PROJECT DESCRIPTION: The purpose of this mini-grant contract is to provide funding assistance to law enforcement agencies for selective overtime enforcement in the emphasis area of: (Check One) Occupant Protection , Alcohol , Speed , Distracted Driving , or General Traffic . The funding assistance will provide reimbursement for overtime salaries. Regular traffic enforcement activities must remain at the current level and all activities funded by this mini-grant must be above and beyond the current level of enforcement activity.

 Selective Overtime Enforcement Budget: Additional deputies will be utilized for both "high visibility" and "saturation" patrol. Overtime hours will be compensated at 1.5 times the deputy's normal hourly rate. An estimated 220 hours of overtime compensation is requested. Total request is \$11,220.00. Impact Evaluation: Through "high visibility" enforcement and "saturation" patrol, increase the safety belt and child restraint usage. Within sixty (60) days from the conclusion of the activity the reimbursement request must be submitted. After sixty (60) days, reimbursements may not be honored.

The Nebraska Department of Transportation Highway Safety Office is promoting a zero tolerance for safety belt and child restraint violations with the "Click It or Ticket" mobilization. This is a nationwide effort to increase awareness and usage of seatbelts and child restraint systems. To participate in the mobilization effort I would propose using both high visibility enforcement and saturation patrol. High visibility enforcement would be accomplished by setting up a traffic safety checkpoint. Saturation patrol would be accomplished by utilizing the deputies involved in the checkpoint to run traffic on an individual basis following the checkpoint. Saturation patrol would continue through the weekend by utilizing 2-3 deputies to run traffic, on an individual basis, during peak traffic times.

The overall focus would be the safety of the motorist on the public roads of Lancaster County and to increase safety belt and child restraint usage. I feel we have successfully implemented traffic safety checkpoints in the past and they serve as a productive form of traffic enforcement.

Thank you for your consideration regarding this proposal. Any suggestions or comments would be appreciated.

Please review the following information regarding the "Click It or Ticket" mobilization.

- I. The "Click It or Ticket" mobilization consists of several components, which is focused around the "enforcement wave" that runs from May 20, 2019 until June 02, 2019. The mobilization also includes a pre- and post-wave traffic survey, a media release before and after the enforcement action, and the enforcement action itself.
- II. The pre- and post-wave traffic surveys consist of a visual observation of 100 vehicles in the target area to see if the seatbelt and child restraint systems are being used. This can be accomplished by an on-duty deputy working in the specific target area.
- III. A press release with details regarding the up-coming enforcement action would be completed and forwarded to all local media. Following the enforcement action a press release would be sent to the local media with details regarding the number of vehicles inspected, total number of contacts, number of citations issued, and any other enforcement action taken.
- IV. The proposed checkpoint is scheduled for May 22, 2019 starting at 1500 hours and continuing until 2000 hours. Vehicles will be selected in a systematic fashion and checked to assure restraint systems are being used properly, to make sure proper documentation is in the vehicle, and to make sure safety equipment is in proper working order. From 2000 hours until 0100 hours the deputies involved in the checkpoint will continue to run traffic on an individual basis to further the mobilization efforts.
- V. To continue the "Click It or Ticket" efforts I propose using saturation patrol on Friday, May 24, 2019 thru Sunday, May 26, 2019 and Friday, May 31, 2019 thru Sunday, June 02, 2019. 2-3 deputies would be utilized to run traffic on an individual basis during the hours of 1600 to 2200.
- VI. The exact location of the safety checkpoint has not been determined, however, Hwy 2, Hwy 6, Hwy 77, and Hwy 34 east of Lincoln are all being considered.
- VII. I propose 14 deputies and a sergeant be utilized for the traffic safety checkpoint. Some on-duty deputies could be used for the checkpoint to help keep the amount of overtime to a minimum.
- VIII. Since additional deputies would be added during the mobilization, overtime compensation would be required. A mini grant can be acquired through the Nebraska Department of Transportation Highway Safety Office to cover the overtime compensation for the deputies involved.
