayor - Hudkins, Schorr

Hudkins and Schorr reported there was discussion of the proposed City half cent sales tax, a proposal regarding the Railroad Transportation Safety District (RTSD) and funding for that component of the South Beltway project.

D. Public Building Commission (PBC) - Hudkins, Raybould

Raybould said they discussed the bid/construction schedule for renovation of the 605 Building and approved prohibiting the use of e-cigarettes and related devices on PBC and City/County grounds and facilities. She said that led to discussion of complaints regarding the designated employee smoking area at the west end of the parking facility directly beneath the County/City Building.

Don – I respectfully propose the following lease rates:

First Level - \$10/sq ft. I believe this rate is consistent with the rate Ruth Henrichs quoted to the Board last year as the maximum rate we felt we could pay for the space. For these programs to be self sustaining, we need manage the expenses as tightly as possible.

Lower Level – Our use of the lower level looks like it will be initially limited to the large conference room as the programs are still very fluid in their design. Until we have a better understanding of each program's capacity and resulting resource needs, we do not want to over commit with respect to space.

Also, cell phone reception in the lower level is problematic which impacts our ability to use those offices on a regular basis. A large part of our services in Lincoln are "community based" services and as such, those direct service providers operate primarily via cell phone. The "spotty" cell phone service in the lower level makes it difficult to consistently "house" workers in the lower level. As such, I'm proposing Lancaster County forego any rental rate for infrequent use of the lower level space.

However, if we find that program needs necessitate us using some of the lower level offices on a consistent basis, we would look to lease those spaces for \$6/sq. ft.

Let me know if the aforementioned proposal is acceptable to Lancaster County.

Weekly Update on the 2014 Legislature

Please accept this as the twelfth of your weekly reports for the 2014 Legislative Session. Today is day 59 of the legislative session, meaning there are only 2 days remaining in the 2014 session. Today will be focused on an override of Senator Bolz's LB690, Final Reading on several measures and some legislative resolutions. They will return next Thursday to do more Final Reading and to override any vetoes that may occur on legislation that passes today.

2014 Lancaster County Legislative Priorities:

- 1. Oppose Elimination of the Inheritance Tax: As mentioned in previous reports, two measures eliminating the inheritance tax have been introduced. Senator Tom Hansen introduced LB 812, which would terminate the inheritance tax for those dying after December 31, 2015. In addition, Senator Tom Carlson introduced LB 960 which would make two changes to rates of inheritance tax cutting, approximately, in half those in categories two and three (from 13% to 7% category 2 and from 18% to 9% those in category 3). The board has taken a position of opposition to both of these measures. Neither bill moved from committee this session and both will die on a procedural motion next Thursday.
- 2. Support Medicaid Expansion under the Affordable Care Act: Debate over LB 887 stretched over two days. Senator Kathy Campbell, the sponsor of the bill, brought a motion for cloture, which would have ended the filibuster and allowed a vote on the underlying legislation. The cloture motion failed, 27-21, with one senator not voting. Proponents needed 33 votes to advance the legislation. The bill will die on a procedural motion next Thursday.
- 3. Monitor the Implementation of 2013 Neb. Laws LB561: LB 464 was amended, and advanced to Final Reading on Monday morning. On Monday, an amendment eliminating the inclusion of services to persons between ages 18 and 21, which attached Senator Brasch's LB 1093 and staggered the implementation of the shift to juvenile courts was attached to this legislation. The bill along with its A-Bill passed last evening.

- 4. Eliminate the Responsibility of Counties to Pay HHS Rent LB632: The bill remains with the Government Committee. An attempt was made to advance the measure but there were not sufficient votes to advance the bill. We believe that the measure will remain in Committee for the duration of this legislative session. The bill will die on a procedural motion next Thursday.
- 5. Monitor Adult Corrections Reform. Senator Ashford offered an amendment this past week to LB907. The amendment re-wrote sections of LB907 such that the amendment did as follows: It allows the Commission on Public Advocacy to determine areas of legal shortages, instead of the Legal Education for Public Service and Rural Practice Loan Repayment Assistance Board as originally designated. The board can still make recommendations to the Commission on areas of shortage, however. Age of attorneys in an area is longer a consideration, capacity is substituted. The Nebraska Justice Reinvestment Working Group will now expressly not have the authority to allocate funds or make policy decisions for state agencies. It allows Working Group to form subcommittees. The language was tweaked so that the appointments to the working group shall be comprised of four members selected by the Governor, four members selected by the Speaker of the Legislature, four members selected by the Chief Justice of the Supreme Court, and four representatives of local governments selected jointly by the Governor, the Speaker of the Legislature, and the Chief Justice. The Governor, Speaker of the Legislature, and Chief Justice shall serve as co-chairpersons of the working group.

LB 999 was also advanced to Final Reading. The amended version of LB 999 would create the a Correctional Mental Health Facility at the Hastings Regional Center, to be administered by the Department of Health and Human Services, to meet the long-term needs of mentally ill inmates in the correctional system and to provide alcohol and drug treatment for inmates who have drug or alcohol addictions. The Facility will have house approximately two hundred inmates.

2014 Other Legislation:

LB215 (Schilz) Change provisions relating to use of the County Visitors Promotion Fund. *This bill was approved by the Governor.*

POSITION: Support as amended.

6. LB925 (Coash) Provide for transfer of motor vehicle registration duties to county treasurers. This is Treasurer Stebbings bill that would authorize counties to opt out of the DMV's motor vehicle registration program.

POSITION: Support. Hearing was held on February 24, 2014 before the Transportation and Telecommunications Committee. The bill has not advanced. Last week, we provided a copy of the letter that Senator Coash sent to Rhonda Lamb, the Director of the DMV, asking that the forthcoming RFI includes the options that Treasurer Stebbing desires. The funding for that RFI was vetoed in the mainline budget adjustments but that veto was subsequently overridden by the Legislature. LB925 will die on a procedural motion next Thursday.



LB885 (Harr) Require the use of the income approach to value certain real property for tax purposes. Introduced by Senator Burke Harr of Omaha, he indicated that this came out of some concerns he heard about practices in Lancaster County. There has been communication from County Assessor Agena and Senator Harr's office. Those in support of this bill include the Realtors, Developers, LIBA and others. This is something that according to supporters is being done to address a difference in how Lancaster County is valuing property versus how the other 92 counties are.

POSITION: Monitor. LB885 was attached to LB 191 via AM2602 adopted on March 25, 2014. An amendment was adopted on Tuesday that placed the severability clause on the bill. The bill will be read on Final Reading today.

LB1092 (Dubas) Authorize issuance of highway construction bonds. This bill would authorize the issuance of bonds under the Nebraska Highway Bond Act, not to exceed \$400m in principal and \$30m in annual debt service for a period of not more than nineteen years, in order to accelerate completion of the highway construction projects identified and to be identified for funding under the Build Nebraska Act. The bonds will be issued on the recommendation of the Department of Roads/. At least 25% of the proceeds the bonds will be used for construction of the expressway system and federally designated high priority corridors as determined by NDOR. The remaining proceeds will be used to pay for surface transportation projects of the highest priority as determined by NDOR. The bonds will be paid off by June 30, 2033. The bonds will be exempt from state income tax. The proceeds from the sale of the bonds will be deposited in the Highway Cash Fund for use pursuant to the Build Nebraska Act. If these bonds are issued, all motor vehicle fuel taxes, diesel fuel taxes, compressed fuel taxes, and alternative fuel fees related to highway use, motor vehicle registration fees, and other highway-user taxes which are collected by the state in the Highway Trust Fund are irrevocably pledged for the terms of the bonds issued after July 1, 2014, to the payment of the principal, interest, and redemption premium, if any, of these bonds as they mature and become due at maturity or prior redemption and for any reserves for such bonds. An amendment was offered at the hearing to transition the committed funds from the Highway Trust Fund to the Highway Cash Fund.

POSITION: Support. As previously reported, the bill was debated at General File and cloture invoked. The bill was debated on Select File this week and advanced to Final Reading with only 27 votes. It will be on Final Reading later today.

LB734 (Schumacher) Provide for deposit of public funds with credit unions. Allows for public funds to be deposited in qualifying state and federally chartered credit unions, as well as banks. The hearing on this measure was held in late January. The proponents are trying to move the bill out of committee but have not been successful yet.

POSITION: Support.

LB994 (Health & Human Services Committee) Change fees as prescribed for vital statistics. *Increases the amount that can be charged by Vital Statistics by \$5 per copy for a marriage*



certificate. Dan Nolte forwarded a request to include county fees as well. Larry Dix and I visited with Senator Campbell's office before the hearing and Corrie presented an amendment increasing the fee by \$5

POSITION: Support as amended noted above. Senator Campbell stated that she would prefer that the bill move forward unamended. She has committed to bringing a bill that would raise the fees next year. The bill was passed on Final Reading late last evening.

LB661 (Krist) Provide for voter registration on the Secretary of State's website and use of Department of Motor Vehicle records. Modifies the Election Act (Ch. 32) to required that the Secretary of State, along with the Department of Motor Vehicles develop and implement a registration application process which may be used statewide to register to vote and update voter registration records electronically using the Secretary of State's web site, by July 2015. An applicant who has a valid Nebraska motor vehicle operator's license or state identification card may use the application process to register to vote or to update his or her voter registration record with changes in his or her personal information or other information related to his or her eligibility to vote.

POSITION: Monitor. The bill was signed by the Governor.

LB870 (Bolz) Adopt the Public Debt Recovery Program Act. This bill would enact the Public Debt Recovery Program, which will be administered by the State Treasurer. The Program will create a set off of any public debt which is assigned to the program against a debtor's income tax refund, state lottery prize, state pay, state contract payment, unclaimed property, any other state payment due to a debtor. Public debt is defined within the statute as any liquidated amount due and owing any claimant which has accrued through assignment, contract, subrogation, court judgment, or operation of law, regardless of whether there is an outstanding judgment for such amount. The bill specifically excludes any debts owed to the University of Nebraska or the state colleges, amounts for child support, or delinquent property taxes. Each state agency, court, and political subdivision may assign a public debt of more than fifty dollars to the public debt recovery program, but only after making two attempts to notify the debtor, and the passage of 90 days. The State Treasurer can pay such amounts, and then determine if the debtor is entitled to any income tax refund, state lottery prize, state pay, state contract payment, unclaimed property, or other state payment. If so, the Treasurer will then send written notification to the debtor of an assertion of the rights under the Public Debt Recovery Program Act to all or a portion of the refund or payment. A debtor can contest the amount or validity of the set off, by making a hearing request to the State Treasurer within the prescribed period. After certification of the debt by the Treasurer, they will notify the Department of Administrative Services, which will deduct an amount up to the certified debt amount from the income tax refund, state lottery prize, state pay, state contract payment, unclaimed property, or other state payment due the debtor and transfer such amount to the Public Debt Recovery Program Fund. The State Treasurer will then notify the debtor of the completion of the setoff.

This bill also creates a Public Debt Recovery Program Fund. The bill appropriates to the fund \$500,00 from the State Settlement Fund in fiscal years 2014-15 and 2015-16 and an amount equal to the cost and ongoing maintenance expense to interface with the JUSTICE System from the Supreme Court Automation Fund. The remaining funding for the Public Debt Recovery Program will be through General



Funds until the program is self-sustaining through fees. At the end of any fiscal year, if the revenue in the fund from recovery fees exceeds 200% of the administrative cost of the public debt recovery program for that fiscal year, the State Treasurer must distribute an amount to each claimant equal to the portion of such excess amount determined by calculating the claimant's percentage of the total recoveries during the fiscal year and multiplying that percentage by the excess amount.

Lastly, the bill allows the Tax Commissioner to transmit information to State Treasurer for purposes of this act, without fear of criminal sanction.

POSITION: Support in concept. The commissioners submitted a letter in support of the bill with some potential changes to the bill. The bill has not yet advanced from the Committee. It is not likely to be debated this year. The bill will die on a procedural motion next Thursday.

LB881 (Watermeier) Change provisions relating to death, injury, or property damage to innocent third parties as a result of a police vehicular pursuit. This legislation would amend NERS 13-911, which is a portion of the Political Subdivisions Tort Claims Act, and NERS 81-8,215.01, which is a portion of the State Tort Claims Act. The bill explicitly disallows a passenger in or on the fleeing vehicle from being considered an innocent third party if the passenger:(a) Enters into the vehicle without coercion knowing, or with a reasonable belief, that the driver of the vehicle is under the influence of alcoholic liquor or drugs; (b) Fails to take reasonable steps to persuade the driver of the fleeing vehicle to stop the vehicle; (c) Promotes, provokes, or persuades the driver to engage in flight from law enforcement personnel; (d) Is subject to arrest or sought to be apprehended by law enforcement personnel; or (e) Is engaged in any illegal activity which would itself give rise to an arrest. Note importantly, in case of death, injury, or property damage to any innocent third party proximately caused by the action of a law enforcement officer employed by a political subdivision or the state during vehicular pursuit, damages shall be paid to such third party by the political subdivision state employing the officer, per these statutes.

POSITION: Monitor. The bill remains in Committee. The bill will die on a procedural motion next Thursday.

LBI094 (Davis) Change a fund transfer to the Property Tax Credit Cash Fund. This bill would amend 2013, LBI99, 2 section 7; to provide that the State Treasurer shall transfer \$138 million from the General Fund to the Property Tax Credit Cash Fund on or before December 15, 2014. Presently, the statute requires the Treasurer to transfer \$113 million. The bill remains in Committee.

LB1086 (Pirsch) Transfer cash reserve funds to the Property Tax Credit Cash Fund. This bill would amend NERS 84-612, to instruct the State Treasurer to transfer \$115 million dollars from the Cash Reserve Fund to the Property Tax Credit Cash Fund on or before December 15, 2014, and on or before December 15, 2015, on such date as directed by the budget administrator of the budget division of the Department of Administrative Services. The bill remains in Committee.



LB669 (McCoy) Transfer cash reserve funds to the Property Tax Credit Cash Fund. This bill would amend the Cash Reserve Fund (NERS 84-612), by requiring the State Treasurer to transfer \$85 million from the Cash Reserve Fund to the Property Tax Credit Cash Fund by the end of 2014.

POSITION: Monitor. The budget was finalized on March 24, 2014 and sent to the Governor on the same date. The Governor returned LB905 with \$65 Million in line-item reductions with a request that they utilize a portion of that to put more money in property tax relief. The Legislature overrode \$61 Million in vetoes – including more than \$7 Million in contingency funds at the Supreme Court for purposes of implementing LB561. The bills listed above will die on procedural motions next Thursday.
