The Chair called the meeting to order at 9:05 a.m., the pledge of allegiance was recited and the location of the Nebraska Open Meetings Act was announced.

1) <u>MINUTES</u>: Approval of the minutes of the Board of Commissioners meeting held on Tuesday, January 24, 2017.

MOTION: Amundson moved and Avery seconded approval of the minutes. Avery, Schorr, Amundson and Wiltgen voted yes. Brinkman abstained. Motion carried 4-0 with one abstention.

MOTION: Schorr moved and Avery seconded approval of the claims. Brinkman, Schorr, Amundson, Avery and Wiltgen voted yes. Motion carried 5-0.

A. Recognition of the County-City Building art exhibit – Shelly Burge

4) <u>NEW BUSINESS</u>:

A. Recommendation from the Purchasing Department and County Weed Control to award a contract for the annual supply of turf fertilizer and chemicals to Crop Production Services, Inc., in the amount of \$4,045 and D & K Products (Century Home Company) in the amount of \$117.60. (B-17-0007)

Shelly Hinze, Purchasing Department Buyer, clarified bid line item #45 noting the amount should be 480 ounces and not 24 ounces. The correct amount awarded to D & K Products will be \$2,352.

C. Second Grant Contract Amendment to County Contract C-16-0295 with the Lincoln Parks Foundation extending the completion date from December 31, 2016 to June 30, 2017. (C-17-0034)

MOTION: Schorr moved and Avery seconded approval of the grant contract amendment. Amundson, Schorr, Brinkman, Avery and Wiltgen voted yes. Motion carried 5-0.

D. Grant Contract Amendment to County Contract C-14-0554 with the Lincoln Parks Foundation extending the completion date from December 31, 2016 to June 30, 2017. (C-17-0035)

MOTION: Avery moved and Amundson seconded approval of the grant contract amendment. Schorr, Brinkman, Avery, Amundson and Wiltgen voted yes. Motion carried 5-0.

E. Amendment to County Contract C-10-0590 with Bob Barker Company, Inc., for the annual supply of corrections staff clothing, inmate clothing and accessories (Bid No. 10-168). The amendment extends the contract from February 16, 2017 through April 15, 2017. The cost to the County is not to exceed \$9,800. (C-17-0030)

MOTION: Schorr moved and Amundson seconded approval of the amendment. Brinkman, Avery, Amundson, Schorr and Wiltgen voted yes. Motion carried 5-0.

F. Amendment to County Contract C-15-0228 with Graybar Electric Company using the County of Los Angeles, California Master Agreement No. MA-IS-1540125. The amendment renews the contract from January 1, 2017 through December 31, 2017. The cost to the County is not to exceed \$20,000. (C-17-0031) **MOTION:** Avery moved and Amundson seconded approval of the amendment. Avery, Amundson, Schorr, Brinkman and Wiltgen voted yes. Motion carried 5-0.

G. Amendment to County Contract C-13-0602 with Waste Connection of Nebraska, Inc., for the annual requirements for waste and recyclable collection services (Bid No. 13-304). The service cost will increase by approximately \$550 for the remainder of the contract term. (C-17-0032)

MOTION: Schorr moved and Amundson seconded approval of the amendment. Amundson, Brinkman, Avery, Schorr and Wiltgen voted yes. Motion carried 5-0.

H. Lease agreement with Murphy Tractor and Equipment for the rental of one skid steer loader. Term of the lease is from February 1, 2017 through January 31, 2018. The cost to the County is not to exceed \$4,500. (C-17-0033)

MOTION: Amundson moved and Avery seconded approval of the lease agreement. Avery, Schorr, Brinkman, Amundson and Wiltgen voted yes. Motion carried 5-0.

I. Amendment to County Contract C-16-0151 to include additional professional services related to the Saltillo Road safety study. The amendment includes the portion of Saltillo Road from 14th Street to 27th Street. The cost to the County is \$3,800. (C-17-0036)

Pam Dingman, County Engineer, said following the initial safety study the Nebraska Department of Roads (NDOR) had concerns about a mile of Saltillo Road that falls within the City of Lincoln's jurisdiction. They have asked that the mile be included in the study to calculate the cost benefit ratio for adding the additional mile of paving. Dingman stated the County will work with the City in a joint project. She added the NDOR has informed her that funding would be available for this project in 2020.

In response to Wiltgen's inquiry if the City has been involved, Dingman said she has met with the Public Works Director, City Traffic Engineer and Assistant City Engineer.

MOTION: Amundson moved and Schorr seconded approval of the amendment. Brinkman, Amundson, Schorr, Avery and Wiltgen voted yes. Motion carried 5-0.

J. Political Subdivision Tort Claim filed against Lancaster County by Jason Geis, in the amount of \$1000.
