## 5) APPEAL OF PERSONAL PROPERTY PENALTY:

#### A. SensoryEffects Cereal System

Scott Gaines, Chief Administrative Deputy Assessor/Register of Deeds, recommended denial of the request as the Board does not have the statutory authority to waive penalties that have been correctly imposed.

Greg Russell, SensoryEffects Cereal Systems, stated according to Nebraska Revised Statute 77-1233.04, "...if a taxpayer does not file a return it is the County Assessor's responsibility to file on behalf of the taxpayer." He also noted the taxpayer is to be notified in writing if the return was not signed. Russell did not agree with the amount of penalty that was imposed.

In response to Avery's inquiry regarding the reason the return was not filed by the deadline, Russell replied it was just an honest mistake.

Gaines said the reporting of personal property is 100% self-reported and the County Assessor's Office would not have the most current information to file on behalf of the taxpayer.

Dave Derbin, Deputy County Attorney, said under State Statute 77-1233.06 the Board of Equalization has no authority to waive penalties that have been correctly imposed. Upon reviewing the appeal, it was his opinion the penalty was correctly imposed.

**MOTION:** Schorr moved and Amundson seconded to deny the request. Schorr, Amundson, Avery, Brinkman and Wiltgen voted yes. Motion carried 5-0.
