Advance public notice of the Board of Commissioners Staff Meeting was posted on the County-City Building bulletin board and the Lancaster County, Nebraska, web site and provided to the media on April 23, 2014.

The Chair noted the location of the Open Meetings Act and opened the meeting at 8:30 a.m.

AGENDA ITEM

1 APPROVAL OF THE MINUTES OF THE APRIL 17, 2014 STAFF MEETING

MOTION: Amundson moved and Raybould seconded approval of the minutes of the April 17, 2014 Staff Meeting. Amundson, Raybould and Hudkins voted aye. Smoyer and Schorr were absent from voting. Motion carried 3-0.

2 ADDITIONS TO AGENDA

A. Protest of an Amusement License for an Event at Bluestem Vineyard (Exhibit A)

MOTION: Raybould moved and Amundson seconded approval of the addition to the agenda. Raybould, Amundson and Hudkins voted aye. Smoyer and Schorr were absent from voting. Motion carried 3-0.

Smoyer arrived at the meeting at 8:32 a.m.

3 LEGISLATIVE UPDATE - Gordon Kissel and Joe Kohout, Kissel/E&S Associates (Legislative Consultants)

Joe Kohout, Kissel/E&S Associates, presented a legislative update, noting bills that relate to the County's legislative priorities and other legislation of potential interest to the County (Exhibits B and C). He noted two interim studies will address unfunded mandates: 1) Legislative Resolution (LR) 544 (Interim study to examine the fiscal impacts of unfunded mandates); and 2) LR 582 (Interim study to review the work of the Task Force on Unfunded Mandates created in 1996 and to study the impacts of unfunded and underfunded mandates on counties and county governments). Raybould asked that the Board be notified when any hearings will be held. Kohout noted Legislative Bill (LB) 632 (Change funding for county offices relating to public assistance programs) was unsuccessful this session and suggested the County pursue a different option. He said Kissel/E&S Associates will continue to monitor the implementation of juvenile justice reform and adult correctional reform. Hudkins said the County has expended more than \$100,000 on office space for the 42 new juvenile probation officers that resulted from the 2013 Session's LB 561, which changed provisions and transferred responsibilities regarding the juvenile justice system, and has only received \$50,000 from the State to assist with those costs. He said the 2014 Session's LB 1093 (Change provisions relating to juvenile facilitated conferencing and funding) was intended to authorize more funds and asked when the County can expect those funds. Kohout said there were Appropriation (A) Bills attached to the bill and some components will not go into effect until next budget year.

ACTION ITEMS

A. Payment of \$750 from Pension Expense Account to Prudential for Plan Amendment

MOTION: Amundson moved and Smoyer seconded approval. Smoyer, Amundson, Raybould and Hudkins voted aye. Schorr was absent from voting.

Motion carried 4-0.

ADMINISTRATIVE OFFICER REPORT

A. Nebraska Association of County Officials (NACO) Benefit Services Meetings

Item was held.

B. County Board Meeting on Veterans Day (Tuesday, November 11, 2014)

There was consensus to cancel the meeting.

C. Informal County Board/City Council Meetings

Amundson suggested the County Board hold informal meetings with the City Council (two County Board members and three City Council members) on a monthly basis to discuss items of mutual interest. She said she also presented her suggestion to Carl Eskridge, City Council Chair.

Board members concurred with the suggestion.

MONTHLY MEETING WITH LANCASTER COUNTY AGRICULTURAL SOCIETY - Amy Dickerson, Lancaster Event Center Managing Director; Jim Swanson, Vice President, Lancaster Agricultural Society Board; Kendra Ronnau and Tom Messick, Members of the Lancaster Agricultural Society Board; Alan Wood, Lancaster Agricultural Society Board Counsel

Amy Dickerson, Lancaster Event Center Managing Director, gave an update on the Lancaster Event Center, noting the following (Exhibit D):

- Support from Community Leaders
- Meetings with Key Event Promoters
- Major Upcoming Events
- New Events Negotiating Contracts
- Aging and Insufficient Equipment Makes it Difficult to Service and Prepare for Events
- Efforts to Strengthen Operations and Financials

Dickerson said she has a number of security concerns. She said keys have been handed out to event promoters over the years and felt the facility should be re-keyed. Hudkins suggested Dickerson talk to Pam Dingman, County Engineer, as she recently had code locks installed on County maintenance shop buildings. The locks identify who is accessing the building and the time.

Dickerson also discussed revenues and said she believes the pricing has been too low.

Dickerson asked the Board to contact her if they become aware of lightly used equipment or furniture that the Event Center might be able to use. Hudkins suggested Dickerson contact Mike Thurber, Corrections Director, as the kitchen in the former jail facility is being closed and there may be surplus kitchen equipment. Pershing Auditorium was also mentioned as a possible source for surplus cleaning equipment.

Alan Wood, Lancaster Agricultural Society Board Counsel, said Legislative Bill (LB) 597 changed provisions relating to county agricultural societies and will allow them to sell real estate without having to use the proceeds to buy other real estate for fairgrounds purposes. **NOTE:** Any sale of real estate would have to be approved by the County Board. He said the bill also clarifies that the capital construction, renovation, and repair levy can be used for machinery.

Wood said the team that had worked on the commercial corner at North 84th Street and Havelock Avenue has regrouped and met with representatives of the Planning Department and City Public Works & Utilities to revisit the issues. A design charette is also planned with the architects and engineers. He said they have received an estimate on the cost of street improvements (widening Havelock Avenue to three lanes, right hand turn lanes, and deceleration lanes on North 84th Street) noting those improvements were not included the City's Capital Improvement Program (CIP). Wood said the signal light at that corner is also a problem and felt it should be controlled by traffic volume. Hudkins said the Board has apprised the Mayor of the need for the improvements. Wood also indicated plans to meet with the County Engineer and Public Works & Utilities to discuss North 98th Street. He said a lot of the Event Center patrons use North 98th Street instead of North 84th Street for easier accessibility and the street is "taking a real beating." Wood noted plans to hold the Iowa-Nebraska Power Farming Show at the Event Center in December and said the width restrictions on North 84th Street make it difficult for heavy equipment to use that road to access the facility.

Kendra Ronnau, Lancaster Agricultural Society Board Member, gave an overview of plans for the Lancaster County Fair (July 31-August 9).

ADMINISTRATIVE OFFICER REPORT

D. Management Team Meeting Agenda Items (Thursday, May 8, 2014)

The following items were suggested: 1) Request input from the Management Team on the policy to prohibit smoking and the use electronic cigarettes in all buildings, offices, vehicles and equipment owned or leased by the County and whether there should be further restriction of designated smoking areas; 2) Employee wellness initiatives; 3) Budgets; and 4) Roundtable discussion.

E. Request from Windrow Energies for a Resolution Supporting Community Based Energy Development (CBED)

There was consensus to request more information from Windrow Energies on the process used to obtain Cass County's support for a resolution.

5 SOUTH BELTWAY INTERLOCAL AGREEMENT - Roger Figard, City Engineer; Thomas Shafer, Design/Construction Manager, City Public Works & Utilities; Rick Hoppe, Administrative Assistant to the Mayor

Roger Figard, City Engineer, said the City has \$16,600,000 in additional federal aid monies to spend on roads, however there are limitations on use of those funds and a deadline for spending (see Exhibit E). Rick Hoppe, Administrative Assistant to the Mayor, noted that \$6,000,000 of that amount is savings realized from the Antelope Valley Project. The remaining \$10,600,000 is the City's regular federal allotment (\$5,300,000 a year, over a biennium).

Figard said projects need to be ready to go to construction (environmental document prepared, engineering work completed, right-of-way purchased) before the funds can be obligated. He said the City cannot meet federal deadlines to use the funds for its highest priority projects: 1) New construction and rehab projects (Yankee Hill (South 70th Street to South 91st Street), Pine Lake Road, West A Street, South 56th Street, Northwest 48th Street) and economic development projects (Rokeby, South 40th Street and North 98th Street); 2) South Beltway Project; and 3) Operational needs such as traffic signals, lane striping, etc. Figard said the City received additional funding (stimulus funds and a federal appropriation) in 2010, 2011 and 2012 that was obligated for projects that were ready to go to construction.

Smoyer asked whether the funds could be used for improvements on North 84th Street and Havelock Avenue as much of the right-of-way has been acquired. Figard said the environmental document has not been completed.

Raybould asked whether the funds could be used for sidewalk repairs. Figard said sidewalks also require environmental documentation. Thomas Shafer, Design/Construction Manager, City Public Works & Utilities, said every location must be studied for environmental impact and environmental justice for low income or minority populations. Figard said if federal aid dollars are used to make a repair to a sidewalk the City could be required to make the entire sidewalk Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA) compliant.

Figard said the City explored possible solutions (see Exhibit E) and decided to shift its spending authority to the Nebraska Department of Roads (NDOR) for Interstate-80 reconstruction and coordination with the City's Northwest 48th Street project. In turn, the State will give the City a \$16,600,000 credit for the City's share of the South

Beltway Project. Shafer assured the Board that none of the street projects will be slowed down as a result of the agreement, rather the City will fund the projects and pay itself back with future federal funding.

NOTE: The City Council and County Board are scheduled to take action on the supplemental agreement between the City of Lincoln, Lancaster County and the State of Nebraska, Department of Roads for funding of the Lincoln South Beltway at their meetings on April 28th and 29th, respectively.

6 PAYOFF OF BROWNIE MANUFACTURING INDUSTRIAL DEVELOPMENT REVENUE BONDS - Brittany Behrens, Deputy County Attorney; Gary Lebens, Assistant Treasurer, Valmont Industries Inc.; Christopher Heinrich, Attorney, Harding & Shultz Law Firm

Gary Lebens, Assistant Treasurer, Valmont Industries, Inc., explained the County's tax records still show Brownie Manufacturing Company, Inc. as the owner of property in Waverly although Valmont has been paying the taxes. He said the Brownie Manufacturing's Industrial Development Revenue Bonds were repaid in 2007 and Valmont's attorneys have been working with the Register of Deed's Office to have the title of the property changed to Valmont Industries.

Brittany Behrens, Deputy County Attorney, said Valmont Industries became a successor-in-interest to Brownie Manufacturing's lease agreements with the County. Documentation has been received that the bonds have been paid in full and a lease termination agreement and a quitclaim deed for the property will be scheduled on the April 29th County Board of Commissioners Meeting agenda.

ADDITIONS TO AGENDA

A. Protest of an Amusement License for an Event at Bluestem Vineyard (Exhibit A)

Amundson said she was contacted by a constituent who wants the County Board to revisit the issue of an amusement license for an event at Bluestem Vineyard, 5895 West Sprague Road, on August 22, 2014. **NOTE:** The Board approved an amusement license renewal application from Event King, LLC, for the event at the March 25, 2014 County Board of Commissioners Meeting. She said the constituent felt the Board was not aware of concerns related to the event that was held last year and said neighbors were not aware renewal of the amusement license had been scheduled on the County Board of Commissioners' agenda. The Chair pointed out that the agenda is made public.

Raybould noted neighbors were apprised at the public hearing held last year that the Board would revisit the matter if there were complaints.

Cori Beattie, Deputy County Clerk, said neither the County Clerk's Office or, to her knowledge, the County Sheriff's Office received any complaints regarding last year's event. She said a public hearing was not required this year because it was a renewal but those with concerns would have been given an opportunity to speak if they had attended the meeting. Beattie said she discussed the matter with Brittany Behrens, Deputy County Attorney, and Behrens indicated she wasn't aware of any appeal process.

Smoyer questioned whether the Board could vote to reconsider the item. Hudkins said that action would have had to have taken place at the next meeting (April 1) and that time has passed.

MOTION: Raybould moved and Smoyer seconded to forward the neighbors' concerns and comments to those organizing the event and ask them to respond on how they will be addressed for this year's event.

Behrens appeared and explained the organizing event has no legal obligation to provide that information.

ROLL CALL: Raybould, Smoyer, Amundson and Hudkins voted aye. Schorr was absent from voting. Motion carried 4-0.

7 SCREENING SPECIALIST FOR PRE-ADJUDICATED YOUTH - Kit Boesch, Human Services Administrator; Sara Hoyle, Juvenile Justice Coordinator

Kit Boesch, Human Services Administrator, said the County has new responsibilities as a result of the 2013 Session's LB 464, which changed provisions relating to the juvenile justice system, arraignment, court jurisdiction, services for juveniles and families, and truancy, and requested authorization to hire a pre-adjudicated screening specialist. She said there are already funds in the budget for the position.

Sara Hoyle, Juvenile Justice Coordinator, said the funding will be through a combination of community aid dollars and general funds that were previously allocated to Juvenile Probation for pre-disposition costs. The State is now picking up that cost.

In response to a question from Kerry Eagan, Chief Administrative Officer, Doug McDaniel, Lincoln-Lancaster County Human Resources Director, appeared and the position of screening specialist exists in the classified system.

Sheli Schindler, Youth Services Center (YSC) Director, appeared and said it could be a temporary position and felt the classification could be modified as it evolves. She said they are trying to see how the position could complement YSC staff so the screening can be available 24-hour/7-days per week.

MOTION: Amundson moved and Smoyer seconded to proceed with the preadjudicated screening specialist position. Amundson, Smoyer, Raybould and Hudkins voted aye. Schorr was absent from voting. Motion carried 4-0.

POTENTIAL LITIGATION - Norm Agena, County Assessor/Register of Deeds; Rob Ogden, Chief Field Deputy Assessor/Register of Deeds; John Watson and Richard Grabow, Deputy County Attorneys

MOTION: Smoyer moved and Raybould seconded to enter Executive Session at 10:31 a.m. for the purpose of protecting the public interest with regards to potential litigation.

The Chair restated the motion for the record.

ROLL CALL: Raybould, Smoyer, Amundson and Hudkins voted aye. Schorr was absent from voting. Motion carried 4-0.

Raybould exited the meeting.

MOTION: Smoyer moved and Amundson seconded to exit Executive Session at 11:18 a.m. Smoyer, Amundson and Hudkins voted aye. Raybould and Schorr were absent from voting. Motion carried 3-0.

Subject: Protest of special amusement license for Blustem vineyards.

This is to protest the granting of a special amusement license to Bluestem Vineyards at the March 25 County Commission meeting for an event on August 22, 2014. I and my wife own a property directly across the read from the area. We, and several other neighbors, live within 500 feet, and so should have been informed of the application. We were not.

The minutes state that last year there were no complaints. This is nonsense. Last year, the event was a major disruption on our lives. Here is the summary of what we noted at the time.

How Bluestem violated their permit

(1) Parking: at the hearing last year, they claimed they could park 1200 cars in the specified area. We said fewer than 1000. My estimates (which we included in our letter to them) were that a surface lot of that area would fit about 860. In fact they had somewhere between 400 and 500 cars parked in the lot at maximum capacity. I'll know an exact number when I check the photographs. So the parking they laid out in the permit application was totally inadequate, as we predicted.

Two weeks prior to the even, they rented three separate lots north of West Sprague, one nw. of 61st and W. Sprague, one further NW, under the power lines. The majority of the cars parked for the event were parked in those two lots. As a result, the late-arriving crowd were all parked north of W. Sprague Road(I estimate the south lot filled up around 7). These later arrivals were by my observation almost all kids. So the majority of concert goers had to cross W. Sprague Road, in twilight or darkness, across two lanes of heavy traffic.

There were sheriff's deputies present, doing a good job under adverse circumstances, but it was pretty hair-raising (I have lots of still photos). Some of the kids naturally weren't waiting for the police; they were just running across. They were one inattentive driver away from a tragedy. I have pictures.

I submit there is no way the permit would have been granted if they had proposed this parking.

(2) Exiting traffic: there were not two (as specified in the application) but five separate streams of traffic exiting onto W. Sprague Road from 11:30 p.m. to 12:30 a.m. and likely much later (I went to bed). There was at least one minor accident as a car exiting from the main Bluestem entrance hit one already on W. Sprague Road. In addition, some cars and particularly trucks in the north lots got impatient and simply drove over the ditch and out into the road. There were also large numbers of young kids (some apparently drunk) exiting as pedestrians from Bluestem, screaming and yelling and attempting to get across two-way traffic to the

State Rec. Area. People were doing U turns, making partial turns and then stopping, etc. It was chaos, and I have a lot of it on video.

Again, this is in complete contrast to the two-exit scheme they proposed in the permit.

- (3) Confinement. In the permit, they claimed guests would be confined to a fenced area around the stage and they parking area. Instead, they sold a huge amount of 'VIP parking', and let those people park on the E. side of the property all the way to SW 58th St, and wander around. The fence is down on SW 58th, but fortunately it's protected by an expanse of heavy brush and poison ivy. Those people were screaming and hollering after midnight right outside our front drive. You can see fruit trees they've hit with their vehicles. They were within 50 feet of my front entrance.
- (4) Bluestem sold RV parking within their property for \$20 a pop (I have a still photo). Again, this breaches the covenant, violates the zoning and was not mentioned in the permit. So now we live next to a trailer park. Lovely.
- (5) Even though in the permit application they said parking would be free, they charged for it. I have a photo of a young woman collecting the \$2. I have screen shots of the web ads, and I have notes I took on hearing it mentioned on Froggy98.
- (6) Nuisance: The concert was, as predicted, noisy. I could hear every word of every announcement and song from my front step. With all the windows closed, the bass was reverberating through the house. I'm still processing the sound measurements, but they peaked in the mid-60s dBa. Down the street, outside Don's house, it sounded even louder.

While there was no illegal parking on the road that I could see - they did get the no parking signs up -- there were many people heading down SW 58th either very fast (> 50 m.p.h.), or occasionally, very slowly, stopping intermittently. I bought myself a high power LED flashlight and got several of these to move by shining it on their back license plate; I have videotape of both speeders and stoppers. One guy tried to pull into our driveway (there was a chain across it).

Even with all this, the concert didn't sell out (whatever that means). It could have been worse.

So, i guess, from my perspective, the concert flooded our house with noise intermittently from the time of the sound-check at 9:54 a.m. in the morning, to when Currington finished without an encore at 11:35 p.m.. There was no property damage, but a lot of disruption, and I think serious public safety concerns, largely brought about by their doing things they said they wouldn't do in their permit application.

We heard from attendees that there were bottles thrown at the stage.

None of this information was pointed out the meeting. We therefore request they be instructed to resubmit their application with the proper notification of neighbors.

Final Update on the 2014 Legislature

Please accept this as your final update on the Nebraska Legislature for 2014. As you are undoubtedly aware, the Legislature adjourned sine die on April 17, 2014. They will not reconvene in regular session until January 7, 2015.

It is important to note that we will begin a new biennial legislative session in 2015. The implications of this are twofold. First, all pending legislation has been dismissed on a procedural motion on the final day of the legislative session. Also, on the first day of the next session in January 2015, the Legislature will determine new Officers, Committee Chairpersons, and Committee assignments. As of the drafting of this report, only two individuals have announced their intentions for the 2015 session. Senator Colby Coash has announced his intent to seek the Speakership, and Senator Dave Bloomfield intends to seek the Chair of the Executive Board.

The coming elections will bring many new faces to the Legislature. As a result of term limits, 17 of 49 current Senators are not eligible for reelection.

2014 Lancaster County Legislative Priorities:

1. **Oppose Elimination of the Inheritance Tax:** Two measures eliminating the inheritance tax were introduced. Senator Tom Hansen introduced LB 812, which would have terminated the inheritance tax for those dying after December 31, 2015. In addition, Senator Tom Carlson introduced LB 960 which would have made two changes to rates of inheritance tax – cutting, approximately, in half those in categories two and three (from 13% to 7% category 2 and from 18% to 9% those in category 3). The board took a position of opposition to both of these measures.

- Neither bill moved from committee this session and both were dismissed on a procedural motion on the final day of the legislative session.
- 2. Support Medicaid Expansion under the Affordable Care Act: Debate over LB 887 stretched over two days. Senator Kathy Campbell, the sponsor of the bill, brought a motion for cloture, which would have ended the filibuster and allowed a vote on the underlying legislation. The cloture motion failed, 27-21, with one senator not voting. Proponents needed 33 votes to advance the legislation. This bill was also dismissed via procedural motion, along with all other pending legislation, on the final day of the session.
- 3. **Monitor the Implementation of 2013 Neb. Laws LB561:** An amendment eliminating the inclusion of services to persons between ages 18 and 21, which attached Senator Brasch's LB 1093 and staggered the implementation of the shift to juvenile courts was attached to this legislation. The bill along with its A-Bill were passed without opposition, and signed into law by the Governor.
- 4. Eliminate the Responsibility of Counties to Pay HHS Rent LB632: The bill died in the Government Committee. An attempt was made to advance the measure but there were not sufficient votes to advance the bill. The bill was dismissed via the same procedural motion on the final day.
- 5. Monitor Adult Corrections Reform. Senator Ashford introduced LB907 dealing with corrections reform, and later amended the bill. The amendment rewrote sections of LB907 such that the bill: Allows the Commission on Public Advocacy to determine areas of legal shortages, instead of the Legal Education for Public Service and Rural Practice Loan Repayment Assistance Board as originally designated. The board can still make recommendations to the Commission on areas of shortage, however. Age of attorneys in an area is longer a consideration, capacity is substituted. The Nebraska Justice Reinvestment Working Group will now expressly not have the authority to allocate funds or make policy decisions for state agencies. It allows Working Group to form subcommittees. The language was tweaked so that the appointments to the working group shall be comprised of four members selected by the Governor, four members selected by the Speaker of the Legislature, four members selected by the Chief Justice of the Supreme Court, and four representatives of local governments selected jointly by the Governor, the Speaker of the Legislature, and the Chief Justice. The Governor, Speaker of the Legislature, and Chief Justice shall serve as co-chairpersons of the working group. This bill passed with an emergency clause and without opposition, and later signed into law by the Governor.

The amended version of LB 999 creates a Correctional Mental Health Facility at the Hastings Regional Center, to be administered by the Department of Health and Human Services, to meet the long-term needs of mentally ill inmates in the correctional system and to provide alcohol and drug treatment for inmates who have drug or alcohol addictions. The Facility will house approximately two hundred inmates. This bill passed without opposition, and was signed into law by Governor Heineman.

2014 Other Legislation:



LB215 (Schilz) Change provisions relating to use of the County Visitors Promotion Fund.

POSITION: Support as amended. This bill was signed into law by the Governor in February 2014.

LB925 (Coash) Provide for transfer of motor vehicle registration duties to county treasurers. This is Treasurer Stebbings bill that would authorize counties to opt out of the DMV's motor vehicle registration program.

POSITION: Support. Hearing was held on February 24, 2014 before the Transportation and Telecommunications Committee. We provided a copy of the letter that Senator Coash sent to Rhonda Lamb, the Director of the DMV, asking that the forthcoming RFI include the options that Treasurer Stebbing desires. The funding for that RFI was vetoed in the mainline budget adjustments but that veto was subsequently overridden by the Legislature. LB925 was dismissed on the same mass procedural motinon.

LB885 (Harr) Require the use of the income approach to value certain real property for tax purposes. Introduced by Senator Burke Harr of Omaha, he indicated that this came out of some concerns he heard about practices in Lancaster County. There has been communication from County Assessor Agena and Senator Harr's office. Those in support of this bill include the Realtors, Developers, LIBA and others. This is something that according to supporters is being done to address a difference in how Lancaster County is valuing property versus how the other 92 counties are.

POSITION: Monitor. LB885 was attached to LB 191 via AM2602 adopted on March 25, 2014. An amendment was adopted that placed a severability clause on the bill. LB 191 passed without opposition on April 10, and signed into law by Governor Heineman.

LB1092 (Dubas) Authorize issuance of highway construction bonds. This bill would authorize the issuance of bonds under the Nebraska Highway Bond Act, not to exceed \$400m in principal and \$30m in annual debt service for a period of not more than nineteen years, in order to accelerate completion of the highway construction projects identified and to be identified for funding under the Build Nebraska Act. The bonds will be issued on the recommendation of the Department of Roads/. At least 25% of the proceeds the bonds will be used for construction of the expressway system and federally designated high priority corridors as determined by NDOR. The remaining proceeds will be used to pay for surface transportation projects of the highest priority as determined by NDOR. The bonds will be paid off by June 30, 2033. The bonds will be exempt from state income tax. The proceeds from the sale of the bonds will be deposited in the Highway Cash Fund for use pursuant to the Build Nebraska Act. If these bonds are issued, all motor



vehicle fuel taxes, diesel fuel taxes, compressed fuel taxes, and alternative fuel fees related to highway use, motor vehicle registration fees, and other highway-user taxes which are collected by the state in the Highway Trust Fund are irrevocably pledged for the terms of the bonds issued after July 1, 2014, to the payment of the principal, interest, and redemption premium, if any, of these bonds as they mature and become due at maturity or prior redemption and for any reserves for such bonds. An amendment was offered at the hearing to transition the committed funds from the Highway Trust Fund to the Highway Cash Fund.

POSITION: Support. The bill was debated at General File and cloture invoked. The bill was debated on Select File and advanced to Final Reading with only 27 votes. The bill failed on Final Reading, gaining only 28 votes. Per the Nebraska Constitution, authorization for road construction bonds must garner 3/5 support of the Legislature, or 30 votes. This bill was dismissed via procedural motion, along with all other pending legislation.

LB734 (Schumacher) Provide for deposit of public funds with credit unions. Allows for public funds to be deposited in qualifying state and federally chartered credit unions, as well as banks. The hearing on this measure was held in late January. The proponents are trying to move the bill out of committee but have not been successful yet.

POSITION: Support. This bill was dismissed via procedural motion, along with all other pending legislation.

LB994 (Health & Human Services Committee) Change fees as prescribed for vital statistics. Increases the amount that can be charged by Vital Statistics by \$5 per copy for a marriage certificate. Dan Nolte forwarded a request to include county fees as well. Larry Dix and I visited with Senator Campbell's office before the hearing and Corrie presented an amendment increasing the fee by \$5

POSITION: Support as amended noted above. Senator Campbell indicated that she would prefer that bill move forward unamended. She committed to bringing a bill that would raise the fees next year. LB 994 was passed on Final Reading by an overwhelming margin, and signed into law by Governor Heineman.

LB661 (Krist) Provide for voter registration on the Secretary of State's website and use of Department of Motor Vehicle records. Modifies the Election Act (Ch. 32) to required that the Secretary of State, along with the Department of Motor Vehicles develop and implement a registration application process which may be used statewide to register to vote and update voter registration records electronically using the Secretary of State's web site, by July 2015. An applicant who has a valid Nebraska motor vehicle operator's license or state identification card may use the application process to register to vote or to



update his or her voter registration record with changes in his or her personal information or other information related to his or her eligibility to vote.

POSITION: Monitor. The bill was signed by the Governor on March 31, 2014.

LB870 (Bolz) Adopt the Public Debt Recovery Program Act. This bill would enact the Public Debt Recovery Program, which will be administered by the State Treasurer. The Program will create a set off of any public debt which is assigned to the program against a debtor's income tax refund, state lottery prize, state pay, state contract payment, unclaimed property, any other state payment due to a debtor. Public debt is defined within the statute as any liquidated amount due and owing any claimant which has accrued through assignment, contract, subrogation, court judgment, or operation of law, regardless of whether there is an outstanding judgment for such amount. The bill specifically excludes any debts owed to the University of Nebraska or the state colleges, amounts for child support, or delinquent property taxes. Each state agency, court, and political subdivision may assign a public debt of more than fifty dollars to the public debt recovery program, but only after making two attempts to notify the debtor, and the passage of 90 days. The State Treasurer can pay such amounts, and then determine if the debtor is entitled to any income tax refund, state lottery prize, state pay, state contract payment, unclaimed property, or other state payment. If so, the Treasurer will then send written notification to the debtor of an assertion of the rights under the Public Debt Recovery Program Act to all or a portion of the refund or payment. A debtor can contest the amount or validity of the set off, by making a hearing request to the State Treasurer within the prescribed period. After certification of the debt by the Treasurer, they will notify the Department of Administrative Services, which will deduct an amount up to the certified debt amount from the income tax refund, state lottery prize, state pay, state contract payment, unclaimed property, or other state payment due the debtor and transfer such amount to the Public Debt Recovery Program Fund. The State Treasurer will then notify the debtor of the completion of the setoff.

This bill also creates a Public Debt Recovery Program Fund. The bill appropriates to the fund \$500,00 from the State Settlement Fund in fiscal years 2014-15 and 2015-16 and an amount equal to the cost and ongoing maintenance expense to interface with the JUSTICE System from the Supreme Court Automation Fund. The remaining funding for the Public Debt Recovery Program will be through General Funds until the program is self-sustaining through fees. At the end of any fiscal year, if the revenue in the fund from recovery fees exceeds 200% of the administrative cost of the public debt recovery program for that fiscal year, the State Treasurer must distribute an amount to each claimant equal to the portion of such excess amount determined by calculating the claimant's percentage of the total recoveries during the fiscal year and multiplying that percentage by the excess amount.

Lastly, the bill allows the Tax Commissioner to transmit information to State Treasurer for purposes of this act, without fear of criminal sanction.



POSITION: Support in concept. The commissioners submitted a letter in support of the bill with some potential changes to the bill. The bill did not advance from the Committee. This bill was dismissed via procedural motion, along with all other pending legislation.

LB881 (Watermeier) Change provisions relating to death, injury, or property damage to innocent third parties as a result of a police vehicular pursuit. This legislation would amend NERS 13-911, which is a portion of the Political Subdivisions Tort Claims Act, and NERS 81-8,215.01, which is a portion of the State Tort Claims Act. The bill explicitly disallows a passenger in or on the fleeing vehicle from being considered an innocent third party if the passenger:(a) Enters into the vehicle without coercion knowing, or with a reasonable belief, that the driver of the vehicle is under the influence of alcoholic liquor or drugs; (b) Fails to take reasonable steps to persuade the driver of the fleeing vehicle to stop the vehicle; (c) Promotes, provokes, or persuades the driver to engage in flight from law enforcement personnel; (d) Is subject to arrest or sought to be apprehended by law enforcement personnel; or (e) Is engaged in any illegal activity which would itself give rise to an arrest. Note importantly, in case of death, injury, or property damage to any innocent third party proximately caused by the action of a law enforcement officer employed by a political subdivision or the state during vehicular pursuit, damages shall be paid to such third party by the political subdivision state employing the officer, per these statutes.

POSITION: Monitor. The bill remained in Committee. The bill died on a procedural motion today.

LB1094 (Davis) Change a fund transfer to the Property Tax Credit Cash Fund. This bill would amend 2013, LB199, 2 section 7; to provide that the State Treasurer shall transfer \$138 million from the General Fund to the Property Tax Credit Cash Fund on or before December 15, 2014. Presently, the statute requires the Treasurer to transfer \$113 million. The bill remained in Committee, and died on a procedural motion.

LB1086 (Pirsch) Transfer cash reserve funds to the Property Tax Credit Cash Fund. This bill would amend NERS 84-612, to instruct the State Treasurer to transfer \$115 million dollars from the Cash Reserve Fund to the Property Tax Credit Cash Fund on or before December 15, 2014, and on or before December 15, 2015, on such date as directed by the budget administrator of the budget division of the Department of Administrative Services. The bill remains in Committee. The bill remained in Committee, and died on a procedural motion.

LB669 (McCoy) Transfer cash reserve funds to the Property Tax Credit Cash Fund. This bill would amend the Cash Reserve Fund (NERS 84-612), by requiring the State Treasurer to transfer \$85 million from the Cash Reserve Fund to the Property Tax Credit Cash Fund by the end of 2014.



POSITION: Monitor. The budget was finalized on March 24, 2014 and sent to the Governor on the same date. As you will recall, the budget contained \$25 million in additional funding to the property tax relief fund. The Governor returned LB905 with \$65 Million in line-item reductions with a request that they utilize a portion of that to put more money in property tax relief. The Legislature overrode \$61 Million in vetoes – including more than \$7 Million in contingency funds at the Supreme Court for purposes of implementing LB561. The bills listed above died on procedural motion.

Interim Recommendations:

There are some issues that will, undoubtedly, come back again in 2015 – 2016. These include: elimination of the inheritance tax, Medicaid expansion, and others. In addition to these bills, we should keep a close watch on the two interim studies (LR 544 and LR 582) which call for a review of unfunded mandates at the county level. We believe that the county should re-examine a way to enact something as part of this examination of unfunded mandates that would essentially enact LB 632 (2013) regarding county rent for DHHS. One such potential manner could be to seek legislation that appropriates the monies necessary to DHHS administration and repeals the relevant section of statute.

Too, we will want to continue to monitor the implementation of LB 561 (2013), the amendments offered in LB 464 (2014), LB 907 (2014) and LB 999 (2014), to ensure there are not unintended consequences with financial impact to Lancaster County. While the changes appear to be positive, we need to ensure that the implementation is correct.

The potential for the changes which drove the introduction of LB 925 (2014) will need to be monitored through both the Legislative Fiscal Office and Senator Coash's office.


The Answer
