Advance public notice of the Board of Commissioners Staff Meeting was posted on the County-City Building bulletin board and the Lancaster County, Nebraska web site and provided to the media on February 7, 2018.

The Chair noted the location of the Open Meetings Act and opened the meeting at 8:31 a.m.

1. APPROVAL OF STAFF MEETING MINUTES FOR JANUARY 25, 2018 AND MID-YEAR BUDGET REVIEW MINUTES FOR FEBRUARY 1, 2018

MOTION: Brinkman moved and Amundson seconded approval of the January 25, 2018 Staff Meeting minutes. Amundson, Brinkman and Wiltgen voted yes. Avery and Schorr were absent. Motion carried 3-0.

MOTION: Brinkman moved and Amundson seconded approval of the February 1, 2018 Mid-Year Budget Review minutes. Brinkman, Amundson and Wiltgen voted yes. Avery and Schorr were absent. Motion carried 3-0.

2. **LEGISLATIVE UPDATE** – Gordon Kissel, Joe Kohout, and Brennen Miller, Kissel, Kohout, ES Associates, LLC (Legislative Consultants)

Joe Kohout, Kissel, Kohout, ES Associates, LLC, presented a weekly legislative update and legislative bill summaries (Exhibits A-C).

Avery arrived at the meeting at 8:34 a.m.

Kohout submitted two documents regarding Legislative Bill (LB)1010 (Change procedures for determining competency to stand trial in counties containing a city of the primary class) which was introduced by Senator Matt Hansen on behalf of Lancaster County. The first document is language the Department of Health and Human Services (DHHS) has suggested and the second document contains changes recommended by the County (Exhibits D & E). He noted counties would bear the cost of evaluation and treatment if DHHS's language is adopted. There was consensus to direct the

lobbyists to proceed with the highlighted portions (see Exhibit E) in a draft of amendment language and to hold the other language until the fiscal note is provided.

Terry Wagner, County Sheriff, appeared and said Senators Matt Hansen and Mike Hilgers submitted a floor amendment on LB93 (Adopt the Automatic License Plate Reader Privacy Act), at his request, to extend the retention period from 60 days to 180 days.

Kohout said they will be meeting with Senator John McCollister to see if there is room for compromise on LB776 (Provide requirements for inmate access to telephone or videoconferencing systems in county and city jails). Wiltgen noted the proposal that has been discussed will give inmates 30 minutes a week of free phone calls which will be paid for out of what is remaining from collection of the commission.

Kohout suggested Dan Nolte, County Clerk, review the amendment to LB885 (Change provisions relating to property tax protests) (Exhibit F) to determine whether it addresses his concerns.

Kim Etherton, Community Corrections Director; Scott Etherton, Mental Health Crisis Center Director; and Brad Johnson, Corrections Director, appeared and expressed concerns regarding the potential impact of LB964 (Authorize mental health professionals to take a person into emergency protective custody under the Nebraska Mental Health Commitment Act). K. Etherton questioned whether mental health professionals would understand imminent dangerousness. Wiltgen said law enforcement shares that concern and is also concerned there could be a significant increase in the number of transports by law enforcement. S. Etherton noted an emergency protective custody (EPC) decision takes away an individual's civil rights. Kerry Eagan, Chief Administrative Officer, added that it may be difficult to get individuals who are in crisis but may be short of an EPC standard that are admitted to the Crisis Center moved to another placement. Johnson expressed concern that his staff could lose the ability to place inmates in EPC.

Shavonna M. Lausterer, Lincoln-Lancaster County Board of Health Director, appeared and indicated she is writing a letter of support for LB715 (State intent relating to appropriations to local public health departments) on behalf of the City and will be asking the Lincoln-Lancaster County Board of Health to submit a letter as well. She said she has also been asked to have conversations with members of the Legislature's Appropriation Committee regarding the bill.

MOTION: Brinkman moved and Amundson seconded to: 1) Support LB715; and 2) Ask that the Lincoln-Lancaster County Board of Health's letter of support indicate that Lancaster County also supports the bill. Amundson, Brinkman, Avery and Wiltgen voted yes. Schorr was absent. Motion carried 4-0.

Discussion took place regarding LB677 (Change appropriations for certain health and human services programs). Wiltgen said it was reported at the recent Justice Council Meeting that behavioral health providers' contract utilizations are in excess of where they should be at mid-year. One of the reasons is that Region V is being billed first for behavioral health services that are being provided to individuals on probation rather than utilizing the voucher system that is in place for problem-solving courts and re-entry programming.

MOTION: Brinkman moved and Amundson seconded to: 1) Support LB677; and 2) ask Kim Etherton, Community Corrections Director, to draft a letter of support. Brinkman, Avery, Amundson and Wiltgen voted yes. Schorr was absent. Motion carried 4-0.

Dennis Meyer, Budget & Fiscal Officer, discussed LB1102 (Change provisions relating to distribution of taxes collected, license renewals and fees, and the tax on gross proceeds for county and city lotteries). He estimated the County receives approximately \$1,100,000 in Keno proceeds and said this bill would reduce that amount by approximately \$200,000. It would also reduce the amount that the County transfers for the Keno Prevention Fund by approximately \$35,000. Kohout noted the City of Lincoln has taken a position of opposition to the bill.

MOTION: Brinkman moved and Amundson seconded to oppose LB1102. Avery, Amundson, Brinkman and Wiltgen voted yes. Schorr was absent. Motion carried 4-0.

The Board also took action on the following legislation:

MOTION: Brinkman moved and Amundson seconded to support LB861 (Require that certain prosecution costs be paid by the state). Amundson, Brinkman, Avery and Wiltgen voted yes. Schorr was absent. Motion carried 4-0.

NOTE: Amundson reported later in the meeting that the Nebraska Association of County Officials (NACO) also took a position of support on LB861.

MOTION: Amundson moved and Avery seconded to support Legislative Resolution (LR)281CA (Constitutional amendment to state that affordable health care is a right and to expand eligibility under the medical assistance program). Brinkman, Avery and Amundson voted yes. Wiltgen abstained from voting due to a conflict of interest. Schorr was absent. Motion carried 3-0, with one abstention.

Brinkman said Lausterer has a list of bills that the Health Department is supporting and asked that she share it with the County's lobbyists.

Brinkman also reported that Senator John McCollister's Office contacted her to see if the County Board would be willing to support LB770 (Change provisions relating to the Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program). She said she believes the bill could be viewed in a similar manner as LR281CA, which is that accessing these benefits would be good for the citizenry, adding most of the cost will be borne by the federal government through the program. Kohout said there is a great deal of support for the bill. Lausterer said the Health Department has submitted a letter of support on behalf of the City of Lincoln. She explained there are a number of bills that the department supports but the City does not support, citing LR281CA as an example, and said in those situations the department asks the Board of Health to submit a letter of support. She noted the Mayor's Office has asked the Board of Health not to submit a letter in support of the cigarette tax bills because the Mayor doesn't want to be connected to any tax increases at this point. Lausterer disseminated copies of the legislative bill review form that divisions within her department are asked to complete and a list of legislative bills that have been reviewed (Exhibits G & H). She explained that the Mayor's Office also assigns bills for the department to review to assist it in determining whether to take a position on a bill.

Brinkman felt there needs to be further discussion of what positions the Health Department is taking on behalf of the City and what ramifications there might be if the County Board asks the Health Department to take a position on its behalf that is counter to that of the City's.

Kohout said Kissel, Kohout ES Associates will make notes in their system of the Board of Health's positions on bills so the Board can review them.

MOTION: Amundson moved and Brinkman seconded to support LB770. Avery, Amundson, Brinkman and Wiltgen voted yes. Schorr was absent. Motion carried 4-0.

Brad Johnson, Corrections Director, appeared and expressed concerns regarding the impact of LB776 (Provide requirements for inmate access to telephone or videoconferencing systems in county and city jails), noting the jail facility's video visitation system is being paid for with a 50 cent "draw" on every phone call. He noted there is also \$239,000 in equipment that needs to be paid for.

The Chair recessed the meeting at 9:21 a.m.

3. **BOARD OF CORRECTIONS –** Brad Johnson, Corrections Director

Separate minutes.

The Chair reconvened the meeting at 9:54 a.m.

4. UPDATED OPEN MEETINGS POLICY – Cori Beattie, Deputy County Clerk

Avery questioned why the section on minutes on Page 9 has been struck. Brinkman explained that minutes are addressed on Pages 6 and 7.

There was consensus to schedule the policy on the February 13, 2018 County Board of Commissioners Meeting agenda for action.

5. 24/7 SOBRIETY PROGRAM UPDATE – Kim Etherton, Community Corrections Director

Kim Etherton, Community Corrections Director, said the 24/7 Sobriety Program, which was initiated in October, 2017, is progressing at a slower pace than she had anticipated (there are currently 11 participants). She said she was not aware when she proposed the program that most driving under the influence (DUI) offenders are lodged in detox, rather than jail, which makes it difficult to capture that population. Etherton said there is no bond attached to those individuals' cases so there is no way to work with them unless they volunteer for the program. She said the program will probably be used more for felony DUI offenders.

Etherton said she and Pat Condon, Chief Deputy County Attorney, are exploring whether the program could be expanded to the domestic violence population. She said many domestic violence situations occur when someone is under the influence. Etherton said she recently became aware of a

Department of Justice grant for domestic violence interventions that might be a way to support expansion of the program.

In response to a question from Brinkman, Etherton said she still anticipates that the fees will pay for the program although it is taking longer than initially anticipated.

Etherton said her department has also been looking at different ways to manage some of their screening efforts at the jail for more program identification.

6. PENDING LITIGATION – Doug Cyr, Chief Deputy County Attorney; David Derbin, Deputy County Attorney

MOTION: Brinkman moved and Amundson seconded to enter Executive Session at 10:07 a.m. for the purpose of protecting the public interest with regards to potential litigation.

The Chair said it has been moved and seconded that the Board enter into Executive Session.

ROLL CALL: Brinkman, Avery, Amundson and Wiltgen voted yes. Schorr was absent. Motion carried 4-0.

The Chair restated the purpose for the Board entering into Executive Session.

MOTION: Amundson moved and Avery seconded to exit Executive Session at 10:31 a.m. Avery, Amundson, Brinkman and Wiltgen voted yes. Schorr was absent. Motion carried 4-0.

7. BREAK

The break was included in Item 6.

8. CITIZEN ACADEMY – Todd Duncan, Chief Deputy Sheriff; Brad Johnson, Corrections Director

Todd Duncan, Chief Deputy Sheriff, extended an invitation for Commissioners to attend the upcoming Citizen Academy which will be hosted by the Lancaster Sheriff's Office (LSO), Lancaster County Corrections (LCC) and the Lincoln Police Department (LPD). He said the focus of the program is to provide an inside look at law enforcement and criminal justice in Lancaster County and to strengthen partnerships within the community.

Brad Johnson, Corrections Director, noted they have had leaders from different minority groups participate in the past.

Brinkman felt it would be helpful to share a summary of the content with the New Americans Task Force (NATF).

9. CONTRACT WITH COURTYARD MARRIOTT FOR SEQUENTIAL INTERCEPT MAPPING (SIM) WORKSHOP (JUNE 12-13, 2018) – Kim Etherton, Community Corrections Director

Kim Etherton, Community Corrections Director, explained that sequential intercept mapping is part of the gap analysis that is required for the Bureau of Justice Assistance (BJA) re-entry grant. **NOTE:** Sequential intercept mapping is a method of examining how a jurisdiction manages its criminal justice population. She said the BJA grant will pay for the costs of the County hosting the workshop.

10. FISCAL YEAR (FY) 2018-2019 BUDGET LETTER – Dennis Meyer, Budget & Fiscal Officer

Avery exited the meeting at 10:56 a.m.

There was general consensus to indicate in the budget letter that departments should maintain the same level of funding, outside of personnel costs; are challenged to find efficiencies; and should plan for future needs.

Meyer agreed to bring a draft letter back on February 22nd for Board consideration.

11 CHIEF ADMINISTRATIVE OFFICER REPORT

A. Nebraska Association of County Officials (NACO) Institute of Excellence

There was consensus to send a letter to departments encouraging participation in the NACO Institute of Excellence.

B. County Board of Zoning Appeals Appointment Process

There was consensus to: 1) Schedule reappointment of Ed Woeppel to the County Board of Zoning Appeals (see Exhibit I for his resume); 2) Issue a press release regarding the vacancy; and 3) Check to see if any applications for appointment to the County Board of Zoning Appeals have been submitted to the County Board's Office and contact those individuals to see if they are still interested in serving on that body.

Avery returned to the meeting at 11:03 a.m.

C. Appointment of Gwen Thorpe to the Keno Human Services Prevention Fund Advisory Committee

The item was moved to the February 13, 2018 County Board of Commissioners Meeting agenda.

D. Abbott Motocross Update

Meyer said the Lincoln Sports Foundation Board, which owns and operates the Ethel S. Abbott Sports Complex contracted with Pat Thomas to maintain the motocross track. **NOTE:** The County and Lower Platte South Natural Resources District (NRD) were co-applicants for the Recreational Trails

Program Grant that funded construction of the track and under terms of their contract with the Nebraska Game and Parks Department for the project, they must operate and maintain the track for not less than 20 years following completion of the project (see County Contract No. C-08-0531). He said he and Eagan recently met with Thomas and he indicated ridership numbers remain consistent. Thomas also indicated concerns about the possible sale of the Sports Complex and the ability to sell memberships. **NOTE:** The Ethel S. Abbott Charitable Foundation tried last year to foreclose on the Lincoln Sports Foundation's mortgage and sell the Sports Complex to a company who wanted to convert it into an industrial park. The Lincoln Sports Foundation filed a lawsuit to stop the sale. Eagan said the Nebraska Attorney General has intervened in the lawsuit because of some irregularities with the non-profit corporation. He said he will contact the attorney that represents the Lincoln Sports Foundation to determine their position. Eagan will also discuss strategies with the NRD. It was noted the County Board was recently contacted by an individual who is interested in taking over management of the motocross track.

E. Claim for Review: Payment Voucher (PV) Nos. 599862-66 and PV No. 599861 to Midwest Card and ID Solutions from Emergency Management in the Total Amount of \$3,813.69. There is not a Current Contract and the Amount of These Purchases Requires a Purchase Order.

Eagan explained the purchases were by other counties in the Southeast Nebraska Emergency Management Group (SENEMG) and involves federal grant money. **NOTE**: Lancaster County is the fiscal agent for the group.

Wiltgen felt there should be a contract in place with the vendor.

MOTION: Brinkman moved and Amundson seconded to handle the claim as a regular claim. Brinkman, Avery, Amundson and Wiltgen voted yes. Schorr was absent. Motion carried 4-0.

F. Claim for Review – Payment Voucher (PV) No. 598506 to Jared Gavin, District Court Administrator, in the Total Amount of \$193.84. The County Board Has Requested a Review of All Claims for Employee Reimbursement Other Than Those Related to Travel for County Business.

It was noted that Jared Gavin, District Court Administrator, provided an explanation of this purchase at the Mid-Year Budget Review.

MOTION: Brinkman moved and Amundson seconded to handle the claim as a regular claim. Avery, Amundson, Brinkman and Wiltgen voted yes. Schorr was absent. Motion carried 4-0.

G. Claim for Review – Payment Voucher (PV) No. 599452 to Joseph D. Nigro, Public Defender, in the Amount of \$372.62 for Travel Related Reimbursements. The County Board Has Requested a Review of All Claims from Elected Officials.

Joe Nigro, Public Defender, appeared and gave an explanation of the claim.

MOTION: Brinkman moved and Avery seconded to handle the claim as a regular claim. Amundson, Brinkman, Avery and Wiltgen voted yes. Schorr was absent. Motion carried 4-0.

H. Claim for Review – Payment Voucher (PV) No. 599671 to Tracy Anderson, County Extension Office, in the Total Amount of \$200.36. The County Board Has Requested a Review of All Claims for Employee Reimbursement Other Than Those Related to Travel for County Business.

MOTION: Brinkman moved and Amundson seconded to handle the claim as a regular claim. Avery, Amundson, Brinkman and Wiltgen voted yes. Schorr was absent. Motion carried 4-0.

I. Claim for Review – Payment Voucher (PV) Nos. 598832–589833 to Robert J. (Jeff) Curry, Adult Probation, In the Total Amount of \$163.95. The County Board Has Requested a Review of All Claims for Employee Reimbursement Other Than Those Related to Travel for County Business.

Jeff Curry, Chief Probation Officer, Adult Probation, appeared and gave an explanation of the claim.

MOTION: Brinkman moved and Avery seconded to handle the claim as a regular claim. Brinkman, Avery, Amundson and Wiltgen voted yes. Schorr was absent. Motion carried 4-0.

Matthew Meyerle and Yohance Christie, Deputy Public Defenders, appeared and explained that Items J-L are all related to dues for Inns of Court, a professional development organization for members of the legal community. The cost of dues vary based on how long the individual has been admitted to the bar. Meyerle said there is also an opportunity for continuing legal education (CLE) at each of the monthly meetings.

J. Claim for Review – Payment Voucher (PV) No. 599877 to Sarah Safarik, Deputy Public Defender, in the Total Amount of \$50.00. The County Board Has Requested a Review of All Claims for Employee Reimbursement Other Than Those Related to Travel for County Business.

MOTION: Brinkman moved and Amundson seconded to handle the claim as a regular claim. Brinkman, Avery, Amundson and Wiltgen voted yes. Schorr was absent. Motion carried 4-0.

K. Claim for Review – Payment Voucher (PV) No. 599868 to Yohance Christie, Deputy Public Defender, in the Total Amount of \$125.00. The County Board Has Requested a Review of All Claims for Employee Reimbursement Other Than Those Related to Travel for County Business.

MOTION: Brinkman moved and Amundson seconded to handle the claim as a regular claim. Avery, Amundson, Brinkman and Wiltgen voted yes. Schorr was absent. Motion carried 4-0.

L. Claim for Review – Payment Voucher (PV) No. 599872 to Matthew Meyerle, Deputy Public Defender, in the Total Amount of \$125.00. The County Board Has Requested a Review of All Claims for Employee Reimbursement Other Than Those Related to Travel for County Business.

MOTION: Brinkman moved Amundson seconded to handle the claim as a regular claim. Amundson, Brinkman, Avery and Wiltgen voted yes. Schorr was absent. Motion carried 4-0.

12. GENERAL ADMINISTRATIVE ITEMS

A. Nebraska Association of County Officials (NACO) Southeast District Meeting (Friday, March 20, 2018, The Career Academy at Southeast Community College, 8800 O Street, Lincoln, Nebraska)

It was noted that Amundson, Brinkman, Schorr and Wiltgen plan to attend.

B. Waverly News Subscription Renewal (\$33.50)

There was consensus to renew the subscription.

13. DISCUSSION OF BOARD MEMBER MEETINGS ATTENDED

A. Justice Council – Schorr/Wiltgen

Wiltgen said concerns were expressed that utilization rates for Region V providers are in excess of where they should be at mid-year and there were questions as to why Region V Systems is being billed first for behavioral health services that are being provided to individuals who are on probation rather than having them utilize the voucher system that is in place. Concerns were also expressed about the potential impact of LB964 (Authorize mental health professionals to take a person into emergency protective custody under the Nebraska Mental Health Commitment Act).

B. Lincoln Metropolitan Planning Organization (MPO) – Wiltgen/Brinkman

Brinkman said they received updates on the Lincoln Citizen's Transportation Coalition, On-Street Bike Facilities Study, and the Nebraska Department of Transportation (NDOT) State Freight Plan on Critical Freight Corridor Designations.

C. Lincoln Partnership for Economic Development (LPED) – Brinkman

Brinkman said there was a presentation from ResCare Workforce Services, the organization that took over the American Job Center. She said they also received information on the myLNK application, a mobile database of community services in Lincoln and Lancaster County.

D. Chamber of Commerce Coffee – Wiltgen/Amundson

Wiltgen said City Councilman Roy Christensen and Bruce Bohrer, Executive Vice President and General Counsel, Lincoln Chamber of Commerce, spoke on the proposal for a half-cent sales tax that would be earmarked for streets construction and maintenance. Wiltgen said he gave an update on Trabert Hall, legislation, and the Justice Council and Amundson gave an update on formation of an Infrastructure Task Force.

E. Visitors Promotion Committee (VPC) – Avery

Avery said he did not attend the meeting. Eagan, who was in attendance, said the main topic of discussion was a grant request from Haymarket Park.

Good morning. Today is day 24 of the 2018 Legislature. The Legislature continues its process of conducting morning debate with committee hearings in the afternoon.

LANCASTER COUNTY LEGISLATIVE PRIORITIES

Purchasing Thresholds. Senator Mike Hilgers introduced LB1098 at the County's request. The hearing on this bill occurred last Friday and Bob Walla testified on behalf of Lancaster County. In addition NACO testified in support, as did Commissioner Brian Zuger of Sarpy County. He did offer testimony that indicated Douglas County supported the bill as well but Sean Kelley was sick and unable to testify. We expect an executive session of the committee to discuss the bill following the Speaker's release of information on how he plans to deal with consent calendar.

Competency Restoration. Senator Matt Hansen introduced LB1010 at the County's request. As noted in last week's report, we received some feedback from the Department of Health and Human Services, Division of Behavioral Health regarding some concerns they had with the bill. On Monday, we received their suggested changes to the bill which were forwarded on to Mr. Eagan and Commissioners Wilgen and Schorr. We have attached their suggested changes as well as our suggested changes with this report.

LANCASTER COUNTY ELECTED OFFICIALS/DEPARTMENT HEADS PRIORITIES

LB93 (Hansen) Adopt the Automatic License Plate Reader Privacy Act. SHERIFF WAGNER OPPOSE. LB93 adopts the Automatic License Plate Reader Privacy Act. The act provides that an automatic license plate reader system may only be used by a law enforcement agency as an alert for the purpose of identification, by a parking enforcement entity for regulating the use of a parking facility, for the purposes of controlling access to a secured area, for the purpose of electronic toll collection, and to assist weighing stations in performing their duties. The data captured from an automatic license plate reader system may not be retained except for situations specified in section 4 of the act. Any government entity that does use an automatic license plate reader must adopt a use policy and display that policy on their website, adopt a privacy policy to ensure that the captured information is not shared in violation of this act, and

report annually to the Nebraska Commission on Law Enforcement and Criminal Justice on its automatic license plate reader practices and usage. The report should follow the specifications outlined in subsection (3)(a) of section 6 of this act. Plate data that is capture and evidence derived therefrom ay not be received into evidence in any trial, hearing, or other proceeding, and any person who violates this act will be subject to damages.

The bill moved to Final Reading on Friday of last week.

LB672 (Krist) Provide for medical release for committed offenders. **NEUTRAL.** LB672 allows for an offender who has been committed because of a medial or physical condition to be considered for medial release if they are determined to be terminally ill or permanently incapacitated. Prior to granting release, the department must review the medial, institutional, and criminal records of the offender and any additional medial evidence. To qualify for medial release, the offender must agree to placement for medical treatment. If, during medial release, the offender's condition improves such that they are no longer eligible for release, the department may direct that they be returned to custody pending a hearing. The offender will receive credit for time served on medial release toward the balance of their sentence.

There is a potential cost that could be incurred if the recently released go onto the County's General Assistance program. The hearing on this bill was held on January 17, 2018 before the Judiciary Committee. Sara Hoyle testified in a neutral capacity on behalf of Lancaster County.

The bill remains held in committee.

LB776 (McCollister) Provide requirements for inmate access to telephone or videoconferencing systems in county and city jails. OPPOSE IN PRESENT FORM/PREFER FCC GUIDELINES. LB776 requires each county and city jail to make available either a prepaid telephone call system or collect telephone calls system for telephone services for inmates. The Jail Standards Board is required to ensure that county and city jails are providing inmates with affordable and meaningful means to communicate by telephone or videoconferencing with inmates' families, loved ones, and counsel.

There is some concern about what the term "reasonable" means in this legislation. The hearing on this measure was on Thursday, January 18, 2018. Kerry Eagan testified on behalf of Lancaster County in opposition to this measure.

The bill was advanced to General File by the Judiciary Committee with an amendment attached which clarifies that calls may be made to attorney or attorneys.

We will be setting up a meeting with Senator McCollister in the coming days to see if there is any room for compromise.

LB831 (Wayne) Provide annual salary limitations for elected officials of political subdivisions. **OPPOSE.** LB831 prohibits political subdivisions from paying any elected member of their legislative body an annual salary that is more than two times the annual salary of the member of the Legislature. The hearing on this bill occurred on January 25, 2018 before the Government, Military & Veterans Affairs Committee.

LB870 (Pansing-Brooks) Provide for room confinement for juveniles as prescribed.

MONITOR. LB870 requires documentation of room confinement of a juvenile for longer than one hour over a twenty-four-hour period. LB870 prohibits room confinement of a juvenile as

punishment, due to a staffing shortage, or for the purpose of retaliation by staff. LB870 also prohibits room confinement of a juvenile unless all other less-restrictive alternatives have been exhausted, and the juvenile poses an immediate and substantial risk of harm to self or others.

LB870 prohibits holding a juvenile in room confinement longer than necessary to eliminate the substantial and immediate risk of harm to self or others, and requires that room confinement only be done for a period that does not compromise or harm the mental or physical health of the juvenile. LB870 outlines various other requirements of room confinement of juveniles.

Commissioner Schorr, Commissioner Brinkman, Kerry Eagan and Joe Kohout met with Senator Pansing-Brooks and her legislative aid Chris Tribsch on Tuesday. The meeting was very fruitful with good, open conversation. Senator Pansing-Brooks is preparing an amendment that will address our key concerns.

As noted above, the Judiciary Committee held its hearing on LB870. The hearing brought numerous proponent testifiers, many of whom had at one point been youth subject to confinement in a facility. Their testimony, while very emotional, brought forward the issue of time youth can spend in solitary, which in the stories presented could be several hours, to several days.

Opponent testimony was presented by staff from Lancaster, Douglas, Sarpy, and Kearney facilities, as well as the Director of Facilities for the Department of Health and Human Services. These positions consistently addressed the proposed three-hour limit to confinement, noting that centers are using this as a last resort when needed to protect other youth, or staff. Given the mental health and behavioral needs of some youth, there are times that the three-hour limit is not enough. Senator Pansing-Brooks noted that everyone has agreed that there should be a time limit, due to that limit being crucial on the overall effects it has on those in confinement.

Senator Pansing-Brooks, in both her opening and closing statements on the hearing praised Lancaster County for coming forward with suggestions to address concerns presented by county staff members. The suggestions will be addressed in a future amendment to the bill. We will work to have these changes presented in a committee amendment before the bill moves to the floor, if it is advanced.

The bill remains held in committee.

LB884 (Harr) Change and eliminate provisions relating to county sales and use taxes.

MONITOR. LB884 allows for the imposed sales and use taxes to be used for economic development or manufacturing/industrial site development. LB884 also eliminates applicability to municipalities in certain sections. The hearing on this measure was January 18, 2018 before Revenue Committee. Commissioner Schorr testified on behalf of NACO. The hearing was very balance d and committee members asked good questions. We do not expect the measure to advance from committee.

The bill remains held in committee.

LB885 (Harr) Change provisions relating to property tax protests. **OPPOSE.** LB885 requires property tax protests to indicate whether the person signing the protest is the owner of the property. If the person signing the protest is not the owner of the property, the county clerk must mail a copy of the protest to the owner.

This legislation was introduced by Senator Harr at the request of NACO. Dan Nolte sent a letter with the permission of the Board. There was support from NACO and others at the hearing.

The bill was advanced to General File with AM1626 attached. A copy of that amendment is attached with this report.

LB899 (Erdman) Provide for an adjustment to the assessed value of destroyed real property. MONITOR. LB899 defines destroyed real property as real property that is destroyed by fire or other natural disaster after January 1 and before October 1 or any year. LB898 also makes it the duty of the county assessor to report to the county board of equalization all real property in their county that becomes destroyed real property during any year. After receipt of this report, the county board of equalization must adjust the assessed value of the destroyed real property as prescribed in LB899. The hearing on this bill was on January 25, 2018 before the Revenue Committee. Several testifiers appeared in support and several in opposition. Most indicated that a provision in LB1089, a bill by Senator Jim Smith, represented a better way to address this issue.

The hearing on LB1089 was yesterday. Only one person appeared in opposition – the Nebraska Assessors. It is likely LB1089 will move.

LB905 (Kuehn) Change the burden of proof for certain protests of real property valuations. **OPPOSE.** LB905 places the burden of proof on the county assessor to show that their assessed value is equitable and in accordance with the law at any hearing on a protest regarding real property. The hearing on this bill occurred on January 19, 2018 before Revenue Committee. The bill had no proponents and several opponents. We do not expect the measure to advance from the Revenue Committee.

The bill remains held in committee.

LB943 (Wishart) Redefine a term relating to budget limitations. **SUPPORT.** LB943 changes the definition of allowable growth to mean, for governmental units other than community colleges, the percentage increase in taxable valuation. For community colleges, allowable growth is the percentage increase in excess of the base limitation established in section 77-3446. The hearing on this bill was on January 31, 2018 before the Government, Military & Veterans Affairs Committee.

Proponents of the bill included Lancaster County, the City of Lincoln through the Finance Director and Chief of Police, the League of Nebraska Municipalities, Four Lanes for Nebraska, and the City of Norfolk. Opposition came only from LIBA.

The bill remains held in committee.

LB963 (Smith) Change how often real property is inspected and reviewed for property tax purposes. **OPPOSE.** LB963 requires that real property be inspected and reviewed for property tax purposes no less frequently than every three years.

The hearing on this bill occurred on February 7, 2018 before the Revenue Committee. It was taken with LB961 and LB962. At the hearing, no one appeared in support of any of the bills and no one appeared in opposition; only letters of opposition were read into the record.

LB964 (McDonnell) Authorize mental health professionals to take a person into emergency protective custody under the Nebraska Mental Health Commitment Act. OPPOSE IN CURRENT FORM. LB964 allows for mental health professionals, who have probable cause to believe that a person is mentally ill and dangerous or a danger sex offender, to take such person into emergency protective custody.

Since last week, we have had a series of conversations. What we have been able to determine is that the intent of the bill was to include the definition of "mental health professional" that is located at 71-906 which defines a mental health professional as "a person licensed to practice medicine and surgery or psychology in this state under the Uniform Credentialing Act or an advanced practice registered nurse licensed under the Advanced Practice Registered Nurse Practice Act who has proof of current certification in a psychiatric or mental health specialty." While the language is more limiting, however, both Kim and Scott Etherton continue to have concerns with the language. To be fair, they remain nervous about practitioners not understanding imminent dangerousness, which is required to take someone's civil rights from them. The concerns remain that emergency room doctors could be loading up the crisis center. The question is whether the system is broken and what is trying to be fixed.

In further conversations, it appears that this may be a solution for the Omaha metropolitan area with police needing to be called to emergency rooms to conduct an EPC.

The hearing has been set for February 14, 2018 before the Judiciary Committee.

LB977 (Wayne) Make post-release supervision optional for Class IV felonies. LB977 allows for post-release supervision to be imposed for Class IV felonies at the discretion of the judge.

This bill has been referred to the Judiciary Committee and set for public hearing on February 23, 2018.

LB997 (Murante) Provide limits on salaries of administrative employees of political subdivisions. **OPPOSE.** LB997 prohibits political subdivisions from spending more than five percent of its budgets for salaries and benefits for administrative employees whose primary responsibilities are supervisory or supportive in nature. The hearing on this bill was on January 25, 2018 before the Government, Military & Veterans Affairs Committee. No one appeared in support of the measure and many, many organizations appeared in opposition.

LB1104 (Friesen) Change provisions relating to the special valuation of agricultural or horticultural land. LB1104 adds a new qualification in order for agricultural or horticultural land to receive a special valuation. For land that is located in a county with a population of 100,000 inhabitants or more and that consists of no more than five contiguous acres, the owner or lessee of the land must prove that either: (1) they derived at least 15% of their gross income from agricultural or horticultural activities in the preceding year; or (2) they land produced at least one thousand dollars of gross revenue from agricultural or horticultural activities in the preceding year.

The hearing on this bill has been referred to the Revenue Committee. No hearing date has been set.

LB1112 (Vargas) Change provisions relating to placement and detention of juveniles and permit an additional use of funds under the Community-based Juvenile Services Aid Program. **SUPPORT**. LB1112 prohibits juveniles from being placed at a youth rehabilitation and

treatment center unless such placement is a matter of immediate and urgent necessity. LB1112 also prohibits juveniles under the age of fourteen from being placed in such centers. LB1112 also prohibits juveniles from being detained unless the physical safety of persons in the community would be seriously threated or detention is necessary to secure the presence of the juvenile at the next hearing. Children twelve years or younger may not be placed in detention under any circumstances. Juveniles may not be placed into detention: (1) to allow a parent or guardian to avoid legal responsibility; (2) to punish, treat, or rehabilitate; (3) to permit more convenient administrative access; (4) to facilitate further interrogation or investigation; or (5) due to lack of more appropriate facilities.

LB1112 also allows for funds received under the Community-based Juvenile Services Aid Program to be used one time by an aid recipient: (1) to convert an existing juvenile detention facility or the existing structure for use as an alternative to detention as defined; (2) to invest in capital construction, including both new construction and renovations, for a facility for use as an alternative to detention; or (3) for the initial lease of a facility for use as an alternative to detention.

According to Senator Vargas, the bill is his "JDAI Bill" and would move the state further in that direction.

This bill has been referred to the Judiciary Committee and set for public hearing on February 22, 2018.

LANCASTER COUNTY SPREADSHEET AND HEARING SPREADSHEET

Attached, please find two documents: the first is the weekly spreadsheet that we update on a daily basis during session. This is provided to you each Thursday and again over the weekend.

Second, is the spreadsheet of hearings that have been flagged for hearings during the next two weeks. I would note a few of the following for your comment this week:

LB1064 (Murante) Require election officials to check voter records for deceased individuals and require the Secretary of State to check the citizenship status of all registered voters and applicants to register to vote. LB1064 allows for election commissioners and county clerks to check to determine whether a voter is deceased if a notice is sent to the voter and not returned within thirty days. LB1064 also requires election officials to check the citizenship status of individuals who register to vote if such individual is not currently registered to vote in Nebraska. LB1064 requires the Secretary of State, prior to August 6, 2018, to check the citizenship status of each registered voter and remove those who are not citizens from the registry. If the Secretary of State checks the citizenship status of an applicant and determines that the individual is ineligible to vote but has either attempt to register to vote or successfully registered to vote, the Secretary must provide that information to the Attorney General.

This bill has been referred to the Government, Military & Veterans Affairs Committee and set for public hearing on February 8, 2018.

LB1066 (Murante) Require photographic identification for purposes of voting. LB1066 lists the documents that qualify as photographic identification if the document is current and valid at the time of the election for which it is displayed, if it displays a photograph or digital image of an individual, and it if displays the name of the individual depicted in the photograph or digital

license.LB1066 requires the Secretary of State to provide any elector who applies a photographic identification without fee.

LB1066 requires voters to present a photographic identification card which meets the outlines requirements prior to being handed a ballot. LB1066 also contains new rules for the use of provisional ballots and photographic identification.

This bill has been referred to the Government, Military & Veterans Affairs Committee and set for public hearing on February 8, 2018.

LB677 (Krist) Change appropriations for certain health and human services programs. LB677 increases the funding for behavioral health aid programs from 96,447,841 to 97,634,504. The additional funding is to be taken from the General Fund. LB677 also increased the funding for medical assistance programs to 2,034,850,498 for FY2017-18 and 2,085,328,775 for FY2018-19. The additional funding is to be taken from the General Fund. The funding for Child Welfare Aid is increased to 198,794,731 in both FY2017-18 and FY2018-19. The additional funding is to be taken from the general fund. The funding for Developmental Disability Aid is increased to 158,764,372 in FY2017-18 and 157,627,794 in FY2018-19. The additional funding is to be taken from the general fund.

This bill has been referred to the Appropriations Committee and set for public hearing on February 12, 2018.

LB715 (Howard) State intent relating to appropriations to local public health departments. LB715 states the intent to appropriate to the Department of Health and Human Services \$900,000 from the General Fund for FY2018-19. The Department shall distribute \$50,000 to each of the local public health departments for the purpose of improving preventative health and promoting worksite wellness.

This bill has been referred to the Appropriations and set for public hearing on February 12, 2018.

LB1101 (Vargas) State intent relating to appropriations to behavioral health services providers. LB1101 includes in the appropriation to Agency No. 25, for program No. 348, \$XX General Funds for FY2018-19 to provide for a provider rate increase of five percent for providers of short-term residential treatment services, intensive outpatient treatment services, and substance use assessment services. LB1101 also includes in the appropriation to Agency No. 25, for Program No. 67, \$XX General Funds for FY2018-19 to provide for a provider rate increase of five percent for providers of short-term residential treatment services, intensive outpatient treatment services, and substance use assessment services. LB1101 includes in the appropriation for Agency No. 25, for Program No. 28, \$XX General Funds for FY2018-19 for a provider rate increase of five percent for providers of short-term residential treatment services, intensive outpatient services, treatment services, and substance use assessment services.

This bill has been referred to the Appropriations Committee and set for public hearing on February 12, 2018.

LB1078 (Crawford) Require reporting of sexual abuse allegations as prescribed. LB1078 requires the department, the juvenile services division, each juvenile detention facility, and each staff secure juvenile facility to report to the office all allegations of sexual abuse of a state ward, juvenile on probation, juvenile in a detention facility, and juvenile in a residential child-caring agency. LB1078 also requires the department to report to the Health and Human Services

Committee the number of sexual abuse allegations that occurred for children being served by the Division of Children and Family Services of DHHS and placed at a residential child-caring agency and the number of corresponding screening decision occurrences by category, open investigations by category, and agency substantiations, court substantiations, and court-pending status cases.

This bill has been referred to the Executive Board and set for public hearing on February 12, 2018.

LB1102 (Friesen) Change provisions relating to distribution of taxes collected, license renewals and fees, and the tax on gross proceeds for county and city lotteries. LB1102 allows for lottery licenses to be renewed annually. LB1102 requires counties, cities, and villages who conduct a lottery to submit to the department on a quarterly basis a tax of four percent of the gross proceeds. Such tax will be remitted by the Department to the State Treasurer for credit as follows: (1) two percent to the Charitable Gaming Operations fund; and (2) Two percent to the Property Tax Credit Cash Fund.

This bill has been referred to the General Affairs Committee and set for public hearing on February 12, 2018.

LB861 (Watermeier) Require that certain prosecution costs be paid by the state. LB861 requires the costs of prosecution in excess of the threshold amount be paid by the State if the county's costs of prosecution relating to a single correctional institution incident exceed the threshold amount.

This bill has been referred to the Judiciary Committee and set for public hearing on February 13, 2018.

LR281CA (Morfeld) Constitutional amendment to state that affordable health care is a right and to expand eligibility under the medical assistance program. The provisions are an amendment to the Nebraska constitution that would state as follows: "Affordable health care is a right forever preserved for the people of Nebraska subject to reasonable restrictions as prescribed by law." It then goes on to state that "The Legislature shall provide health insurance under the medical assistance program to adults under the age of sixty-five years with incomes under one hundred thirty-three percent of the federal poverty level in accordance with section 1902(a)(10)(A)(i)(VIII) of the federal Social Security Act, as amended, 42 U.S.C. 1396a(a)(10)(A)(i)(VIII)." This is medicaid expansion in the form of a constitutional amendment.

This bill has been referred to the Health and Human Services Committee and set for public hearing on February 21, 2018.

LB194 also raises the asset requirement of an applicant from twenty-five thousand dollars available for operating the delayed deposit service business to fifty thousand dollars. LB194 raises the fee required for requesting a change of location a branch or designated principle place of business from one hundred fifty dollars to five hundred dollars.

LB194 stipulates the documentation requirement for each delayed deposit loan transaction and what information should be contained in the written agreement. Licensee are also required to openly display a schedule of all finance charges, fees, interest, other charges, and penalties for all services provided.

LB266 also allows for the commission to increase or decrease the value of real property. For the purpose of school district taxation, agricultural and horticultural tax ranges may be: 44 to 50 for tax year 2018; 34-40 for tax year 2019; and 24-30 for tax years 2020 and after.

If, during the transferor's lifetime, an interest in real estate is irrevocably transfers to a related transferee for less than full consideration, the related transferee will be subject to a lien in favor of the State of Nebraska for medical assistance erimbursement to the extent necessary to secure payment subject to stipulated restrictions. LB268 also states that a medical provider shall have the authority of a guardian and conservator for the limited purpose of making application for medical assistance on behalf of a person whom the provider is treating if the person is unconscious or otherwise unable to apply for medical assistance and does not have an existing power of attorney or a court-appointed official to apply on their behalf. When DHHS provides medical assistance to a person because of third party's wrongful act or negligence, the department has the right to recover the medical assistance costs from that third party.

LB874 requires each city that has created a community development authority or limited community development authority to give to governing body of each county and school district the opportunity to appoint a nonvoting member of the authority or limited authority.

LB874 also allows the Auditor of Public Accounts to audit, or cause to be audited, any authority established or any redevelopment plan of such authority when the Auditor determines such audit is necessary or when requested by the governing body. LB874 also includes in the definition of Redevelopment project work undertaken to clear structures in the redevelopment project area which exceed minimum building and design standards in the community and prevent the recurrence of substandard and blighted conditions. LB874 also adds and eliminates other definitions associated with the Community Development Law.

LB874 requires that any loan made for the purpose of financing a redevelopment project that includes the division of taxes only be used for such purpose, and any proceeds form repayment of the loan must be deposited in the city's general fund and may not be used to establish a revolving loan fund.

LB874 also requires the governing body of a city, prior to declaring an area substandard or blighted, to conduct a study or an analysis on whether the area is actual substandard and blighted. The planning commission must then hold a public hearing on the question after giving reasonable notice at least once a week for two consecutive weeks prior to the hearing. After such hearing, the planning commission must submit their recommendations to the governing body. The governing body must then hold a public hearing on those recommendations.

Under LB874, governing authorities must include impacts on the student population of school districts in their cost-benefit model analysis of the redevelopment project. LB874 requires that copies of the cost-benefit analysis be posted on the city's website or made available for public inspection. LB874 prohibits a reimbursement of costs incurred prior to the approval of the redevelopment project for projects that include the division of taxes, with exceptions.

LB874 requires each city that as approved one or more redevelopment plans include in their report to the Property Tax Administrator a list of all projects that have been audited since the last report and a list of all projects to be audited in the next twelve months. LB874 also includes new reporting requirements for planning commissions and governing bodies of cities.

LB874 requires any contract for a redevelopment plan or project that includes the divisions of taxes include a provision requiring the redevelopment to retain copies of all supporting documents associated with the plan or project for three years.

LB878 presumes that the testimony of a jailhouse informant is unreliable. LB878 applies to any case in which a suspect or defendant is charged with any offense. LB878 requires prosecutors to keep a record of the use of testimony or information provided by a jailhouse informant against a suspect or defendant's interest while the informant was imprisoned or confined, and any benefits offered or provided to the informant in exchange for such testimony.

Under LB878, if a prosecutor intends to use the testimony of a jailhouse informant, they must disclose to the defense any information in their possession, custody, or control including the criminal history of the informant, any benefit or deal made with the informant, the specific statements allegedly made by the defendant against which the informant will testify, any previous testimony by the informant, and any occasion in which the informant had previously recanted testimony. This information must be disclosed as soon as practicable, and no later than thirty days before trial.

LB878 requires the court to conduct a hearing to determine whether testimony from the jailhouse informant is reliable, unless waived by the defendant. The prosecutor must demonstrate reliability by clear and convincing evidence. LB878 also provides a standard cautionary instruction to be delivered by the court to the jury anytime the testimony of a jailhouse informant is used.

LB1028 adopts the Abandoned and Dilapidated Housing Act. The Act requires that any person entitled to redeem real property under sections 77-1801 to 77-1863 must paid the reasonable and necessary costs paid by the holder of the tax sale certificate, including materials and labor of all preservation improvements made on the property, within interest. The tax sale certificate holder must provide notice at least thirty days prior to making any improvements on the property to the person to whom the property is assessed. The notice must set forth the identification number of the parcel, the proposed improvements, the estimated costs, and the name and address of the holder. Prior to redeeming the property, the person entitled to redeem must contact the county treasurer to determine if a notice concerning preservation improvements has been filled, if such notice has been filled, the person must make written demand upon the holder of the tax sale certificate for an itemized statement of the amount claimed as the costs for all preservation improvements. The maximum amount of costs for preservation improvements that a holder of a tax sale certificate may be entitled to recover may not exceed twenty-fiver percent of the tax assessed value of the property as of the date the tax sale certificate was issued.

LB1084 adopts the Property Tax Request Limitation Act. The Act prohibits, with exceptions, a school district's property tax request for any year from exceeding the school district's property tax request authority, except for requests that are needed to pay the principle and interest on approved bonds. LB1084 provides the method that each school board of each school district must use to calculate the district's property tax request authority each year. This determined amount must be reported to the State Department of Education. If the department determines that such amount was correctly calculated, it must approve and certify the amount. This certified amount will then be the district's property tax request authority.

The district may exceed its property tax request authority by an amount approved by a majority of the legal voters voting on the issue at a special election called for such purpose. The property tax request amount may also exceed its authority by a percentage approved by an affirmative vote of at least 75% of the school board, with specified limitations.

School districts are not required to increase its property tax request by the full amount allowed in a particular year. If the district elects to not increase to the full amount, they may carry over to future years the amount of unused property tax request authority.

LB1084 provides sunset dates of January 1, 2019 for certain tax exemptions and incentives.

LB1084 imposes a surtax after January 1, 2019 upon an individual who is subject to state income tax under the Nebraska Revenue Act of 1967 and who has federal adjusted gross income for the taxable year of five hundred thousand dollars or more. This surtax will be in addition to any other taxes owed and will be equal to the individual's state income tax liability multiplied by a rate of either: (1) 2.5% if the individual's federal adjusted gross income is at least \$500,000 but less than one million; or (2) five percent if the individual's federal adjusted gross income is at least one million.

LB1084 sets the state tax levied pursuant to section 77-2703 at six percent starting October 1, 2018. LB1084 also includes more services under the definition for "gross receipts for services."

LB1084 requires persons who lack physical presence in the state and who make retail sales of property to purchasers in the state to have the duties and responsibilities of a seller for the purpose of sales and use taxes if such person either. (1) made retail sales of property totaling one hundred thousand dollars or more; or (2) make retail sales of property in two hundred or more separate transactions.

LB1084 eliminates an exception against sales and use taxes for prepared food and food ingredients serviced by schools, admissions fees charged for political events charged by ballot question committees, admissions fees charged by schools, admissions fees charged for participants in any activity provided by a nonprofit sporting event, and admissions fees charged for participation in an activity provided by a nonprofit youth development and healthy living event.

and admissions fees charged for participation in an activity provided by a nonprofit youth development and fleating living event.

LB1084 provides a new way to calculate individual income tax for taxable years beginning after January 1, 2019. The tax will be a percentage of each individual's federal adjusted gross income as modified, plus a percentage of the federal alternative minimum tax and the federal tax on premature or lump-sum distributions for qualified retirement plans. The additional taxes will be recomputed by (i) substituting Nebraska taxable income for federal taxable income, (ii) calculating what the federal alternative minimum tax would be on Nebraska taxable income and adjusting such calculations for any items which are reflected differently in the determination of federal taxable income, and (iii) applying Nebraska rates to the result. The federal credit for prior year minimum tax, after the recomputations required by the act, shall be allowed as a reduction in the income tax due. LB1084 also provides a new way to compute the taxes imposed on all resident estates and trusts for taxable years beginning or deemed to begin on or after January 1, 2019. The tax will be a percentage of the federal taxable income of such estates and trusts as modified in section 77-2716, plus a percentage of the federal alternative minimum tax and the federal tax on premature or lump-sum distributions from qualified retirement plans.

These additional taxes will be recomputed by (A) substituting Nebraska taxable income for federal taxable income, (B) calculating what the federal alternative minimum tax would be on Nebraska taxable income and adjusting such calculations for any items which are reflected differently in the determination of federal taxable income, and (C) applying Nebraska rates to the result.

LB1084 requires residents of Nebraska who are shareholders of a small business corporation to included in their Nebraska taxable income, to the extent includable in federal gross income, their proportionate share of such corporation's or LLC's federal income without any adjustments.

LB1084 requires the tax commissioner to credit to the Property Tax Credit Cash fund an amount equal to the net increase in state sales and use tax revenue and state income tax revenue as a result of the changes made by LB1084m minus the increase in funds paid to school districts under the Tax Equity and Educational Opportunities Support Act and two hundred thousand dollars to account for money spend on an education study.

LB1084 calculates each local school system's allocated income tax funds by multiplying the local system's income tax liability by twenty percent.

LB1084 requires the State Department of Education to oversee and in-depth review of the financing of the public elementary and secondary schools.

For tax years 2019 and after, the actual value of agricultural and horticultural land will be determined based upon the land's capitalized net earning capacity. Capitalized net earning capacity will be determined by using an agricultural land valuation manual developed and updated by the Agricultural Land Valuation Board. Except for wastelands, the actual value of agricultural and horticultural land will be determined by: (1) dividing agricultural and horticultural land into the major use categories and dividing such categories into subclasses based on soil productivity classifications; (2) computing a gross revenue based on a three-year average of annual gross incomes; and dividing the gross revenue by a discount rate determined by the Agricultural Land Valuation Board. The actual value for wasteland will be computed base don five percent of the assessed value of all agricultural and horticultural land in the crop reporting district.

Agricultural land and horticultural land will be separated into five major categories: (1) sprinkler irrigated cropland; (2) gravity irrigated cropland; (3) dryland cropland; (4) grassland; and (5) wasteland. Intensive agricultural uses such as nurseries, feedlots, and orchards will be categorized as sprinkler irrigated cropland, gravity irrigated cropland, or dryland cropland. LB1084 adopts the Property Tax Request Limitation Act. The Act prohibits, with exceptions, a school district's property tax request for any year from exceeding the school district's property tax request authority, except for requests that are needed to pay the principle and interest on approved bonds. LB1084 provides the method that each school board of each school district must use to calculate the district's property tax request authority each year. This determined amount must be reported to the State Department of Education. If the department determines that such amount was correctly calculated, it must approve and certify the amount. This certified amount will then be the district's property tax request authority.

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The district may exceed its property tax request authority by an amount approved by a majority of the legal voters voting on the issue at a special election called for such purpose. The property tax request amount may also exceed its authority by a percentage approved by an affirmative vote of at least 75% of the school board, with specified limitations

School districts are not required to increase its property tax request by the full amount allowed in a particular year. If the district elects to not increase to the full amount, they may carry over to future years the amount of unused property tax request authority.

LB1084 provides sunset dates of January 1, 2019 for certain tax exemptions and incentives.

LB1084 imposes a surtax after January 1, 2019 upon an individual who is subject to state income tax under the Nebraska Revenue Act of 1967 and who has federal adjusted gross income for the taxable year of five hundred thousand dollars or more. This surtax will be in addition to any other taxes owed and will be equal to the individual's state income tax liability multiplied by a rate of either: (1) 2.5% if the individual's federal adjusted gross income is at least \$500,000 but less than one million; or (2) five percent if the individual's federal adjusted gross income is at least one million.

LB1084 sets the state tax levied pursuant to section 77-2703 at six percent starting October 1, 2018. LB1084 also includes more services under the definition for "gross receipts for services.

LB1084 requires persons who lack physical presence in the state and who make retail sales of property to purchasers in the state to have the duties and responsibilities of a seller for the purpose of sales and use taxes if such person either. The tax will be a percentage of each individual's federal adjusted gross income as modified, plus a percentage of the federal alternative minimum tax and the federal tax on premature or lump-sum distributions for qualified retirement plans. The additional taxes will be recomputed by (i) substituting Nebraska taxable income for federal taxable income, (ii) calculating what the federal alternative minimum tax would be on Nebraska taxable income and adjusting such calculations for any items which are reflected differently in the determination of federal taxable income, and (iii) applying Nebraska rates to the result. The federal credit for prior year minimum tax, after the recomputations required by the act, shall be allowed as a reduction in the income tax due. LB1084 also provides a new way to compute the taxes imposed on all resident estates and trusts for taxable years beginning or deemed to begin on or after January 1, 2019. The tax will be a percentage of the federal taxable income of such estates and trusts as modified in section 77-2716, plus a percentage of the federal alternative minimum tax and the federal tax on premature or lump-sum distributions from qualified retirement plans.

These additional taxes will be recomputed by (A) substituting Nebraska taxable income for federal taxable income, (B) calculating what the federal alternative minimum tax would be on Nebraska taxable income and adjusting such calculations for any items which are reflected differently in the determination of federal taxable income, and (C) applying Nebraska rates to the result.

LB 1084 requires residents of Nebraska who are shareholders of a small business corporation to included in their Nebraska taxable income, to the extent includable in federal gross income, their proportionate share of such corporation's or LLC's federal income without any adjustments.

LB1084 requires the tax commissioner to credit to the Property Tax Credit Cash fund an amount equal to the net increase in state sales and use tax revenue and state income tax revenue as a result of the changes made by LB1084m minus the increase in funds paid to school districts under the Tax Equity and Educational Opportunities Support Act and two hundred thousand dollars to account for money spend on an education study.

LB1084 calculates each local school system's allocated income tax funds by multiplying the local system's income tax liability by twenty percent.

LB1084 requires the State Department of Education to oversee and in-depth review of the financing of the public elementary and secondary schools.

The notice must also inform the juvenile that, if the record is not sealed, the juvenile's parent or guardian may file a motion to seal with the court when the juvenile reaches the age of majority or six months have passed since the case was closed. LB869 also creates new authorized persons that may inspect records that have been ordered sealed.

LB875 prohibits the death penalty or life imprisonment from being imposed upon any person for an offense committed with such person was under the age of eighteen. 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

Sec. 2 (1) This section applies to any county containing a city of the primary class. <u>This shall be a pilot project and end on December 31, 2020.</u>

Page 4, line 9 - (3)(a) If the defendant is committed for treatment to a treatment provider other than the Department of Health and Human Services and such treatment provider determines that the defendant should be committed to a different treatment alternative, the treatment provider shall submit a report outlining its opinion to the department. The department may conduct an evaluation of the defendant. If the department concurs in the treatment provider's determination, it shall file the report with the court. If the department does not concur, it shall file the report with the court and provide the court with the reason it does not concur. The county in which the crime is charged shall pay the cost of the evaluation and report to the court completed by the department.

- (4)(a) Within twenty-one days after the filing of a report under subsection (3) of this section, the court shall hold a hearing to determine whether the defendant should be placed in a different treatment alternative. If the court finds after a hearing that such change in placement is appropriate, the court may order the defendant to be committed to a different least restrictive treatment alternative until such time as the disability may be removed.
- (4)(b) If the report to the court by the Department of Health and Human Services recommends the defendant receive treatment in a state hospital for the mentally ill, the defendant shall be immediately admitted to a jail until the defendant can be admitted to the appropriate state hospital for the mentally ill.
- (7) <u>(a)</u> The state shall pay the cost of maintenance and care of the defendant during the period of time ordered by the court for treatment <u>at a state hospital for the mentally ill</u> to remove the disability.
- (b) The county in which the crime is charged shall pay the cost of treatment, maintenance, and care of the defendant during the period of time ordered by the court for treatment at a treatment provider other than a state hospital for the mentally ill.
- (8)(a) A defendant shall not be eligible for outpatient treatment under this section if he or she is charged with an offense for which bail is prohibited or if the judge determines that the public's safety would be at risk.
- (b) For a defendant that has not been determined ineligible under section (a); a defendant shall be eligible for outpatient treatment under this section if he or she is released on bond; living in a community based setting; does not pose an imminent risk of violence to self or others; has stable housing; not actively using illicit substances and is willing to abstain from doing so for the duration of treatment; and adhere to treatment recommendations, including taking psychotropic medications, if determined medically necessary.

- 77-1502 (1) The county board of equalization shall meet for the 5 purpose of reviewing and deciding written protests filed pursuant to this 6 section beginning on or after June 1 and ending on or before July 25 of 7 each year. Protests regarding real property shall be signed and filed 8 after the county assessor's completion of the real property assessment 9 roll required by section 77-1315 and on or before June 30. For protests 10 of real property, a protest shall be filed for each parcel. Protests 11 regarding taxable tangible personal property returns filed pursuant to 12 section 77-1229 from January 1 through May 1 shall be signed and filed on 13 or before June 30. The county board in a county with a population of more 14 15 than one hundred thousand inhabitants based upon the most recent federal decennial census may adopt a resolution to extend the deadline for 16 hearing protests from July 25 to August 10. The resolution must be 17 adopted before July 25 and it will affect the time for hearing protests 18 for that year only. By adopting such resolution, such county waives any 19 right to petition the Tax Equalization and Review Commission for 20 adjustment of a class or subclass of real property under section 21 22 77-1504.01 for that year.
- (2) Each protest shall be signed and filed with the county clerk of the county where the property is assessed. The protest shall contain or have attached a statement of the reason or reasons why the requested change should be made and a description of the property to which the protest applies. If the property is real property, a description adequate

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
- to identify each parcel shall be provided. If the property is tangible 1 personal property, a physical description of the property under protest 2 3 shall be provided. If the protest does not contain or have attached the statement of the reason or reasons for the protest or the applicable 4 description of the property, the protest shall be dismissed by the county 5 board of equalization. The protest shall also indicate whether the person 6 7 signing the protest is an owner of the property or a person authorized to protest on behalf of the owner. If the person signing the protest is a 8 person authorized to protest on behalf of the owner, such person shall 9 provide the authorization with the protest. If the person signing the 10 protest is not an owner of the property or a person authorized to protest 11 12 on behalf of the owner, the county clerk shall mail a copy of the protest to the owner of the property at the address to which the property tax 13 statements are mailed.
- 15 (3) Beginning January 1, 2014, in counties with a population of at 16 least one hundred fifty thousand inhabitants according to the most recent federal decennial census, for a protest regarding real property, each 17 protester shall be afforded the opportunity to meet in person with the 18 county board of equalization or a referee appointed under section 19 77-1502.01 to provide information relevant to the protested property 20 21 value.
- (4) No hearing of the county board of equalization on a protest 22 23 filed under this section shall be held before a single commissioner or supervisor. 24
- (5) The county clerk or county assessor shall prepare a separate 25 report on each protest. The report shall include (a) a description 26 adequate to identify the real property or a physical description of the 27 28 tangible personal property to which the protest applies, (b) any recommendation of the county assessor for action on the protest, (c) if a 29 referee is used, the recommendation of the referee, (d) the date the 30 31 county board of equalization heard the protest, (e) the decision made by

- the county board of equalization, (f) the date of the decision, and (g) 1 the date notice of the decision was mailed to the protester. The report 2 shall contain, or have attached to it, a statement, signed by the 3 chairperson of the county board of equalization, describing the basis 4 5 upon which the board's decision was made. The report shall have attached to it a copy of that portion of the property record file which 6 substantiates calculation of the protested value unless the county 7 8 assessor certifies to the county board of equalization that a copy is maintained in either electronic or paper form in his or her office. One 9 copy of the report, if prepared by the county clerk, shall be given to 10 11 the county assessor on or before August 2. The county assessor shall have no authority to make a change in the assessment rolls until there is in 12 his or her possession a report which has been completed in the manner 13 specified in this section. If the county assessor deems a report 14 submitted by the county clerk incomplete, the county assessor shall 15 16 return the same to the county clerk for proper preparation.
- 17 (6) On or before August 2, or on or before August 18 in a county that has adopted a resolution to extend the deadline for hearing 18 protests, the county clerk shall mail to the protester written notice of 19 the board's decision. The notice shall contain a statement advising the 20 protester that a report of the board's decision is available at the 21 county clerk's or county assessor's office, whichever is appropriate. If 22 the protester is not an owner of the property involved in the protest or 23 a person authorized to protest on behalf of the owner, the county clerk 24 shall also mail written notice of the board's decision to the owner of 25 such property at the address to which the property tax statements are 26 27 mailed.

Ed Woeppel has served as the Education & Program Director for the Nebraska Cooperative Council since 1999. He is responsible for the planning, development and coordination of the Council's educational programs for directors, managers and employees of cooperatives. He serves as editor of *Cooperation in Nebraska* and the Council's *Annual Report* and is also responsible for communications such as Legislative Updates and other member communications. He also coordinates the NCC Education Foundation Scholarship Program and other youth educational efforts

Prior to joining the Council, Woeppel served as the consultant for Agricultural Education and Executive Director of the Nebraska Young Farmers/Ranchers Educational Association with the Nebraska Department of Education since 1987. Before that, he was the Agriculture Education Instructor/Adult Coordinator at the Battle Creek Public Schools for 9 years.

Woeppel has been a member of the Nebraska Agribusiness Club since 1987 serving as president in 2003. His other professional affiliations include the Nebraska Vocational Agriculture Association (1978-1999) serving as president in 1991-92; National Association of Agricultural Educators (1978-1999); the American Vocational Association (1978-1999); board member of the National Young Farmers Educational Association (1994-1999); State FFA Alumni Council (1986-1999); Ag Committee of the Lincoln Chamber of Commerce (1987-1999) and the Lancaster County Extension Board (1993-1998) where he served as president from 1995-1998.

He currently serves as Chair of the Lancaster County Board of Zoning Appeals, is on the board of directors for the Nebraska Cooperative Development Center, the Nebraska Agricultural Leadership Council (LEAD) and Chair of the Norris FFA Boosters organization. He also has served as an Elder for his church

He received the honorary State FFA degree in 1987 and the honorary National FFA degree in 1991. In April of 2000, he received the Nebraska FFA Distinguished Service Award, and in 2007 he received the Nebraska FFA VIP award. Woeppel served on the Board of Directors for the Nebraska FFA Foundation from 1999-2006. He also served on the Agricultural Advisory Committee for Senator David Karnes in 1988. In 2012 he received the "Titan Booster" award from the Norris Public School Foundation.

Woeppel holds bachelor's and master's degrees from a distinguished Big Ten University, the University of Nebraska-Lincoln.

A native of Stanton, where he grew up on a farm, Woeppel and his wife Lisa have four children, three who graduated from college and are now in graduate school. Grace is in her third year of Medical school at Palmer College of Chiropractic in Davenport Ia., Melissa is in her third year of Seminary at Gettysburg Pa., and Emilia is working on her Master Degree and is teaching Ag Education at Sterling High School. There son Gus is a senior at Norris High School with heavy involvement in football, FFA and advanced academics.

Woeppel has served as a youth football and softball coach and has spent 38 years as a referee for high school and semi-pro football games.

He has also been heavily involved in many philanthropic organizations. He is a co-incorporator of three Foundations that serve the state of Nebraska. He and Richard Katt co-founded the Nebraska FFA Foundation, he and Robert Andersen co-founded the Nebraska Cooperative Council Education Foundation and he and Dan Rice co-founded the Norris FFA Boosters Foundation that provides a 110 acre learning lab for Norris agricultural students. Woeppel continues to be actively involved in each of these groups to help them meet their goal of providing opportunities for Nebraska youth involved in agriculture.

In addition to the director education programs of the Council, Woeppel has also implemented a Coop 101 program for college students at UNL, NCTA, SCC-Beatrice, SCC-Lincoln, CCC-Hastings, CCC-Columbus and NCC-Norfolk. The program is designed to provide these students with an understanding of the cooperative business model and the value that it brings to rural Nebraska. Since it's inception in 2011, 90 presentations for over 1550 college students have been provided.
