8. General purpose for grant: (2-3 sentences)
The following are state competitive grants through Juvenile Services administered by the Nebraska Crime Commission. The purpose of these funds is to provide services to youth who are either in the juvenile justice system or at risk of entering they system.

Project RESTORE- Serves youth 12-15 years of age inside Lincoln Public Middle and High Schools. The program holds youth accountable for their behavior through restorative justice practices and encourages behavior change.

Boys and Girls Club- Formula for Impact- The Formula for Impact is a program to increase positive impact on youth. It prioritizes outcomes in the areas of academic success, good character and citizenship, and healthy lifestyles.
Requesting- \$60,000
Match- \$159,136

The HUB- Back on Track- The goal of the program is to support young people who are identified by the school as habitually truant, credit deficient, and in danger of falling off track to graduate on time. The Back on Track program supports young people and families who are dealing with difficult situations that prevent the young people from reaching their educational goals.

Match- \$72,500

Asian Community Center- Serving Refugee and Other Immigrant Youth - This project will serve 60 middle and high school youth who are immigrants or refugees in Lincoln. The program will target 5 of the *40 Developmental Assets* in their 4 central programs: Life After High School, Digital Storytelling, Young Women's Leadership Council and Young Men's Community Council.

Match- \$23,265

Girl Scouts-Refugee Outreach - Girl Scouts Spirit of Nebraska will provide the Girl Scout Leadership Experience (GSLE) year-round to 150 Lincoln refugee girls regardless of their financial ability. Girl Scouts encourages girls to participate in philanthropy and community engagement as well as learning about diverse populations and cultures worldwide

Requesting \$21,356

Match- \$21,203

The Bay- All Access/Find your Grind Collective - All Access Pass program allows targeted at-risk youth to get free access to the Skate Park, coffee shop and shows, and will also provide them with a healthy meal and a mentor through the Heartland Big Brother Big Sister program, as well as education through the Find Your Grind Collective. The Find Your Grind (FYG) Collective, a digital art space and program, will provide all members of our community with an opportunity to engage and learn digital art skills pertaining to videography, photography, graphic design, coding and much more.
