Sobriety Checkpoint.

I would like to propose setting up a sobriety checkpoint to be run in conjunction with the "Drive Sober or Get Pulled Over." crackdown. This is a nationwide campaign directed at cracking down on drunk and impaired drivers. As you know traffic checkpoints have been successful in other traffic related areas and I feel sobriety checkpoints can be equally successful in reducing the number of drunk drivers.

In addition to the sobriety checkpoint and to continue the "Drive Sober or Get Pulled Over." crackdown efforts I propose the Lancaster County Sheriff's Office increase the number of deputies patrolling Lancaster County on Saturday and Sunday nights during the Labor Day weekend.

Please review the following information regarding the proposed sobriety checkpoint.

- I. The proposed sobriety checkpoint is scheduled for August 31, 2018, which is the Friday night before a Nebraska home football game and the start of the Labor Day weekend. The checkpoint will be operational from 2100 hours until 0200 hours. Vehicles will be selected in a systematic fashion and checked for alcohol usage and to assure the driver has the proper paperwork in the vehicle. If signs of alcohol usage are present, a DWI investigation will be conducted. If there are no signs of alcohol usage, the vehicle will be allowed to continue without further delay.
- II. The location for the sobriety checkpoint has not been determined. Locations on the main highways and streets leading into Lincoln are being considered due to the increase in traffic for the holiday weekend as well as the Nebraska home football game.
- III. I propose 12 deputies and a sergeant be utilized for the sobriety checkpoint. To keep the amount of overtime compensation to a minimum, the nonessential deputies from second shift would be utilized for the checkpoint and the 4 deputies assigned to Sergeant Soflin's shift would start early, which would require overtime compensation prior to the beginning of their regularly scheduled work time.
- IV. Sergeant Scriven and his shift would be utilized to cover the calls for service during the hours of operation while the 4 deputies assigned to Sergeant Soflin's shift are conducting the checkpoint.
- V. 8 additional deputies would be needed for the sobriety checkpoint. These deputies would require overtime compensation. A mini grant can be acquired through the Nebraska Department of Transportation Highway Safety Office to cover the overtime compensation for the deputies involved.
- VI. Three additional deputies would be added on Saturday, September 01, 2018, and Sunday, September 02, 2018, from 2000 hours to 0200 hours. These deputies would continue the crackdown efforts by working traffic on an individual basis and will concentrate their efforts on increasing the detection of impaired driving violations and other alcohol related violations.
- VII. Staff members of MADD Nebraska have offered to assist by documenting vehicle information as the vehicles enter the checkpoint.
