# STAFF MEETING MINUTES LANCASTER COUNTY BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS COUNTY-CITY BUILDING ROOM 113 – BILL LUXFORD STUDIO THURSDAY, MAY 11, 2017 8:30 A.M.

Advance public notice of the Board of Commissioners Staff Meeting was posted on the County-City Building bulletin board and the Lancaster County, Nebraska web site and provided to the media on May 10, 2017.

The Chair noted the location of the Open Meetings Act and opened the meeting at 8:30 a.m.

#### 1. APPROVAL OF MAY 4, 2017 STAFF MEETING MINUTES

**MOTION:** Amundson moved and Schorr seconded approval of the May 4, 2017 Staff Meeting minutes. Amundson, Schorr and Wiltgen voted yes. Avery and Brinkman were absent. Motion carried 3-0.

Avery arrived at the meeting at 8:32 a.m.

**2. LEGISLATIVE UPDATE** - Gordon Kissel, Joe Kohout and Jonathan Bradford, Kissel/E&S Associates (Legislative Consultants)

Joe Kohout, Kissel/E&S Associates, presented a legislative update and two legislative bills reports (Exhibits A-C), noting the following:

- There is potential for some version of Legislative Bill (LB) 461 (Correct references to a federal act in a revenue statute) to be brought back up for consideration this session.
- The Speaker of the Legislature could also put LB 333 (Eliminate and independent review of denial of aid to the disabled) back up for consideration. He said representatives of the development disability

(DD) providers would really like the two DD provisions in that bill to pass this session to bring the State into compliance and have submitted an amendment to Senator Merv Riepe, introducer of the bill, for his consideration. The amendment would strike county provisions from the bill.

- It is anticipated that LB 68 (Prohibit certain regulation of firearms, ammunition, and firearm accessories by counties, cities, and villages and prescribed and create firearm offenses) will have some level of debate.
- LB 259 (Adopt and change competency and financial ability provisions relating to court proceedings as prescribed) was passed and sent to the Governor for his signature or veto.

In response to a question from Wiltgen, Kohout said it was his understanding that the courts asked for delayed implementation until after the current biennium because of some costs the courts would incur.

Wiltgen noted there is currently a juvenile sitting out a fine from Adult Court at the Youth Services Center (YSC). Kohout said the County could take up the issue of juveniles sitting out fines in juvenile facilities next session.

Sheli Schindler, Youth Services Center (YSC) Director, expressed concern regarding Legislative Resolution (LR) 198 (Interim study to examine the impact of incarceration on children in Nebraska). Kohout said they will monitor it for potential hearing dates.

#### ADMINISTRATIVE OFFICER REPORT

#### A. Director's Manual

Kerry Eagan, Chief Administrative Officer, asked if the Board has a deadline for the document to be completed. **NOTE:** A draft of the document is included in the agenda packet. He said a synopsis of all the departments still needs to be completed and suggested that departments be asked to provide their own synopsis to speed up the process. Additional budget language is also needed that Dennis Meyer, Budget and Fiscal Officer, will need to prepare. Eagan said two other areas that require additional information are Purchasing and Human Resources.

Eagan also noted the County Board polices are on the Board of Commissioners and County Clerk's webpages and sometimes there are different versions. He suggested one site should serve as the official repository of all the policies.

Schorr suggested a deadline of July 31<sup>st</sup>. Amundson said she would like to see it completed sooner and suggested June 15<sup>th</sup> or June 30<sup>th</sup> as the date for completion. Eagan said the document takes a lot of time and concentration and said most of his work on the project has taken place on weekends because he does not have uninterrupted time

to devote to it during the workweek. Eagan felt July 31<sup>st</sup> would be a more realistic date. Avery noted this project has taken quite some time.

**MOTION:** Schorr moved and Avery seconded to: 1) Request that the director's manual be completed by July 31, 2017; and 2) Request the participation of the elected officials and directors in outlining their job functions.

Amundson suggested a compromise completion date of July 15<sup>th</sup>. Schorr felt the two weeks would not make much difference.

**ROLL CALL:** Amundson, Avery, Schorr and Wiltgen voted yes. Brinkman was absent. Motion carried 4-0.

B. May 25, 2017 Staff Meeting Start Time (9:00 a.m.)

C. Memo from County Attorney Regarding Use of Personal Electronic Devices for County Business

Eagan said David Derbin, Deputy County Attorney, wanted the Board to be aware that the County Attorney's Office would be sending this memo to all County departments. He said it is a significant issue because of recent requests involving public information that extended to personal electronic devices.

Amundson questioned whether the County would need to provide electronic devises for the officials and staff to use. The Chair suggested that might be a topic for discussion at another time.

- 3. BOARD OF EQUALIZATION (BOE) UPDATE Tom Kubert, Great Plains Appraisal (Referee Coordinator); Dan Nolte, County Clerk; Cori Beattie, Deputy County Clerk
  - A. Space Rental Contract
  - **B.** Letters

Tom Kubert, Great Plains Appraisal (Referee Coordinator), noted 2017 is a revaluation year and said the County Assessor's Office held a number of informal protests hearings earlier in the year, primarily residential and agricultural. He estimated there could be 4,000 to 5,000 formal property valuation protests this year. Kubert said 17 days have been identified for property valuation hearings at the Lancaster Event Center. This will allow for a maximum of 5,400 hearings.

Kubert said he is working to update the policies and procedures and the referee forms. He noted these forms are considered internal documents and are not standardized by the State of Nebraska nor intended to be a legal rebuttal.

Amundson exited the meeting at 9:05 a.m. and returned to the meeting at 9:07 a.m.

Kubert noted the Lancaster County Board of Equalization (BOE) delegated the responsibility of hearing protests to referees who then make recommendations, which meets the statutory requirement. He said Lancaster County has historically added a second step and allowed the protestor or property owner to know the results of the referee hearing and provide additional or new information that would be considered in the process. Oral and written testimony has been accepted in the past but the last five to seven years it has been limited to written testimony. He said historically, 8-10% of protestors submit additional information. Kubert added that no matter what process is used, all the protests can still be filed with the Tax Equalization and Review Commission (TERC) once the BOE takes final action.

**MOTION:** Schorr moved and Amundson seconded to retain the process which allows property taxpayers to provide additional written information to the Board of Equalization (BOE). Avery, Schorr, Amundson and Wiltgen voted yes. Brinkman was absent. Motion carried 4-0.

Kubert recommended extension of the deadline for hearing protests regarding real property in Lancaster County from July 25, 2017 to August 10, 2017. There was consensus to schedule a resolution to extend the deadline on a County Board of Commissioners Meeting agenda.

Kubert said there are 304 properties still under appeal at the TERC level and said that number would be reduced to 45 for 2016 and 31 for 2015 if the eight large ownerships that have volumes of protests were eliminated. Cori Beattie, Deputy County Clerk, noted the past few years the BOE has notified property owners with open appeals before TERC in writing that they may not get any relief for the current year unless a separate protest is filed. There was consensus to continue the practice of sending out notification letters.

#### A. Space Rental Contract

Beattie reviewed terms of the space rental agreement with the Lancaster Event Center for meeting space within the facility to be used for property valuation protest hearings. She said the rates have changed slightly since last year. Beattie said there is now an electrical surcharge and said she is seeking a waiver. Schorr thought that would be appropriate. Beattie said the County Attorney's Office also has concerns regarding indemnification language and said she will work with Amy Dickerson, Lancaster Event Center Managing Director, to resolve that issue.

#### B. Letters

Amundson asked that the first sentence in the letter sent to protestors who waived their hearing be split into two sentences to read as follows: Our records show that a property valuation protest was filed on the following parcel. Attendance at a review hearing for this parcel was waived.

#### **Additional Discussion**

Beattie noted a revision has been made to the property valuation protest brochure to include information on the informal hearing process.

In response to a question from Schorr, Beattie said the County Clerk's Office is tracking complaints about the process. It was suggested it be a combined effort with the Board of Commissioners' Office and County Assessor's Office going forward. Wiltgen asked that the individuals with complaints be referred to him, as the BOE Chair, and said he will communicate their concerns to the Board. Avery suggested it would be helpful to know which district the individuals with complaints reside in. Dan Nolte, County Clerk, said they could include a survey with the final value letter so the Board would have written feedback on the process. Kubert noted final value letters will reference the public hearing the BOE plans to hold after the process is completed and said those individuals could be "steered" there to present their comments. The Board scheduled the public hearing on the process on September 26<sup>th</sup> as part of the regular County Board of Commissioners Meeting. There was also consensus to tentatively schedule final action on August 8<sup>th</sup>.

Avery exited the meeting at 9:40 a.m.

**4. DEPARTMENT BUDGET HEARINGS** – Dennis Meyer, Budget and Fiscal Officer

#### A. Mental Health Crisis Center (63)

Present were Scott Etherton, Mental Health Crisis Center Director, and Jareth Kaup, Account Clerk III.

S. Etherton discussed the services his agency provides. Dennis Meyer, Budget and Fiscal Officer, asked whether all of their services are mandated. S. Etherton felt they were. Wiltgen clarified that the County is not mandated to have a mental health crisis center but is mandated to provide the service.

Schorr inquired about health services. S. Etherton said it encompasses a number of things including behavioral health, assessment of physical condition, providing psychiatric medications, and follow-up.

Wiltgen referenced contract utilization with Region V Systems and said three services were listed in documents presented to the Region V Systems Governing Board (mental health emergency protective custody (EPC) services, mental health post-commitment days, and substance abuse emergency crisis assessment). He said two of them, EPC services and emergency crisis assessment, are non-fee-for-services and felt they would be difficult to track.

Meyer asked S. Etherton whether he is projecting more or less admissions. S. Etherton said it is trending up slightly. Wiltgen asked him to provide a summary of the prior year in the fall showing how the facility (a breakdown of population and counties).

Avery returned to the meeting at 9:53 a.m.

Meyer noted a 2.1% increase in the budget is projected, noting the 97% budget requirement was not met. S. Etherton said the largest increase to the budget was the rent (the Crisis Center was relocated to the government campus). He explained they had a shortfall in what was budgeted for the current fiscal year because they did not include debt service, which went into effect in April, 2017 (a shortfall of approximately \$30,000). **NOTE:** Bonds were issued to remodel the building that now serves as the Mental Health Crisis Center and the 605 Building. The cost of the bonds were bought down with proceeds from the sale of the Community Mental Health Center (CMHC) Building. S. Etherton said rent for Fiscal Year (FY) 2017-2018 is increasing by approximately \$90,000 due to inclusion of debt service and parking. He said he decreased other line items, such as hospitalization, to try to make up that cost.

S. Etherton said another significant cost area is computer software and maintenance noting they are trying to "piggyback" onto a contract to move forward with a new behavioral health integrated information and data management system. He said funds that were built into the current budget (\$30,0000-\$35,000) were not expended because they were not able to move forward with a contract and he would like to carryover those funds.

In response to a question from Meyer, S. Etherton said Region V does not intend to increase their funding this year. Wiltgen, who serves on the Region V Systems Governing Board, noted the Governor would like to reduce behavioral health funding but said he did not think any budget reduction at the Region V level would affect the Crisis Center.

Meyer said he plans to keep the transfer amount from the General Fund to the Crisis Center at the same amount as the current fiscal year.

Amundson inquired about vehicle use. S. Etherton said the Crisis Center has one vehicle which is used to take patients to the hospital or medical appointments.

#### **ACTION ITEMS**

A. Authorize Scott Etherton, Mental Health Crisis Center Director, to Execute on Behalf of Lancaster County a Confidentiality Agreement to Request Access to Nebraska Department of Health and Human Services (DHHS) Information Technology (IT) Assets

**MOTION:** Amundson moved and Schorr seconded to approve the authorization. Schorr, Amundson, Avery and Wiltgen voted yes. Brinkman was absent. Motion carried 4-0.

Etherton was asked to provide a copy of the executed document to the County Clerk's Office.

Amundson exited the meeting at 10:12 a.m. and returned to the meeting at 10:14 a.m.

#### B. Community Corrections (676)

Present was Kim Etherton, Community Corrections Director

K. Etherton addressed services, explaining they are broken into business units. She noted a coordinator was moved from the Administrative Business Unit to the Intensive Supervision Business Unit which affected some of the numbers. A drug technician was also moved into Intensive Supervision.

K. Etherton said the contract for on-line Safety Training Option Program (STOP) classes will increase substantially but will be offset by fees. She added she is confident they will exceed revenue projections for STOP this year. K. Etherton also felt the County will collect a substantial amount of revenue from the new 24/7 Sobriety Program but said it is difficult to make a projection yet.

Meyer noted the majority of the programs are non-mandated but they help offset issues resulting from mandates. He added the County receives funding from the State for some of the programs. K. Etherton said the State currently covers about 75% of salaries and benefits employees associated with the Adult Drug Court Program. The County also receives some reimbursement for substance abuse intervention and other mental health services.

Meyer then inquired about rent costs. K. Etherton said rent will increase approximately \$49,000 with the department's move to the 605 Building. Rent includes security and parking factors.

K. Etherton said she has requested one new vehicle this year (she requested three new vehicles in last year's budget and one was approved). She said they were able to retire

one high maintenance vehicle and trade another which substantially reduced their vehicle repair and maintenance costs. The department has ten vehicles. Eight are assigned to staff and two are spare vans that are used to transport groups.

Wiltgen questioned the large increase in cellular phone service. K. Etherton said she is adding a cellular phone for a coordinator. She explained they are over budget in that line item this year and the budget was adjusted but she will continue to monitor those costs.

Avery said he supports Community Corrections' work but has concerns regarding the size of its budget request for this year and last year. Etherton noted she added an Intensive Supervision Diversion Program and a Veterans Diversion Program without adding staff. Meyer noted the Board's decisions to add the 24/7 Sobriety Program and move the department to the 605 Building increased their expenditures. Wiltgen said one of the largest driving costs this year is rent and suggested that once Trabert Hall is sold, the Board have a discussion of whether to leave the proceeds in the Building Fund or apply them to the General Fund increases resulting from rent. Meyer reminded the Board there will also be significant costs related to the new Emergency Operations Center (EOC) and said the Board needs to understand the costs when it approves these types of projects.

5. **HIRE SHERIFF DEPUTY AND REPLACEMENT VEHICLE** - Terry Wagner, Lancaster County Sheriff; Todd Duncan, Chief Deputy Sheriff

Terry Wagner, Lancaster County Sheriff, requested authorization to hire a new deputy sheriff in advance of a retirement (Exhibit D). He said the training cycle for a new deputy takes about a year and hiring a new deputy now will allow them to be enrolled in the next Basic Law Enforcement Certification Training Class which begins in August. The overlap in payroll, approximately five months, will have a fiscal impact of approximately \$18,000. The increased cost will be absorbed by the pay difference and attrition in the coming fiscal year.

**MOTION:** Avery moved and Amundson seconded to authorize the County Sheriff to proceed with the hiring process. Amundson, Avery, Schorr and Wiltgen voted yes. Brinkman was absent. Motion carried 4-0.

Wagner said two of the Lancaster Sheriff's Office's (LSO's) patrol vehicles were totaled in crashes, noting neither were the deputy's fault. He requested an additional \$47,000 in spending authority for the remainder of the budget year to replace one of the vehicles. The other vehicle was replaced with funds remaining in the budget. Wagner said they have received insurance settlements of \$17,900 and \$12,760 which will be deposited in the General Fund as revenue.

Amundson asked whether drug forfeiture funds could be used. Todd Duncan, Chief Deputy Sheriff, said he believes they could but said they are hoping to use those funds for several large technology projects that are "on the horizon."

Schorr asked whether the purchase could be delayed until the new fiscal year. Wagner said they have already submitted next year's request for vehicles but they could increase that number.

Schorr then asked whether they had looked at implementing any policy or training changes to help prevent these types of accidents. Wagner said they have a Safety Committee that reviews all accidents to see if there is a policy violation or if additional training is needed.

Wiltgen asked whether there is a law in place that would hold an intoxicated driver responsible for the replacement cost if they strike a law enforcement vehicle. **NOTE:** One of the crashes involved an intoxicated driver. Wagner noted many intoxicated drivers don't have insurance because of their past driving record.

**MOTION:** Amundson moved and Schorr seconded to authorize the County Sheriff to purchase the replacement vehicle.

Wiltgen asked the status of the County's "Rainy Day Fund." Meyer said the County has used approximately \$400,000 of the \$2,000,000 fund to date.

**ROLL CALL:** Avery, Schorr, Amundson and Wiltgen voted yes. Brinkman was absent. Motion carried 4-0.

6. AMENDMENT CONTRACT WITH BLUE VALLEY BEHAVIORAL HEALTH TO INCREASE CONTRACT LIMIT BY \$3,000 AND MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING WITH THE LEAGUE OF HUMAN DIGNITY - Sheli Schindler, Youth Services Center (YSC) Director; Annette Thompson, YSC Deputy Director; Melissa Hood, Administrative Aide

Sheli Schindler, Youth Services Center (YSC) Director, said Blue Valley Behavioral Health is providing after hours mental health programming for YSC. She said those costs are difficult to project and they are seeking an amendment to increase the contract amount. Schindler said the cost will be covered in the budget. **NOTE:** The amendment will be scheduled on a regular County Board of Commissioners Meeting agenda for action.

Annette Thompson, YSC Deputy Director, discussed a proposed memorandum of understanding (MOU) with the League of Human Dignity to provide services and programing to youth with disabilities in YSC. She explained that most of the youth in YSC fall within a disability category, citing mental health issues, substance abuse issues and

educational disabilities as examples. Thompson said the League of Human Dignity collaborates with Vocational Rehabilitation and services throughout the community and will continue to counsel the youth who are enrolled through early adulthood. Schindler said there will be no direct cost to the County.

7. LABOR NEGOTIATIONS - Doug McDaniel, Lincoln-Lancaster County Human Resources Director; Nicole Gross and Amy Sadler, Compensation Technicians; Kristy Bauer, Deputy Lancaster County Attorney

**MOTION:** Amundson moved and Avery seconded to enter Executive Session at 11:11 a.m. for the purpose of protecting the public interest with regards to potential litigation.

The Chair said it has been moved and seconded that the Board enter into Executive Session.

**ROLL CALL:** Schorr, Amundson, Avery and Wiltgen voted yes. Brinkman was absent. Motion carried 4-0.

The Chair restated the purpose for the Board entering into Executive Session.

Schorr exited the meeting at 11:37 a.m.

**MOTION:** Amundson moved and Avery seconded to exit Executive Session at 11:38 a.m. Amundson, Avery and Wiltgen voted yes. Schorr and Brinkman were absent. Motion carried 3-0.

#### 8. ACTION ITEMS

#### E. Exchange of Properties with PJC Farms

Wiltgen said the Mr. and Mrs. Bruce Cropsey of PJC Farm Limited Partnership have communicated that they are willing to exchange the parcel they own that is contiguous to Wilderness Park for the County's property at Nebraska Highway 77 and Yankee Hill Road. The Cropseys have indicated the only cost they are willing to incur as a result of the exchange of properties are their legal fees. Eagan noted there may be filing fees involved and suggested the closing be delayed until after the levy date so there isn't a tax consequence.

In response to a question from Avery, Eagan said the County would be gaining administrative efficiency and access to Wilderness Park, which is currently being denied.

There was consensus to direct David Derbin, Deputy County Attorney, to communicate further with the Cropseys attorney.

#### F. Rewrite of County Zoning Text

There was consensus to have the Lincoln/Lancaster County Planning Department provide a briefing to the Board before the item is scheduled for public hearing.

#### G. Sale of Vacated Portion of West Meinke Street

Eagan said he received an offer from Jeffrey Radik in the amount of \$1,500 for the vacated portion of West Meinke Street in the unincorporated village of Kramer, Nebraska. He noted the value that was established in vacating the land was \$2,250 (see County Resolution No. R-17-0020). Eagan said Pam Dingman, County Engineer, feels it is a good offer.

There was consensus to accept the offer.



Weekly Update

Today is day 81 of the 2017 Nebraska Legislature. Please note that the Speaker announced that the LEGISLATURE WILL ADJOURN SINE DIE ON MAY 23<sup>rd</sup>, which is the 86<sup>th</sup> scheduled day of the session.

Last Thursday, the body debated budget bills on Select File. After insightful debate, the Legislature moved on to pass 24 consent bills off Final Reading and to the Governor for his signature or veto. The afternoon wrapped with debate on LB 44, Senator Watermeier's legislation to enable Nebraska to collect sales tax on internet sales, which failed to get to a vote. Friday brought the passage of LB 508, Senator Hilger's civil service/population threshold bill on Final Reading. The body also debated LB 289, Senator Pansing-Brooks' human sex trafficking which was placed on Final Reading May 8<sup>th</sup>.

The Legislature returned to action on Monday, May 8<sup>th</sup> and covered a little bit of everything with components of the budget's \$8.9 billion covering capital construction, fiscal adjustments and salaries passing on Final Reading. After that, the body took up the first motion to override gubernatorial veto on Senator Wayne's LB 75, to allow felons the right to vote upon the completion of their sentence. The Governor's veto stood as the body voted 23-23 to override the veto. Tuesday had more of a "for the record" debate on LB 331 which would change cash reserve funds and LB 327, the mainline budget bill than an actual attempt to shut down the government by a group of senators. After members of the body had the opportunity to voice their concerns or support, they passed both bills with the requisite number of votes to maintain the emergency clause. That afternoon body then moved on to consider LR1CA, a constitutional amendment to require voter identification. The measure failed on cloture to a vote of 26-17.

Wednesday brought first round debate on LB 632, Senator Larson's legislation to change the Liquor Control Act. After lengthy debate on AM1350, the amendment was adopted and the bill passed onto Select File.

#### Next week:

The agenda is fluid, but the Speaker has hinted that General File debate would take up Monday and Tuesday, with Wednesday and Thursday set aside for any gubernatorial veto overrides.

As of Wednesday, there are 146 on General File; 14 on Final Reading; 55 bills passed by the Legislature; 99 bills have been approved by Governor Ricketts. 364 bills remain in committee.

#### LANCASTER COUNTY LEGISLATIVE PRIORITIES

LB508 (Hilgers) Change the population threshold for the county civil service system. The bill was introduced on January 18<sup>th</sup>, and was referred to the Government, Military and Veterans Affairs Committee. This bill was heard on February 22, 2017 and on Monday, April 3, 2017 the Committee conducted an executive session on the bill and advanced it with the proposed amendment attached. The bill was presented to the Governor on May 8<sup>th</sup>, 2017, and is awaiting his signature or veto.

POSITION: SUPPORT

LB567 (Bolz) Change funding for county public assistance offices. The bill was introduced on January 18<sup>th</sup>, and was referred to the Government, Military and Veterans Affairs Committee. The bill was heard on February 22, 2017 and still remains in committee.

POSITION: SUPPORT

LB441 (Morfeld) Change eligibility provisions under the Medical Assistance Act. This years' Medicaid Expansion Bill. LB441 makes those persons described under section 1902 (a)(10)(A)(i)(VIII) of the federal Social Security Act eligible under the Medical Assistance Act. The department must submit a state plan amendment to cover newly eligible individuals, and such amendment must request as the alternative benefit plan a benchmark benefit package as defined in section 1937(b)(1) 18 (D) of the federal Social Security Act, as amended, 42 U.S.C. 1396u-7(b)(1)(D), as such act and section existed on January 1, 2017, for Secretary-approved coverage that shall include full Medicaid benefit coverage, including mandatory and optional coverage, under section 68-911 22 in the amount, duration, and scope in effect on January 1, 2017, and any additional wraparound benefits required under federal law. The hearing was held on March 8, 2017 and remains held in Committee.

Senator Morfeld has filed a motion to pull the bill from the Health and Human Services Committee, but the body is yet to vote on the motion.

POSITION: SUPPORT

LB357 (Bolz) Increase original certificate of title fees for vehicles transferred to Nebraska from another state and provide for voluntary contributions to brain injury programs. LB357 places a fee of twenty-five dollars for each original certificate of title issued to a person by a county for a vehicle or trailer being titled in Nebraska from another state after the first original title is issued. LB357 also allows for voluntary contributions of \$2 to be made as a donation to programs for persons suffering from brain injury. This bill was heard on February 28, 2017 and is still in committee. At the hearing, the only opposition to the bill was raised by the Department of Motor Vehicles.

POSITION: SUPPORT

LB47 (Watermeier) Change provisions relating to the payment of fees and costs associated with grand juries and the deaths of incarcerated persons. The hearing on this bill was held before the Judiciary Committee. Mr. Eagan testified on behalf of Lancaster County. The bill remains held in Committee.

POSITION: SUPPORT

LB327 (Speaker Scheer at the Request of the Governor) Appropriate funds for the expenses of Nebraska State Government for the biennium ending June 30, 2019. This is the Governor's Appropriation bill. We have become aware, as per a communication from Brent Meyer that there is a provision to reduce the amount of funding provided by LB1038 in last session from \$975,000 to \$487,500 for the Nebraska Department of Agriculture to get to their 8% reduction. The bill has been referred to the Appropriations committee. This bill was heard on February 21, 2017 and remains in committee.

On Monday, March 13, 2017 and Tuesday, March 14, 2017, hearings were held on Health and Human Services. Judy Halstead testified in support of the Appropriations Committee's recommended budget adjustments by restoring several cuts to Health and Human Services agencies – cuts that could Lancaster County as much as \$100,000 in total funds (through minor cuts in multiple budget lines). The committee received her comments well.

LB327 was advanced as part of the mainline budget process on Tuesday, April 11, 2017. The bill was presented to the Governor on May 9<sup>th</sup>, 2017, and is awaiting his signature or veto.

### POSITION: CONCERNS EXPRESSED BY JUDY HALSTEAD AND BRENT MEYER ABOUT REDUCTIONS IN SPECIFIC AREAS

LB81 (Blood) Change the application fee for handgun certificates. LB81 changes the fee charged for each application for a handgun certification from five dollars to twenty-five dollars. The bill was advanced to General File in its Green Form.

#### POSITION: SUPPORT

LB127 (Groene) Change notice requirements under Open Meetings Act. LB 127 provides for a change in the open meetings law, in Sec. 84-1411 of the statute. It strikes language for political subdivisions to publicize meeting designated by each political body and requires them to publish such notice in a newspaper of general circulation in each county within the public entities jurisdiction as well as any other method designated by the public body. The newspaper notice does not have to be published in every county but must have a general circulation within the county. This proposal is also not intended to apply to state agencies but just political subdivisions. A significant amendment was offered at the time of the hearing that would re-write the bill. The bill has been advanced to General File with committee amendment AM646.

We discussed the bill with Committee Counsel Andrew LaGroene. The intent of Senator Groene was apparently to adopt an amendment that would alleviate concerns. It does not do so. The amended bill did not have the support of Chairman Murante nor of Senator Carol Blood. Senator Craighead was present, not voting. Those voting in support included Senators Brewer, Briese, Hilgers, Lowe and Wayne. The bill is not prioritized.

#### POSITION: OPPOSE

LB152 (Craighead) Change and eliminate provisions relating to the fees for recording and filing certain documents. LB152 eliminates sunset dates of January 1, 2018 for provisions relating to the fees for recording and filing certain documents. LB152 also eliminates the six-dollar uniform fee, payable to the Secretary of State, for presenting and filing and indexing and filing and indexing each notice of lien or

certification of notice affecting lien on a property. The bill was approved by the Governor on May 9<sup>th</sup>, 2017.

#### POSITION: SUPPORT

LB333 (Riepe at the Request of the Governor) Eliminate an independent review of denial of aid to the disabled. LB333 requires that a disability persist for more than a year before a person can be considered disabled. LB333 also eliminates the requirement that the Department of Health and Human Services conduct an independent medical review when Social Security denies benefits to an individual on the basis of the duration of the individual's disability. The hearing on this measure was on January 25, 2017. A letter was sent to Senator Riepe and members of the Health and Human Services Committee under Chairman Wiltgen's signature.

Since the hearing, there has been an enormous amount of conversation on this issue including a conference call last week with representatives of NACO, Douglas and Lancaster County. We were advised that Lauren Kintner would be reaching out directly to Chairman Wiltgen and Chairwoman Borgeson in Douglas County. To date, we are not aware that those conversations have occurred.

Too, during his testimony before the Appropriations Committee, Director Weinberg of the Department of Health and Human Services – Division of Children and Family Services encouraged the Appropriations Committee to support LB333. In response, Chairman Stinner indicated his reluctance to do so due to the fact that it appeared that to adopt LB333 would shift the burden to counties to care for that population. Too, Senator Kate Bolz expressed skepticism about his testimony indicating that she had a tough time seeing how this population would not fall back on General Assistance of the County. The director had a tough time explaining how it would not. This bill is a committee priority.

On Wednesday, April 5, 2017, Sean Kelley advised Joe Kohout that the Governor's office told him that Lauren Kintner would be reaching out to Mary Ann Borgeson in the very near future. Lauren Kintner did reach out to Commissioner Borgeson early this week but has not reached out to Chairman Wiltgen. Furthermore, on Wednesday, April 12, 2017 we became aware that the Health and Human Services Committee was going to conduct an executive session of the committee to advance LB333. Between Joe, Larry and Sean Kelley, we made it clear that there was no agreement on the language and as such, the bill should not be advanced. The Executive Session was cancelled. However, the committee did conduct an Executive Session on Thursday, April 13, 2017 and advanced it on a 6-2 vote.

On Wednesday, April 19, 2017, a meeting was held in Senator Merv Riepe's office to discuss the underlying opposition to LB 333 in an effort to address those concerns. Those in attendance included Kerry Eagan, Commissioner Wiltgen (via telephone), Joe Kohout, Commissioner Borgeson, Sean Kelley, Senator Riepe, Kristin Stiffler (Counsel to the HHS Committee), Melissa Hilty (Governor's PRO), Gerry Oligmueller (Budget Office) and Larry Dix (NACO). Senator Riepe's office is preparing an amendment that incorporates changes to try to address county concerns.

On Wednesday, April 26, LB 333 was scheduled for floor debate. After 2.5 hours of debate, the bill did not move off of General File.

#### POSITION: OPPOSE

LB468 (Krist) Change revenue and taxation provisions. LB468 eliminates the Personal Property Tax Relief Act exemption and compensating exemption factor for tax years 2018 and 2019. LB468 also eliminates an exemption from taxation for the first ten thousand dollars of valuation on tangible property for tax years 2018 and 2019. LB468 also eliminates the reduction in the value of tangible personal

property owned by each railroad, care line company, public service entity, and air carrier for tax years 2018 and 2019. LB468 ends reimbursement to taxing subdivisions for tax revenue that will be lost because of personal property tax exemptions for tax years 2018 and 2019.

LB468 allows resident individuals from electing to subtract from federal gross adjusted income the extraordinary dividends paid on and the capital gain from sale or exchange of capital stock for taxable years beginning before January 1, 2018 and taxable years beginning on or after January 1, 2020. LB468 ends the credit to the Game and Parks Commission Capital Maintenance Fund on July 1, 2017, and ends the credit to the Highway Trust Fund on or after July 1, 2017 and before July 1, 2019. Since an emergency exists, this act takes effect when passed and approved into law.

The hearing on this measure was February 22, 2017. The bill remains held in committee.

POSITION: OPPOSE

LB367 (Krist) Change provisions relating to payment of costs in juvenile matters. LB367 requires the county to pay the costs associated with transportation when a peace officer takes a juvenile into temporary custody and a probation officer determines the need for detention or an alternative placement. LB367 requires the Office of Probation Administration to pay for costs that are related to treatment or service provisions. The bill remains held in committee.

POSITION: OPPOSE

LB510 (Ebke) Provide a restriction on installment contracts for the purchase of real or personal property by political subdivision. LB510 prohibits political subdivisions from entering into installment contracts for the purchase of real or personal property that require a total outstanding obligation exceeding twenty-five million dollars. The hearing on this bill occurred on March 9, 2017 and the bill saw a tremendous amount of opposition. The bill was not prioritized and will not likely move.

POSITION: OPPOSE

LB434 (Ebke) Change videoconferencing provisions relating to certain juvenile hearings. LB434 requires any telephone or videoconference juvenile evidentiary hearings to ensure the preservation of due process or rights of all parties. The bill has been referred to the Judiciary committee and had its public hearing on March 9, 2017.

Of note, during the hearing, Public Defender Joe Nigro appeared in the opposition position and during his testimony expressed concern that this would be viewed as a way for the county to cut costs and specifically referenced the contract negotiations between Lancaster County and the State on the housing of Juveniles. No committee members expressed any concern.

POSITION: NEUTRAL

LB658 (Wayne) Provide for expert witness appointment as prescribed in certain juvenile proceedings. LB658 grants the right to one appointed expert witness during any adjudication or disposition proceeding to the parent, guardian, or custodian of the juvenile who is the subject of the proceeding. If the parent, guardian, or custodian is indigent, the reasonable fees and expenses of such expert witness will be paid by the county. The bill has been referred to the Judiciary committee and had its hearing on March 9, 2017.

Of note, during the opposition on this bill, Senator Chambers expressed concern to NACO about their opposition to the bill. Furthermore, Senator Chambers and Senator Krist have asked Senator Ebke to send a letter to NACO asking for them to begin disclosing how certain counties vote on opposition or

support of bills. When the letters for Lancaster County and the County Attorneys Association were read into the record, Senator Chambers asked for clarification on who opposed the bill. We have not heard anything since.

POSITION: OPPOSE

LB373 (Schumacher) Change and eliminate revenue and taxation provisions. In a previous report, we provided a separate document that included highlights of those portions important to Lancaster County. Bill remains in committee. It has been mentioned that the bill as written has a long shot of coming out of committee. The county's letter of opposition to the repeal of Build Nebraska Act was read into the record.

POSITION: OPPOSE

LB461 (Smith) Correct references to a federal act in a revenue statute. This bill has been amended to include the joint efforts of the Revenue Committee and the Governor to develop both income and property tax relief. We previously attached a chart from NACO that demonstrates the effect that the bill may have – the portions dealing with property taxes – on counties.

We were asked by Commissioner Brinkman at a previous meeting to prepare a list of who is fighting LB 461. Here is the most up-to-date list that we can provide:

The bill was debated on Friday, April 20, 2017. The bill faced steep opposition. The bill did not have the required 33 votes to invoke cloture.

#### LANCASTER COUNTY ELECTED OFFICIALS/DEPARTMENT HEADS PRIORITIES

LB310 (Friesen) Change provisions relating to bridge carrying capacities and weight limits. This bill has been referred to the Transportation and Telecommunications Committee for public hearing. Engineer Dingman asked a question of us regarding the bills origin. In checking with Senator Friesen's office, the bill was brought to them by NACO through the Roads Superintendents subgroup.

There was some correspondence between Larry Dix, Joe Kohout, Pam Dingman and others to get her in

touch with the folks who had prepared LB310. The hearing on this measure was held on Monday, February 6, 2017. This bill was placed on General File on March 1, 2017.

LB51 (Schumacher) Change provisions relating to sales of real property for nonpayment of taxes. This bill was heard by the Revenue Committee. The Lancaster County Treasurers Office testified in a neutral capacity after a meeting the morning of the hearing between representatives of NACO, Larry Dix and Senator Schumacher. Senator Schumacher offered an amendment at the hearing that would alleviate the concerns raised by the Treasurer's Office. The bill was placed on General File with committee amendment AM267.

LB68 (Hilgers) Prohibit certain regulation of firearms, ammunition, and firearm accessories by counties, cities, and villages as prescribed. We were asked to work with Eric Gerard, Lincoln City Lobbyist, on this. During deliberations on this measure on Thursday, February 9, 2017 by the Board, they agreed to follow Sheriff Wagner's lead. During testimony on February 10, 2017, Sheriff Wagner, offered testimony in support with concerns. Senator Hilgers designated this as his priority bill on February 28<sup>th</sup>. Bill has been placed on General File with committee amendment AM630. We attached the amendment for your review in a previous report.

On Tuesday, April 4, 2017, the bill came up for debate. The bill was subject to a filibuster by several members of the Legislature including several members of the Lancaster County delegation. Sheriff Wagner was available in the rotunda and via cell phone to members of the delegation. He did register concerns with members of the delegation on the potential that it could affect his ability to stop individuals from carrying firearms into county buildings.

Furthermore, on Wednesday, April 12, 2017, the bill came up for further debate. After approximately 2 hours, cloture was invoked on the bill and it has advanced to Select File. Senator Chambers has vowed that he will not let any amendments be adopted to the bill. We did communicate with Sheriff Wagner prior to the bill coming up. It is our understanding from Sheriff Wagner that they have signed off on an amendment that would address his concerns. The bill still faces opposition from Senator Chambers.

POSITION: OPPOSE

LB544 (Watermeier) Provide for elimination of the office of clerk of the district court as prescribed. LB544 allows, in any county that does not have an elected clerk of the district court, for the duties of the clerk of the district court to be performed pursuant to an agreement between the State Court Administrator and the county board. LB544 also allows for a county to vote to eliminate the office of the clerk of the district court when a vacancy occurs. The bill was referred to the Judiciary Committee. This bill was heard on February 15, 2017 and remains in committee.

LB163 (Vargas) Require additional polling places prior to elections in certain counties LB163 requires election commissioners in counties with populations of more than one hundred thousand to establish at least three voting locations. The hearing was on March 16, 2017. The bill remains held in committee.

LB625 (Larson) Change the Property Assessed Clean Energy Act. LB625 allows a municipality to create a clean energy assessment district anywhere within the municipality, except a district may not be created that includes any area within the corporate boundaries of any city of village located in whole or in party within such county. The hearing on this measure was on Tuesday, February 14, 2017 and Candace Meredith testified in a neutral capacity on an amendment suggested by NACO. We expect the bill to move with that amendment attached. Bill was placed on General File with committee amendment (AM 224). LB 625 has been designated a committee priority. The bill was signed into law by the Governor on

April 27th, 2017.

LB145 (Hansen) Provide for a hearing to determine financial ability to pay fines and costs and traffic citations and provide for community service. LB145 allows for a sentencing judge or magistrate to conduct a post-hearing sentence to determine if the offender has the financial ability to pay the fines or costs associated with their infraction. If the magistrate or judge determines that the offender is able to pay the fine, but the offender refuses, the magistrate or judge may sentence the offender to imprisonment or community service. If the offender is found unable to pay the fine, the magistrate or judge may impose the sentence without costs and fines, discharge the costs and fines from the offender, or order community service as part of the sentence. If the offender is found able to pay the costs or fines in installments, the magistrate or judge may enter an order specifying the terms of a payment arrangement.

LB145 also allows for individuals who are arrested for failure to pay costs and fines to be provided a hearing in which their financial ability to pay those fines and costs can be assessed. A person who believes themselves to be financially unable to pay court costs and fines may request a hearing after an order has been issued against them. Bill was heard Thursday, March 16, 2017 before the Judiciary Committee and remains in Committee.

On Tuesday, April 19, 2017, the Judiciary Committee met and advanced LB259 with an amendment that contained the amended version of LB145. We forwarded a copy of that amendment as part of last weeks' report. Mr. Egan did review that language and provide the same to David Derbin who indicated that there may be some additional costs tied to the original version of LB 259. We discussed those concerns with Senator Hansen following this meeting last week and we are happy to report that those parts which raised concerns for Lancaster, Douglas Counties and for NACO were removed via an amendment offered by Senator Hansen.

The bill was brought back up on Select File. An amendment was adopted pushing back the effective dates on most provisions of the bill to July 1, 2018. The bill was passed and presented to the Governor on May 8, 2017.

LB395 (Morfeld) Change provisions relating to conditions of and ability to post bail. LB395 requires a court to consider all methods of bond and conditions of release to avoid pretrial incarceration. If an appearance bond is required, the court shall appoint counsel to indigent defendants. To determine if a defendant is indigent, the judge must consider the defendant's financial ability to pay a bond. The court may also order a defendant to be supervised by an approved person or organization or a pretrial services program. Bill was heard Thursday, March 16, 2017 before the Judiciary Committee and remains in Committee. Commissioner Wiltgen was present to observe the committee's questions. It is being considered that concepts of this bill, as well as LB 145, will be amended into other legislation.

Following receipt of Commissioner Wiltgen's letter, there was a request made by Senator Hansen's office to see what changes we would like to see in LB145 and LB395 to make them more amenable to the county. They appear set on increasing the "sit out rate" from \$90 to \$150 per day. Additionally, they are willing to delay implementation of the remaining provisions of LB145 by one year. In so far as LB395 is concerned, they are willing to consider striking everything from the bill and leaving only section 4 in place. In addition, they are willing to consider changing the evidentiary hearing to telephone conference similar to process for appointment of a public defender.

LB385 (Lindstrom) Change provisions relating to the burden of proof and who may appeal under the Tax Equalization and Review Commission Act. LB385 allows those with a relationship to the taxpayer to

execute an appeal on behalf of the taxpayer. The specific relationships are: A person or entity with a contract executed by the taxpayer, a person with the power of attorney, a person with a durable power of attorney, and a person who is a trustee of an estate. LB385 requires the county board of equalization, in appeals regarding the assessed value of the property that has been increased by more than 5%, to prove by a preponderance of the evidence that the assessed value reflects the property's actual value. The hearing on this measure was on Wednesday, March 1, 2017.



LB151 requires any entity that is audited or examined to provide to the Auditor of Public Accounts a detailed written description of any corrective action to be taken in response to the audit on or before six months after the issuance of a report by the Auditor of Public Accounts. The Auditor of Public accounts must then electronically submit a report of any findings of such investigation to the Governor, the appropriate standing committee, and the Appropriations of the Committee. LB151 also eliminates the duty of Auditor of Public Accounts to conduct all audits and examinations in a timely manner and in accordance with the standards for audits of government organizations, program, activities, and functions published by the Comptroller General of the United States.

LB263 requires the Department of Motor Vehicles to implement an electronic dealer services system. A licensed dealer may voluntarily participate in the system and provide titling and registration services. Any licensed dealer who chooses to participate may collect from a purchaser of a vehicle all appropriate certification of title fees, notation of lien fees, registration fees, registration fees, motor vehicle taxes and fees, and sales taxes. All fees collected must be remitted to the appropriate authorities. Any licensed dealer who chooses to participate shall use this system to electronically submit title, registration, and lien information to the Vehicle Title and Registration System. License plates, registration certificates, and certificates of title will be delivers as provided under the Motor Vehicle Certificate of Title Act and the Motor Vehicle Registration Act.

LB263 limits a political subdivisions liability for any claim based on negligent issuances of a certificate of title under the Motor Vehicle Certification of Title Act and the State Boat Act when such title is issued upon an application filed electronically by an approved licensed dealer participating in the electronic dealer services system.

LB263 also provides that, if a certificate of title is an electronic certificate of title record, the name of the owner may be changed electronically without the need to print a new certificate of title.

LB268 gives county courts concurrent original jurisdiction with the district court to determine contribution rights under section 68-919. LB268 changes the fee schedule for recording certificates of foreclosure.

LB268 requires notice of appointment of personal representatives to be provided to DHHS if the decedent was 55 years or older. The notice must be provided to the department in a delivery manner and at an address designated by the department. Any notice that fails to conform with such manner is void and constitutes neither notice to the department nor a waiver application.

LB268 changes the term "Medicaid" to "medical assistance" for purposes of reimbursement of claims after a trustor has died. If no medical assistance payment is due, DHHS may waiver this restriction after receipt of the trustee's request.

LB268 allows for part of a deed filing fee to be used for preserving and maintaining public records of a register of deeds office that has been consolidated with another county officer and for the modernization and technology needs relating to those records.

LB268 eliminates the uniform fee, payable to the Secretary of State, for presenting for filing and indexing and for filing and indexing each notice of lien or certificate or notice affecting the lien pursuant to the Uniform Federal Lien Registration Act.

LB268 also changes the Medical Assistance Act. LB268 requires any applicant for medical assistance to disclose their interests in any real estate, trust, corporation, LLC, or other entity. Applicants must also disclose any income derived from such interests and whether the income is generated directly or indirectly. Any assistance obtained after a willful failure to disclose will be deemed unlawfully obtained and recovery may be sought. If, during the transferer's lifetime, an interest in real estate is irrevocably transfers to a related transferee for less than full consideration, the related transferee will be subject to a lien in favor of the State of Nebraska for medical assistance reimbursement to the extent necessary to secure payment subject to stipulated restrictions. LB268 also states that a medical provider shall have the authority of a guardian and conservator for the limited purpose of making application for medical assistance on behalf of a person whom the provider is treating if the person is unconscious or otherwise unable to apply for medical assistance and does not have an existing power of attorney or a court-appointed official to apply on their behalf. When DHHS provides medical assistance to a person because of third party's wrongful act or negligence, the department has the right to recover the medical assistance costs from that third party.

LB417 eliminates a provision requiring the department to report to the Governor, the Legislation, and the Medicaid Reform Council on the implementation of rules and regulations, Medicaid state plan amendments, and waivers adopted under the Medicaid Sistance Act and their effects

LB417 eliminates provisions requiring the divisions to notify the Governor and Legislature when the occupancy of the licensed psychiatric hospital beds of any regional center reaches twenty percent or less of its capacity. LB417 also eliminates provision that have been outdated.

LB417 allows senior volunteers to receive transportation expenses, one free meal, and an annual physical examination. LB417 eliminates provisions that provided senior volunteers with an hourly stipend.

LB193 changes terminology of statutes dealing with courts. The term "docket" is replaced with "file." The term "trial docket" is used to reference the lower court's schedule. LB193 requires clerks to enter judgements in the judgment index instead of the judgment record or journal.

LB193 requires sheriffs to file a notice on the record whenever the levy of attachment or execution on real estate is to be used as notice. LB193 also allows offers for settlements for the recovery of money to be served on the parties' attorneys as well as the parties themselves.

LB193 requires clerks to send a the final order after the entry of any final judgment either through the United States mail or by service through the court's electronic case management system. LB193 requires that sureties for stays of execution be recorded on the register of actions and entered by the clerk on the judgment index.

LB193 requires every clerk to maintain and preserve a file and record of all papers delivered to them in every action or special proceedings. Retention and disposition of the records shall be determined by the State Records Administrator pursuant to the Records Management Act. The clerk of the district court is required to maintain records on the court's electronic case management system. Retention and disposition of the records shall be determined by the State Records Administrator pursuant to the Records Management Act. The case file is required to be in chronological order and contain the pleadings, orders, court actions, judgement, verdicts, postjudgement actions, and other documents in the case file. The case file may be maintained as an electronic document through the court's electronic case management system. The file may also be maintained in a paper volume and disposed of when determined by the State Records Administrator pursuant to the Records Management Act.

LB193 requires the trial docket be available for the court on the first day of each month. The docket must set forth each case pending in the order of the filing of the complaint to be called for trial.

LB193 adds new definitions that apply to clerk of other courts of record. Definitions for Fee Record, General Index, Judge's Notes, Judgment Index, Register of Actions, and Trial Docket are added

LB193 requires, whenever there is a transfer order from county court to district court, the county court must file the Certification of the proceedings, all original documents of the action, certification of the transcript of the register of actions, and the certification of the court costs within ten days.

LB193 requires that, when there is a change of venue, the clerk of the original court must file all original documents and a certification of the transcript of the register of cations, certification of the proceedings, and certification of the court costs to the clerk of the new court.

LB193 requires that the stenography notes of a court reporter be preserved and sealed.

LB193 requires the clerks of the district court to use the court's electronic case management system provided by the state as the record of receipts and reimbursements.

LB193 eliminates the requirement that the foreman and secretary of volunteer fire departments file in the office of the clerk of the district court a certified copy of the rolls of their respective companies on the first day of April and October in each year.

LB193 requires juvenile court judges to keep a record of all proceeding of the court in every case. These case files will contain the pleadings, order, court actions, judgments, postjudgment actions, and other documents. The case file may be maintained as an electronic document through the court's electronic case management system. The case file may also be maintained in a paper volume and disposed of when determined by the State Records Administrator pursuant to the Records Management Act.

LB193 requires the State Court Administrator to make available petitions for pregnant women who want to get abortions without parental consent on a website maintained by the Supreme Court.

LB194 prohibits Credit Services Organizations from charging any brokerage or other fees or charges in connection with a loan governed by the Nebraska Installment Loan Act. LB194 also adds definitions for the Delayed Deposit Services Licensing Act. LB194 provides that any delayed deposit loan that is made by a person who is not licensed as required is void and the person making the deposit has no right to collect, receive, or retain any principle, interest, fees, or other charges associated with such loan. LB194 also changes the nonrefundable application fee from five hundred dollars to one thousand dollars. LB194 arsies the asset requirement of an applicant from twenty-five thousand dollars available for operating the delayed deposit service business to fifty thousand dollars. LB194 raises the fee required for requesting a change of location a branch or designated principle place of business from one hundred fifty dollars to five hundred dollars.

LB194 stipulates the documentation requirement for each delayed deposit loan transaction and what information should be contained in the written agreement. Licensee are also required to openly display a schedule of all finance charges, fees, interest, other charges, and penalties for all services provided.

LB312 eliminates Motor vehicles, motorboat trade-ins, newspapers, laundromator and telefloral deliveries from being included under "consumer goods" for the purpose of a report created by the department for the purpose of reviewing the major tax exemptions for which state general funds are used to reduce the impact of revenue lost due to a tax expenditure. From the same report, under "nonprofits, governments, and exempt entities" the Nebraska lottery, admissions to school events, and fine art purchases by a museum are eliminated. From the same report, all provisions are eliminated under "services purchased for nonbusiness use" and replaced with only household professional services. Prepaid calling arrangements are also eliminated form "telecommunications."

LB417 eliminates provisions concerning the alternative response implementation plan. LB417 also eliminates a provision requiring associations that receive juveniles under the Nebraska Juvenile Code to report to the department its condition, management, and competency. LB417 also eliminates a provision requiring the department to submit an annual summary and analysis of the medical assistance program to the Medicaid Reform Council. LB417 eliminates a provision requiring the department to report to the Governor, the Legislation, and the Medicaid Reform Council on the implementation of rules and regulations, Medicaid state plan amendments, and waivers adopted under the Medical Assistance Act and their effects.

LB417 eliminates provisions requiring the divisions to notify the Governor and Legislature when the occupancy of the licensed psychiatric hospital beds of any regional center reaches twenty percent or less of its capacity. LB417 also eliminates provision that have been outdated.

LB417 allows senior volunteers to receive transportation expenses, one free meal, and an annual physical examination. LB417 eliminates provisions that provided senior volunteers with an hourly stipend.

LB417 requires the department to make annual grants in an amount not to exceed twenty-five thousand dollars. As a condition to receiving a grant, an application must obtain at least ten percent matching funds from local sources. LB417 also requires the department to develop a quality assurance plan to promote and monitor quality relating to services for persons with developmental disabilities.

LB487 exempts a person from violating the Uniform Controlled Substance Act if: such person made a good faith request for emergency medical assistance in response to a drug overdose of himself, herself, or another; such person was the first person to make a request for medical assistance as soon as the drug overdose was apparent; the evidence for the violation of the UCSA was obtained as the result of the drug overdose and request for medical assistance; such requesting person remained on the scene until medical assistance arrived; and such requesting person cooperated with medical assistance or law enforcement.

LB487 also prohibits administrative action, criminal prosecution, and civil liability against an emergency responder or peace officer who, in good faith, administers naloxone to a person who is apparently experiencing an opioid-related overdose.

Portions of LB167, LB293, and LB296, as amended by AM276, have been amended into LB487 via AM568.

Dear Mr. Wiltgen,

I am requesting the County Board approve the hiring of a deputy sheriff in August, 2017, to replace Deputy Sheriff Craig Schnieder, whose last day at work is approximately October 31, 2017, with final retirement date near January 1, 2018.

The Nebraska Law Enforcement Training Center (NLETC) provides Basic Law Enforcement Certification Training for our new employees. NLETC recently enlarged their class size while reducing the number of classes offered each year to two. For 2017, the next class begins August 20, 2017, and graduates December 15. As you can see, if we wait until Deputy Schnieder retires, we will not be able to get a student into Basic Training until the planned January, 2018, class, once they graduate, they would begin their Field Training which would not be complete until July 2018.

We currently have an active eligibility list for new deputy sheriffs. With the Board's approval, we plan to offer a letter of intent to a prospective new deputy sheriff in May, with a starting date of approximately August 14, 2017. We will have both the new deputy sheriff and Deputy Schnieder on the payroll simultaneously for approximately 5 months, resulting in an approximate\$18,000 fiscal impact. The six months after Deputy Schnieder's retirement will save approximately \$10,000. (topped out deputy – entry level deputy X six months.) We will make up the additional \$8,000 through attrition in the coming budget year (FY 17-18)
