8. General purpose for grant: (2-3 sentences)

Pursuant to Nebraska Revised Statute §43-2404.02, the Community-based Juvenile Services Aid Program is apportioned as aid in accordance with a formula based on the total number of residents per county and federal or state recognized Indian tribes. Enhancement funds are competitive funds resulting from counties not receiving their allocated amount. Funds received through the Community-based Juvenile Services Aid Program are used exclusively for the implementation and operation of programs or the provision of services identified in the aid recipient's community plan, including programs for local planning and service coordination; screening, assessment, and evaluation; diversion; alternatives to detention; family support services; treatment services; truancy prevention and intervention programs; pilot projects approved by the commission; payment of transportation costs to and from placements, evaluations, or services; personnel when the personnel are aligned with evidence-based treatment principles, programs, or practices; contracting with other state agencies or private organizations that provide evidence-based treatment or programs; preexisting programs that are aligned with evidence-based practices or best practices; and other services that will positively impact juveniles and families in the juvenile justice system. Programs and services shall be designed to serve and target youth who are eleven through eighteen years of age.
