STAFF MEETING MINUTES LANCASTER COUNTY BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS COUNTY-CITY BUILDING ROOM 113 - BILL LUXFORD STUDIO THURSDAY, JANUARY 11, 2018 8:30 A.M.

Commissioners Present: Todd Wiltgen, Chair; Jennifer Brinkman, Vice Chair; Roma Amundson, Bill Avery and Deb Schorr

Others Present: Kerry Eagan, Chief Administrative Officer; Ann Ames, Deputy Chief Administrative Officer; Dan Nolte, County Clerk; and Cori Beattie, Deputy County Clerk

Advance public notice of the Board of Commissioners Staff Meeting was posted on the County-City Building bulletin board and the Lancaster County, Nebraska web site and provided to the media on January 10, 2018.

The Chair noted the location of the Open Meetings Act and opened the meeting at 8:30 a.m.

1. APPROVAL OF STAFF MEETING MINUTES FOR JANUARY 4, 2018

MOTION: Brinkman moved and Amundson seconded approval of the minutes. Brinkman, Schorr, Avery, Amundson and Wiltgen voted yes. Motion carried 5-0.

2. **LEGISLATIVE UPDATE** – Joe Kohout and Brennen Miller, Kissel, Kohout, ES Associates, LLC (Legislative Consultants)

Joe Kohout, Kissel, Kohout, ES Associates, LLC, presented a legislative update (Exhibit A).

In reference to the draft bill on competency restoration, Joe Nigro, Public Defender, said a paragraph addressing treatment alternatives says if a change is made from outpatient to another alternative, the Department of Health and Human Services (HHS) should issue a report if they concur. He said switching providers could become very cumbersome if HHS has to weigh in each time.

Kohout said Senator Hansen would like the final version of the bill today for potential introduction. He suggested if the County agrees, the bill could be introduced as is and if concerns come up they could be addressed during the public hearing.

Nigro said it might be as simple as changing the language to "if the department does <u>not</u> concur...".

Kohout thought this language came directly from Senator Hansen so he cautioned changing too much at this time. Nigro suggested someone contact Senator Hansen's office today about changing that one word. Kohout and Nigro indicated that they would follow up on the item.

Sara Hoyle, Human Services Director, said juveniles caught without a fishing permit (when required) or a park permit were historically allowed to pay fines in adult court but now they are coming

through diversion or probation in Juvenile Court. After talking with Senator Pansing Brooks, Hoyle said in 2019 they may look at adjusting the age requirements for these permits. She added there also needs to be a better effort with regard to training Game and Parks employees on how to interact with kids.

With regard to LB672 (Provide for medical release for committed offenders), Kohout noted that there were some concerns about the bill's potential impact to general assistance. He noted the hearing is set for next week.

Wiltgen said Senator Krist indicated to him that the bill was drafted to start a discussion and he would like input from the affected parties so he can help find a solution. Wiltgen said it is important that these individuals be on Medicaid before they are released. Hoyle added that Corrections will need to assist inmates with the application process.

Eagan felt the response to the Governor should explain that this would be a cheaper option for the State since they are not paying Medicaid rates for their prisoners. Wiltgen said a letter should be sent detailing how this would benefit the State and counties. Kohout suggested someone provide additional information at the public hearing on January 17. Schorr agreed. Eagan said he would work with Hoyle to draft a letter for the Board's or Chair's signature next Tuesday and one of them could present it at the hearing. Eagan verified that the letter will be in a neutral position.

In reference to LB776 (Provide requirements for inmate access to telephone or videoconferencing systems in county and city jails), Brad Johnson, Corrections Director, said just over \$397,000 in revenue was collected last fiscal year. He said this money is used for inmate programming and other forms of assistance. As currently drafted, no commissions or bonuses could be collected.

Wiltgen said if the State would adopt Federal Communications Commission (FCC) standards it would help. Johnson confirmed that the County's current phone contract was amended to follow those standards. He added that part of the argument was the cost is interfering with inmates communicating with family. Johnson noted in Lancaster County the average is 1.4 calls or 12 minutes per day per inmate.

Johnson recommended the County oppose the bill and offer the FCC guidelines as an alternative. Brinkman hoped the message the Board would send is that the bill is overcorrecting and would eliminate the County's ability to do programming. She said the County should also explain how it approached the problem.

Eagan said he will work with Johnson on a letter.

With regard to LB729 (Allow claims arising out of misrepresentation or deceit under the Political Subdivisions Tort Claims Act and State Tort Claims Act), Eagan said an opinion is needed from the County Attorney on whether this would create an additional economic burden.

Kohout said hearings have been scheduled for next week on the following: LB884 (Change and eliminate provisions relating to county sales and use taxes), LB878 (Provide requirements for testimony by jailhouse informants) and LB825 (Change provisions relating to budgets and public hearing notice for certain governmental entities).

Eagan explained that LB884 would eliminate the restriction on counties taxing within incorporated jurisdictions that already have a sales tax.

In reference to LB825, Dennis Meyer, Budget and Fiscal Officer, said the qualified sinking fund is for lid purposes and he felt the proposed bill would not be an issue for the County.

Sheli Schindler, Youth Services Center Director, said LB870 (Provide for room confinement for juveniles as prescribed) overcorrects the County's response on how it deals with youth who are assaulting others and/or having safety or security issues within the facility. She requested the County Board's assistance in speaking with senators about the bill as there could be a significant fiscal impact. Schindler explained that the bill is taking hospital confinement standards and applying them to county detention facilities and the State's Youth Rehabilitation and Treatment Center (YRTC) and she does not have enough staff to provide additional direct supervision.

Brinkman said she would like to have more discussion on this bill before talking to senators about the County's position as she is not opposed to it. It was noted that additional time would be allotted during next week's legislative update to discuss this item.

Scott Gaines, Chief Administrative Deputy Assessor/Register of Deeds, said LB905 (Change the burden of proof for certain protests of real property valuations) and LB963 (Change how often real property is inspected and reviewed for property tax purposes) would both be extremely costly to implement.

Avery questioned if counties are only required to inspect a property every six years, how is the appropriate value determined in between.

Rob Ogden, Chief Field Deputy Assessor/Register of Deeds, said properties with any type of permit would be reviewed and aerial flights are performed every two years. He felt changing inspections to every three years would not be economical nor would it improve the valuation process as anything missed could be addressed during informal hearings or the board of equalization process.

Schorr asked if someone was going to testify against LB905 next Friday. Gaines said they would talk about it. Eagan suggested the Board at least take a position on both bills.

MOTION: Schorr moved and Amundson seconded to oppose LB905 and LB963 based on the County Assessor's recommendation. Amundson, Avery, Schorr, Brinkman and Wiltgen voted yes. Motion carried 5-0.

Dan Nolte, County Clerk, said LB885 (Change provisions relating to property tax protests) would require additional notifications related to property valuation protests which would be an additional cost. Kohout noted the hearing has been scheduled for January 19th.

3. RESULTS OF 2017 HEALTH RISK ASSESSMENT – Sue Eckley, County Risk Manager; Keerun Huppert, City Wellness Coordinator

Wiltgen exited the meeting at 9:20 a.m.

Keerun Huppert, City Wellness Coordinator, provided an overview of the 2017 Health Risk Assessment (see agenda packet). She noted the Wellness Committee drafted a wellness plan detailing upcoming activities based off these results.

Sue Eckley, County Risk Manager, added that many employees would like access to showers and discounts to fitness facilities. Huppert said employees should always inquire about discounts.

Wiltgen returned at 9:28 a.m.

Schorr noted that Aetna, the County's health insurance plan administrator, now offers outreach to employees with long-term health issues. She suggested that someone from Aetna attend a future Wellness Committee meeting.

4. SALARY FOR DR. SANAT ROY – Doug McDaniel, Human Resources Director

Doug McDaniel, Human Resources Director, confirmed that Dr. Sanat Roy is a part-time (30 hours per week), unclassified (MSS) employee who earns vacation, sick leave and pension. Dr. Roy is oncall seven days a week and his annual salary is \$167,983.92. McDaniel said the current contracted rate for coverage when Dr. Roy is gone is \$725/24 hours or \$264,625/year. He noted as of 2013, the average income for a psychiatrist in the United States was \$198,484. Other resources showed average annual full-time salaries ranging from \$174,797 to \$215,255. McDaniel recommended that Dr. Roy receive a 2.5% cost-of-living increase which is consistent with other County directors.

Avery asked if Dr. Roy is in the facility 30 hours a week. Scott Etherton, Mental Health Crisis Center Director, said Dr. Roy's weekly schedule varies and he does work weekends and holidays. McDaniel verified that the position is exempt.

MOTION: Brinkman moved and Amundson seconded approval of the recommendation to increase Dr. Sanat Roy's salary by 2.5%. Brinkman, Amundson, Avery, Schorr and Wiltgen voted yes. Motion carried 5-0.

Eagan said the item would be forwarded to a Tuesday County Board of Commissioners agenda for formal action.

5. **NEBRASKA DEPARTMENT OF AGRICULTURE ANNUAL REPORTS** – Brent Meyer, Weed Control Superintendent

Brent Meyer, Weed Control Superintendent, provided an overview of the annual report (see agenda packet).

Meyer distributed a handout with information on an ornamental rooster sold at a local store whereby the feathers are made of Phragmites seeds (Exhibit B). He noted the item was discovered by a representative of the United States Department of Agriculture (USDA) and it has since been removed from store shelves.

MOTION: Amundson moved and Schorr seconded to authorize the Chair to sign the annual report. Schorr, Avery, Amundson, Brinkman and Wiltgen voted yes. Motion carried 5-0.

Amundson and Brinkman exited the meeting at 10:00 a.m.

6. PURCHASE OF VEHICLE FOR RECORDS MANAGEMENT – Brian Pillard, Records & Information Manager; Bob Walla, Purchasing Agent

Brian Pillard, Records & Information Manager, said his department is renting a van since an early December accident totaled his former delivery vehicle. The rental is currently being paid for by the other party's insurance company, although, it is unknown how much longer they will cover this cost. He noted no surplus vehicles are available through the City or County. Pillard researched costs for used vehicles, specifically minivans and a Ford Transit Connect van. Prices ranged from \$5,950 to \$18,500 depending on the mileage. Another option would be to purchase a new vehicle off the State's contract. Pillard said he does not have money in his budget to cover this expense, therefore, he asked the Board for direction on how to proceed.

Brinkman returned at 10:05 a.m.

Eagan confirmed that the County received \$1,900 from the insurance company.

Amundson returned at 10:06 a.m.

Bob Walla, Purchasing Agent, said this vehicle would be a good candidate for a lease as the annual mileage is under 10,000. He said the monthly lease rate for a four-wheel drive pickup would be \$107 for 24 months or \$123 for 26 months. Another advantage of leasing is there would be no maintenance costs as everything would be fully covered. Walla added a new minivan or Ford Transit Connect would cost roughly \$22,000.

Discussion followed on various lease, rental and purchase options.

Wiltgen suggested Walla price a straight lease (not lease to own) so the Board can compare this option against purchasing a new vehicle. Walla indicated he would still need to prepare a quote for a leased vehicle but responses should be received next week. He added that in order to get government pricing, it would take about 10 weeks to get the vehicle.

Further discussion on this item was deferred to the January 18 staff meeting.

7. LABOR NEGOTIATIONS – Doug McDaniel, Human Resources Director; Nicole Gross, Manager of Compensation; Amy Sadler, Compensation Technician; Amzi Avila, Human Resources Generalist; Pam Dingman, Lancaster County Engineer; Kristi Bauer, Deputy Lancaster County Attorney

MOTION: Schorr moved and Brinkman seconded to enter Executive Session at 10:18 a.m. for the purpose of protecting the public interest with regards to labor negotiations.

The Chair said it has been moved and seconded that the Board enter into Executive Session.

ROLL CALL: Avery, Brinkman, Schorr, Amundson and Wiltgen voted yes. Motion carried 5-0.

The Chair restated the purpose for the Board entering into Executive Session.

Avery exited the meeting.

MOTION: Amundson moved and Brinkman seconded to exit Executive Session at 10:29 a.m. Brinkman, Amundson, Schorr and Wiltgen voted yes. Avery was absent. Motion carried 4-0.

Amundson exited the meeting at 10:29 a.m.

Avery returned at 10:30 a.m.

8. USE OF LAND EAST OF COUNTY EXTENSION OFFICE FOR CULTIVATING HEALTH OUR WAY (CHOW) GRANT – Karen Wobig, County Extension Education Unit Leader; Emily Gratopp, Nutrition Education Program Supervisor

Emily Gratopp, Nutrition Education Program Supervisor, provided an overview of the CHOW Grant. She said they would like to plant a garden in the space east of the Extension Building which would provide a curriculum for youth and/or other groups. She noted the space would encompass roughly 500 square feet and include only raised beds which could be easily removed in the future. It was noted the grant request is for \$1,500 and the produce raised would be donated to area food distribution centers.

Amundson returned at 10:32 a.m.

In response to Avery's question, Gratopp said Extension Program staff will help construct and maintain the garden. In the future, master gardeners may also participate.

Schorr questioned what costs will be covered by the grant. Gratopp said anything in the budget other than water.

Brinkman asked how the recipients of the produce would be determined. Gratopp said they would partner with those agencies in closest proximity such as the People's City Mission and Community Action.

MOTION: Schorr moved and Avery seconded to support the CHOW grant application including utilization of County land. Avery, Schorr, Brinkman, Amundson and Wiltgen voted yes. Motion carried 5-0.

Wiltgen asked Gratopp to keep the Board apprised of the project's progress and to let Commissioners know if volunteer gardeners are needed in the future.

9. ELECTED OFFICIAL CHIEF DEPUTY SALARIES – Joe Nigro, Public Defender

Joe Nigro, Public Defender, said his recommendation to increase Robert (Bob) Hays' salary was based on equality with the County Attorney's Office similar to the elected officials and other chief deputies.

Avery asked Nigro what he was trying to achieve. Although he was not involved in how the salaries were initially derived, Nigro thought all three deputy salaries should be the same percentage across both departments. Avery noted there is usually a merit component to justify a salary increase over the cost-of-living raise. Nigro believed these employees are different in that they get a percentage of the elected official's salary and he thought Bob Hays' percentage should be the same as Doug Cyr, Deputy County Attorney, since all the other deputies have pay equality.

Wiltgen said the Board was unaware prior to last Tuesday that Nigro was proposing a larger increase for this employee and felt there should have been an initial discussion with the Board. Nigro said he was going to bring it up at the January 4 staff meeting but, when he arrived, the item had already been addressed as the meeting was ahead of schedule.

Schorr said she was uncomfortable approving a 3.9% increase without significant justification.

Nigro reiterated that his rationale for the increase was based solely on looking at pay equality with the other positions in the County Attorney's Office.

Brinkman said she does not have a problem with the resolution as presented and felt there was no intent to mislead the Board. She said the concern expressed on Tuesday was that perhaps Nigro was trying to reward a long-time employee which he stated repeatedly is not the case.

Nigro stated the County has had a long-standing tradition of treating the positions in the two offices the same and he felt the request was reasonable.

Joe Kelly, County Attorney, said he brought this item forward and noted the two positions are entirely different including their level of management. The percentages were established years ago by the former elected officials and factored in at that time was years of service. Kelly said there can be a future discussion on appropriate chief deputy salaries, including the differences in the offices and the positions, but at this time the problem is his staff feeling that they are not adequately paid.

Brinkman voiced concern that this employee issue is taking time away from the work being done in the County Attorney's Office.

Nigro noted both offices have concerns with their Attorney IIs who have reached the salary cap and a future discussion can be held to explore options. He added he did not see how his action to increase this one salary would hurt the County Attorney's Office and felt it would be a dangerous precedent for the County Attorney to weigh in on how the Public Defender runs their office.

Schorr emphasized that the Board has been very consistent over the years with regard to setting these salaries.

MOTION: Schorr moved and Wiltgen seconded that the 2% salary increase apply to the second Deputy Public Defender salary to be consistent with the other chief deputy salaries.

Schorr added that Nigro would still have the opportunity in the future to bring forward information, with the assistance of Human Resources, to justify a different increase.

Eagan noted action was not taken last Tuesday on any of the chief deputy salaries so the item would need to come back next week.

Avery agreed with Schorr about the need for consistency going forward. He added that the process can always be changed in the future if someone shows the Board that it is no longer working. Amundson said she would like to see justification for why these salaries should be the same and perhaps Human Resources could help with that analysis.

Schorr repeated her motion.

Kelly indicated the Board should make sure the motion does not conflict with what was proposed by County Engineer Pam Dingman who made the case for a larger increase for Ken Schroeder.

Schorr reiterated that she is focusing solely on the second Deputy Public Defender.

It was noted the salary in question would increase to \$143,646.

ROLL CALL: Avery, Amundson, Schorr and Wiltgen voted yes. Brinkman voted no. Motion carried 4-1.

10. CHIEF ADMINISTRATIVE OFFICER REPORT

H. Claim For Review: Payment Voucher (PV) No. 596473 from the Public Defender to Joseph Nigro in the Amount of \$104.33 for Mileage. The County Board has requested a Review of All Claims from Elected Officials.

Nigro provided an explanation of the claim.

MOTION: Brinkman moved and Avery seconded to handle the claim through the regular claims process. Brinkman, Schorr, Avery, Amundson and Wiltgen voted yes. Motion carried 5-0.

F. Claim for Review: Payment Voucher (PV) No. 596029 from Lancaster County Extension Office to Jaclynn J. Foged in the Amount of \$3.22. The County Board has requested a Review of All Claims for Employee Reimbursement Other than those Related to Travel for County Business.

Wobig provided an explanation of Items 10F and 10G.

MOTION: Brinkman moved and Schorr seconded to handle the claim through the regular claims process. Schorr, Amundson, Avery, Brinkman and Wiltgen voted yes. Motion carried 5-0.

G. Claim for Review: Payment Voucher (PV) No. 596027 from Lancaster County Extension Office to Mary Jane Frogge in the Amount of \$32.66. The County Board has requested a Review of All Claims for Employee Reimbursement Other than Those Related to Travel for County Business.

MOTION: Brinkman moved and Schorr seconded to handle the claim through the regular claims process. Amundson, Schorr, Brinkman, Avery and Wiltgen voted yes. Motion carried 5-0.

E. Claim for Review – Payment Voucher (PV) No. 596064 from Community Corrections to Bio Medical Corp in the Amount of \$1,775.27. This Claim is Beyond the 90 Day Time Period.

Kim Etherton, Community Corrections Director, provided an explanation of the claim.

MOTION: Schorr moved and Amundson seconded to handle the claim through the regular claims process. Avery, Brinkman, Amundson, Schorr and Wiltgen voted yes. Motion carried 5-0.

A. Trabert Hall Sale

Eagan noted that he recently spoke to Topher Hansen, Chief Executive Officer, CenterPointe, regarding CenterPointe's interest in purchasing Trabert Hall (see November 2, 2017 Staff Meeting minutes) and to see when he might be available to update the Board on their progress. Eagan added if the property is declared surplus, the Board would have to start over with the entire sale process.

Schorr indicated that she is ready to move forward as the sale proceeds have been designated this fiscal year to pay for relocating Emergency Management.

Eagan said Hansen is still working on their proposal but he should have something ready to present to the Board soon. Wiltgen felt the Board could wait a week but he was concerned about future cash flow issues.

Brinkman said CenterPointe's project would be a good fit for the community and Hansen should be given a week or two to complete the proposal as it is quite complex. She noted the County has \$1,300,000 in contingency funds which could be used to bridge cash flow problems if they arise.

Amundson agreed with Brinkman but stressed that Hansen should know that the County Board is at a point where it needs to make a decision on Trabert Hall.

Wiltgen asked Eagan to contact Hansen about providing an update to the Board.

B. Tuesday County Board Meeting Agenda

Brinkman suggested that more items, such as contract amendments and those receiving unanimous approval of a recommendation at a previous meeting, be listed under "Consent" on the Tuesday agenda to reduce the number of votes taken. It was noted the County Attorney's Office made other changes to the resolution to update language and the Tuesday meeting start time.

Avery exited the meeting at 11:25 a.m.

Cori Beattie, Deputy County Clerk, offered additional changes for consideration:

- 1. Add the word "typically" before "on the second and third Tuesday of each calendar month..." in the last paragraph of Section 2a.
- 2. Change the reference for posting of agendas to accommodate special deadlines and/or meeting dates in the first paragraph of Section 3. Also, change the reference to when staff meeting agendas are posted.
- 3. Include wording related to the deadline for submitting agenda items to the County Attorney for review and add "Deputy Chief Administrative Officer" to the list of those who can add items to the agenda after the deadline in the third paragraph of Section 3.
- 4. Change the word "announcement" to "agenda" in the last sentence of Section 5a.
- 5. Change "each January" to "as necessary" in the second sentence of Section 7.

Avery returned at 11:32 a.m.

Eagan said he would need to review the proposed changes.

C. Prudential 2017 4th Quarter Investment Review

The consensus was to schedule the review on March 8th. Brinkman asked that the presentation focus more on Lancaster County issues as opposed to a complete market overview.

Brinkman exited the meeting at 11:38 a.m.

D. Mileage Reimbursement Form

Amundson questioned if the form should include justifying the cost of mileage reimbursement versus car rental. A draft comparison form was displayed (Exhibit C).

The consensus was to proceed with the new mileage form and to incorporate the comparison form once a car rental contract has been approved.

Beattie indicated that their office would post the new form online and email it to departments so they are aware of the change.

Items 10E-10H were moved forward on the agenda.

11. CHIEF DEPUTY ADMINISTRATIVE OFFICER REPORT

A. Electronic Device Policy

Ann Ames, Deputy Chief Administrative Officer, asked for feedback on the policy.

With regard to Section 5.5, Wiltgen suggested inserting a period after the word "causes" and deleting the remainder of the sentence.

Schorr asked that the policy be shared with the Management Team.

Ames confirmed that additional costs would be associated with the new policy as certain employees will be issued County mobile phones. Schorr suggested that this be discussed at the Mid-Year Budget Review.

Wiltgen supported the separation of business and personal use on electronic devices, especially for elected officials. Ames reminded the Board that they must retain all county-related text messages received on their personal devices.

Ames said she would forward the policy to the Management Team for feedback and would also ask each department to provide an estimate on the number of devices they would need.

B. Nebraska Interactive Contract Discussion

Ames said the County Attorney's Office has concerns with the contract terms as the State Records Board becomes a third party to the contract. She noted that while the State Records Board oversees the work of Nebraska Interactive, they do not want to micromanage projects. She added Sarpy County recently updated their website through Nebraska Interactive and had no problems.

Ames discussed the options for moving forward, including issuing a Request for Proposal (RFP) which would delay things another 3-4 months.

The consensus was to continue working to bring the contract to a Tuesday County Board meeting for formal action.

Minette Genuchi, Administrative Assistant to the County Board, indicated the meeting would begin and 8:30 a.m. and last most of the day. She said she has contacted Premier Catering about delivering lunch and those who participate will be responsible for covering the cost of their meal.

13. DISCUSSION OF BOARD MEMBER MEETINGS ATTENDED

A. Public Building Commission (PBC) Chair Meeting with Mayor – Amundson

Amundson said they discussed the security survey results and how to proceed. She also noted that University of Nebraska architecture students have moved back into Old City Hall.

B. Lancaster County Board Chair/Vice Chair Meeting with Mayor – Wiltgen/Brinkman

Wiltgen said they discussed Lincoln's Citizen Transportation Coalition and how the County will be complementing the City's report. Wilderness Park was also discussed, as was the consultant RFP for the CJIS (Criminal Justice Information Services) update.

C. Public Building Commission (PBC) – Amundson/Brinkman

Amundson said they approved various payments for building projects. The security survey indicated that employees do not favor a single point of entry but many would like additional security cameras and lighting. She noted there will be changes to the Hall of Justice entry but no others.

D. Lincoln-Lancaster County Board of Health – Avery

Avery said they acted on three items – the annual report, a summary of accomplishments and revisions to the Lincoln Municipal Code dealing with the Food Code. They also discussed the bill proposing to repeal the helmet law which most opposed.

E. Lancaster County Mental Health Crisis Center Advisory Committee - Avery

Avery said they discussed locks, CREDIBLE software and the therapy dog.

RE: Weekly Update

Good morning. Today is day 7 of the 2018 Legislature. On Monday of this week, the Legislature commenced full-day debate and continued that process through yesterday. Much of this weeks' debate was taken up with debate on LB368 that would have repealed Nebraska's helmet law. On an agreed-to motion to invoke cloture, the bill failed to invoke cloture by 3 votes.

On Tuesday, the Legislature took up LB81, a bill to increase the amount paid by individuals to counties for a handgun permit from \$5 to \$25. While initially the bill looked as though it had the requisite support, Senator Tyson Larson filed a kill motion on the bill and obtained 27 votes to do so. We have provided the list of how the delegation voted for your review.

Yesterday, the Governor provided his State of the State address. His focus was on mid-biennium adjustments and income and property tax relief. We would note that there is a recommended reduction in County Juvenile Services Aid of \$126,000 in FY17-18 and \$252,000 in FY18-19.

In his property tax recommendation, the bill focuses on creating a refundable tax credit that would go to residents against their income taxes. It would utilize the current property tax credit funds.

LANCASTER COUNTY LEGISLATIVE PRIORITIES

Purchasing Thresholds. We have provided information to Senator Hilgers and have asked him to consider introduction of this bill.

Competency Restoration. Copies of the draft legislation has been sent to the county attorney's office as well as the public defender's office. It is our understanding that the public defender has some thoughts on whether or not the division of behavioral health should have a role in the process. We hope to have the bill in the form that it can be introduced early next week.

Game law & Juvenile Diversion. Earlier this week, we had a conference call meeting discussing this legislation with Senator Pansing Brooks. It appears that there is some desire to do something on this issue but it may need to wait until 2019. It appears conversations have occurred with the County Attorney's Office and may not require action this year.

LANCASTER COUNTY ELECTED OFFICIALS/DEPARTMENT HEADS PRIORITIES

LB672 (Krist) Provide for medical release for committed offenders. LB672 allows for an offender who has been committed because of a medial or physical condition to be considered for medial release if they are determined to be terminally ill or permanently incapacitated. Prior to granting release, the department must review the medial, institutional, and criminal records of the offender and any additional medial evidence. To qualify for medial release, the offender must agree to placement for medical treatment. If, during medial release, the offender's condition improves such that they are no longer eligible for release, the department may direct that they be returned to custody pending a hearing. The offender will receive credit for time served on medial release toward the balance of their sentence.

There is a potential cost that could be incurred if the recently released go onto the County's General Assistance program. The hearing on this bill has been scheduled for January 17, 2018 before the Judiciary Committee.

LB776 (McCollister) Provide requirements for inmate access to telephone or videoconferencing systems in county and city jails. LB776 requires each county and city jail to make available either a prepaid telephone call system or collect telephone calls system for telephone services for inmates. The Jail Standards Board is required to ensure that county and city jails are providing inmates with affordable and meaningful means to communicate by telephone or videoconferencing with inmates' families, loved ones, and counsel.

There is some concern about what the term "reasonable" means in this legislation. The hearing on this bill has been scheduled for January 18, 2018 before the Judiciary Committee.

LB729 (Wayne) Allow claims arising out of misrepresentation or deceit under the Political Subdivisions Tort Claims Act and State Tort Claims Act. LB729 allows for claims arising out of misrepresentation and deceit under the Political Subdivision Tort Claims Act and State Tort Claims Act.

The hearing on this bill has been scheduled for January 25, 2018 before the Judiciary Committee.

LANCASTER COUNTY SPREADSHEET AND HEARING SPREADSHEET

Attached, please find two documents: the first is the weekly spreadsheet that we update on a daily basis during session. This is provided to you each Thursday and again over the weekend.

Second, is the spreadsheet of hearings that have been flagged for hearings during the next week. I would note a few of the following for your comment:

LB884 (Harr) Change and eliminate provisions relating to county sales and use taxes. LB884 allows for the imposed sales and use taxes to be used for economic development or manufacturing/industrial site development. LB884 also eliminates applicability to municipalities in certain sections. Set for hearing on January 18, 2018 before Revenue Committee.

LB874 (Ebke) Provide requirements for testimony by jailhouse informants. LB878 presumes that the testimony of a jailhouse informant is unreliable. LB878 applies to any case in which a suspect or

defendant is charged with any offense. LB878 requires prosecutors to keep a record of the use of testimony or information provided by a jailhouse informant against a suspect or defendant's interest while the informant was imprisoned or confined, and any benefits offered or provided to the informant in exchange for such testimony.

Under LB878, if a prosecutor intends to use the testimony of a jailhouse informant, they must disclose to the defense any information in their possession, custody, or control including the criminal history of the informant, any benefit or deal made with the informant, the specific statements allegedly made by the defendant against which the informant will testify, any previous testimony by the informant, and any occasion in which the informant had previously recanted testimony. This information must be disclosed as soon as practicable, and no later than thirty days before trial.

LB878 requires the court to conduct a hearing to determine whether testimony from the jailhouse informant is reliable, unless waived by the defendant. The prosecutor must demonstrate reliability by clear and convincing evidence. LB878 also provides a standard cautionary instruction to be delivered by the court to the jury anytime the testimony of a jailhouse informant is used. Set for hearing on January 18, 2018 before the Judiciary Committee.

LB825 (Brewer) Change provisions relating to budgets and public hearing notice for certain government entities. LB825 eliminates the definition of qualified sinking fund. LB825 also exempts from the limitations in section 13-520 restricted funds pledged to retire bonds as defined in subdivision (1) of section 10-134 and approved according to law and restricted funds. LB825 also changes the notice requirement for special public hearings associated with property taxes. Under LB825, notice must be published in a newspaper of general circulation at least four calendar days prior to the hearing. Those four calendar days include the day of publication, but not the day of the hearing. Set for hearing on January 17, 2018 before the Government Committee.

LB193 requires sheriffs to file a notice on the record whenever the levy of attachment or execution on real estate is to be used as notice. LB193 also allows offers for settlements for the recovery of money to be served on the parties' attorneys as well as the parties themselves.

LB193 requires clerks to enter judgements in the judgment index instead of the judgment record or journal.

LB193 requires clerks to send a the final order after the entry of any final judgment either through the United States mail or by service through the court's electronic case management system. LB193 requires that sureties for stays of execution be recorded on the register of actions and entered by the clerk on the judgment index.

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> LB193 requires every clerk to maintain and preserve a file and record of all papers delivered to them in every action or special proceedings. Retention and disposition of the records shall be determined by the State Records Administrator pursuant to the Records Management Act. The clerk of the district court is required to maintain records on the court's electronic case management system. Retention and disposition of the records shall be determined by the State Records Administrator pursuant to the Records Management Act. The case file is required to be in chronological order and contain the pleadings, orders, court actions, judgement, verdicts, postjudgement actions, and other documents in the case file. The case file may be maintained as an electronic document through the court's electronic case management system. The file may also be maintained in a paper volume and disposed of when determined by the State Records Administrator pursuant to the Records Management Act.

LB193 requires the trial docket be available for the court on the first day of each month. The docket must set forth each case pending in the order of the filing of the complaint to be called for trial.

LB193 adds new definitions that apply to clerk of other courts of record. Definitions for Fee Record, General Index, Judge's Notes, Judgment Index, Register of Actions, and Trial Docket are added.

LB193 requires, whenever there is a transfer order from county court to district court, the county court must file the Certification of the proceedings, all original documents of the action, certification of the transcript of the register of actions, and the certification of the court costs within ten days.

LB193 requires that, when there is a change of venue, the clerk of the original court must file all original documents and a certification of the transcript of the register of cations, certification of the proceedings, and certification of the court costs to the clerk of the new court.

LB193 requires that the stenography notes of a court reporter be preserved and sealed.

LB193 requires the clerks of the district court to use the court's electronic case management system provided by the state as the record of receipts and reimbursements.

LB193 eliminates the requirement that the foreman and secretary of volunteer fire departments file in the office of the clerk of the district court a certified copy of the rolls of their respective companies on the first day of April and October in each year.

LB193 requires juvenile court judges to keep a record of all proceeding of the court in every case. These case files will contain the pleadings, order, court actions, judgments, postjudgment actions, and other documents. The case file may be maintained as an electronic document through the court's electronic case management system. The case file may also be maintained in a paper volume and disposed of when determined by the State Records Administrator pursuant to the Records Management Act.

LB193 requires the State Court Administrator to make available petitions for pregnant women who want to get abortions without parental consent on a website maintained by the Supreme Court.

LB194 prohibits Credit Services Organizations from charging any brokerage or other fees or charges in connection with a loan governed by the Nebraska Installment Loan Act. LB194 also adds definitions for the Delayed Deposit Services Licensing Act. LB194 provides that any delayed deposit loan that is made by a person who is not licensed as required is void and the person making the deposit has no right to collect, receive, or retain any principle, interest, fees, or other charges associated with such loan. LB194 also changes the nonrefundable application fee from five hundred dollars to one thousand dollars. LB194 also raises the asset requirement of an applicant from twenty-five thousand dollars available for operating the delayed deposit service business to fifty thousand dollars. LB194 raises the fee required for requesting a change of location a branch or designated principle place of business from one hundred fifty dollars to five hundred dollars.

LB194 stipulates the documentation requirement for each delayed deposit loan transaction and what information should be contained in the written agreement. Licensee are also required to openly display a schedule of all finance charges, fees, interest, other charges, and penalties for all services provided.

This act designates each reservation in the state as a special economic impact zone. For taxable years beginning on or after January 1, 2018, a qualified business located in a special economic impact zone may exclude any income derived from sources within a special economic impact zone when calculating its income tax liability to the state. Beginning January 1, 2018, such businesses are also exempt from the sales and use taxes due for the first ten million dollars of eligible purchases made each year.

LB312 eliminates Motor vehicles, motorboat trade-ins, newspapers, laundromats, and telefloral deliveries from being included under "consumer goods" for the purpose of a report created by the department for the purpose of reviewing the major tax exemptions for which state general funds are used to reduce the impact of revenue lost due to a tax expenditure. From the same report, under "nonprofits, governments, and exempt entities" the Nebraska lottery, admissions to school events, and fine art purchases by a museum are eliminated. From the same report, all provisions are eliminated under "services purchased for nonbusiness use" and replaced with only household professional services. Prepaid calling arrangements are also eliminated form "telecommunications."

LB312 also removes the exemptions under gross income received for animal specialty services for the purpose of determining gross receipts for providing a service. Other sources of gross are added to the definition of gross receipts for providing a service are added in section 2.

LB312 allows the credit from trading in motor vehicles, motorboats, all-terrain vehicles and utility-type vehicles to be used when computing the Sales price.
