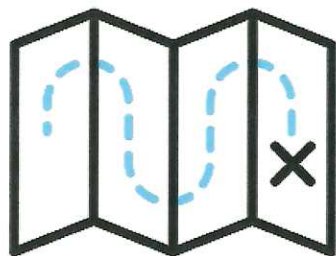

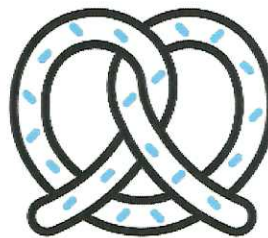

## The Radler Bike Ride

An overnight bike ride from Lincoln to Roca finishing at Roca Berry Farm where a camping, a multi activity festival and dinner awaits the riders. After an evening of food, drinks, games, movies, music & friends riders will spend the night at Roca Berry Farm camping. The following day riders will awake eat breakfast and roll out of Roca Berry Farm at their own leisure returning 100% on bike trails to Canopy Street finish.

- **Day 1 Ride | Lincoln to Roca:** Saturday August 3rd, 2019 | Dinner/ Festival/Camp at Roca Berry Farm
- **Day 2 Return Ride | Roca to Lincoln:** Sunday August 4<sup>th</sup>, 2019 [Not a mass start – sleepy roll out after eat breakfast] | Finish at Canopy St

### Day 1: Ride to Roca

- **Route Basics:** Start at Canopy Street take roads to Pioneers Park before getting onto bike trails to Roca and ending at Roca Berry Farm.
- **Afternoon Start** (We are looking at a 1:30 pm start. After Farmers Market)
- **Parking Cars** at Polygon Lots North of Post Office
- **Route Description:** Mass roll out of Canopy Street with full road closure. Then onto 9th St, one or two lanes. (keep lanes open for car traffic). Have entire Rosa Parkway westbound. Turn south onto Folsom and continue to W. Burnham Road, where riders turn west until they reach Coddington. Riders will turn north on Coddington and turn west into Pioneers Park before turning around in Pioneers Park by Pinewood Bowl and heading east on the Bison Trail (near mile 7.5). I am open to suggestions but I believe that the easiest traffic control plan for this section of the course is to eliminate car traffic and allow bikes free range of the road because of density of bike traffic and the short term closure.
- **Food & Water Stops Along the Way:** We are currently planning for 2 Food/Snack stations (SAG Stops) and then 2 water stops, a total of 4 Stops. These will be spots where riders can get off their bikes have a drink or snack.
  - Pioneers Park at the Columns | Lemonade & Cookies (only on Saturday)
  - Wilderness Park near Bison/Jamaica/Levee Bridge | Water Refill Zone
  - Jamaica Trail on Trail near Yankee Hill Blvd | Water Refill Zone
  - Saltillo Trailhead Parking Lot | Frozen Treat (Saturday), Muffins (Sunday)
- **Bison/Jamaica Trail Final 12 Miles:** Eventually riders will end up on Jamaica Trail to finish at Roca Berry Farm. Riders will be on a crushed limestone bike trail that crosses 5 streets. I am suggesting we have officers at each one of those intersections but they determine with each group of rider if it easier to stop cars or bikes.

### Day 2: Ride back to Lincoln

- **Generally Feel:** The Sunday ride is more low-key than the day before – thus less production and only a street closure at the finish line.
- **Not a mass start** – pack up, eat breakfast and go back to Lincoln.
  - Start Window 2 hours at leisure of riders from 7 am to 9 am.
- **Sunday Route:** Take trail entire way and the shortest way back (12.5 miles total)
  - Take Jamaica Trail to 4<sup>th</sup> St Trail, then on open road from J St to 7<sup>th</sup>.
- **No Police Support:** On Day 2 there will NOT be Police at trail crossings because of length in-between bikes
- **Street Closure on Canopy for Finish Line/Arch:** from P St to R St. (5 am to 2 pm)

### Other Helpful Bullet Points

- Bikes range in speed from 7 mph to 20 mph. (8 minutes per mile to 2.5 minutes)
- This is an event, not a race so stopping bikes can be done if needed or we think it is safer.

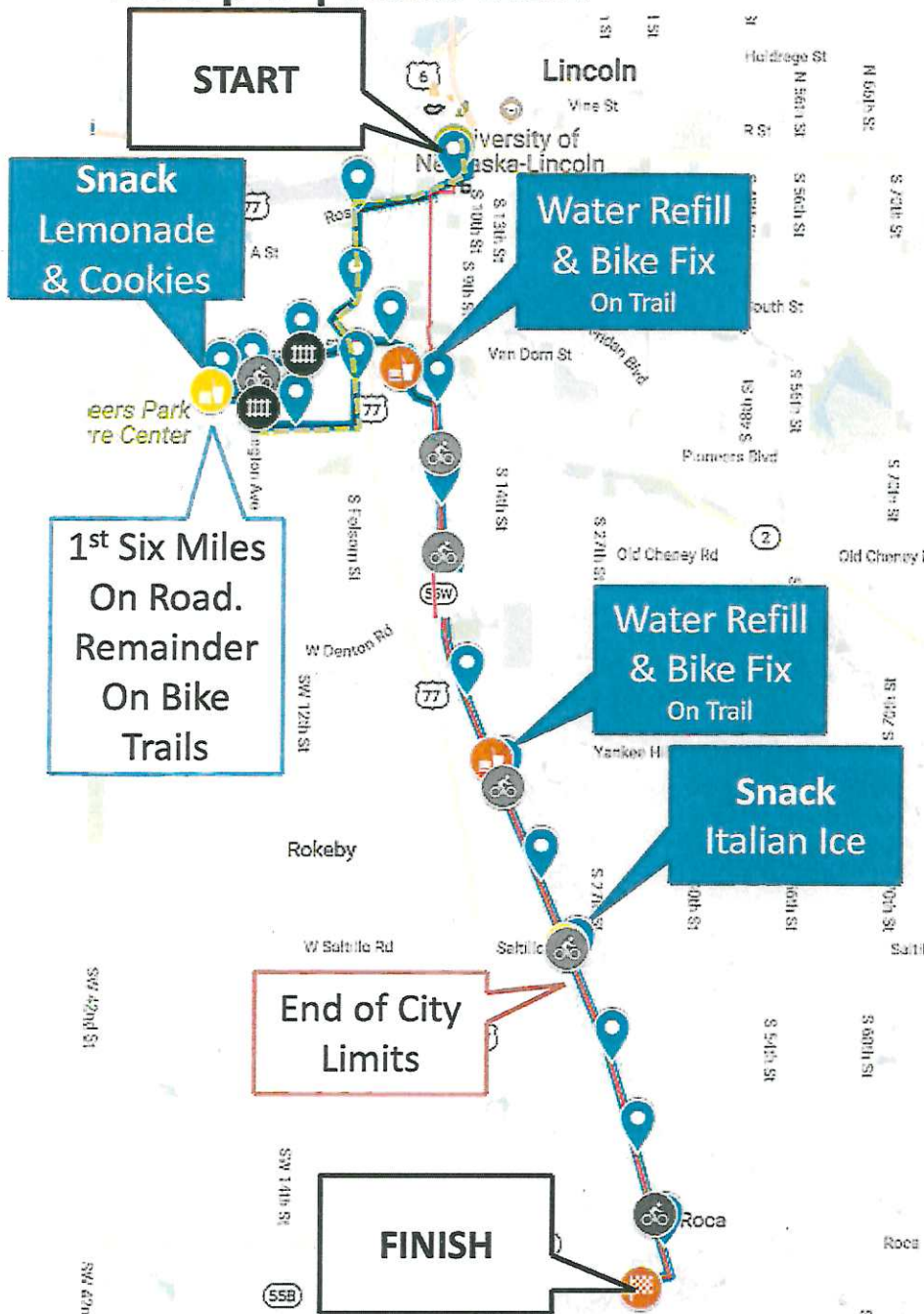

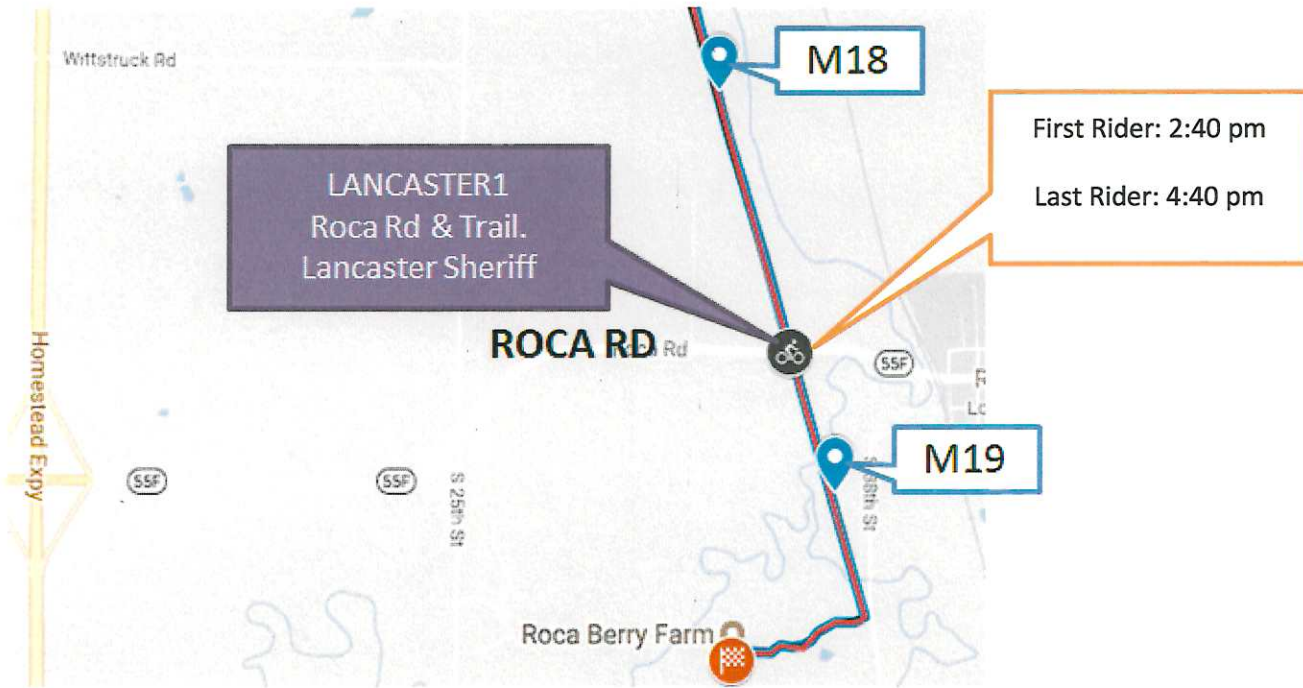

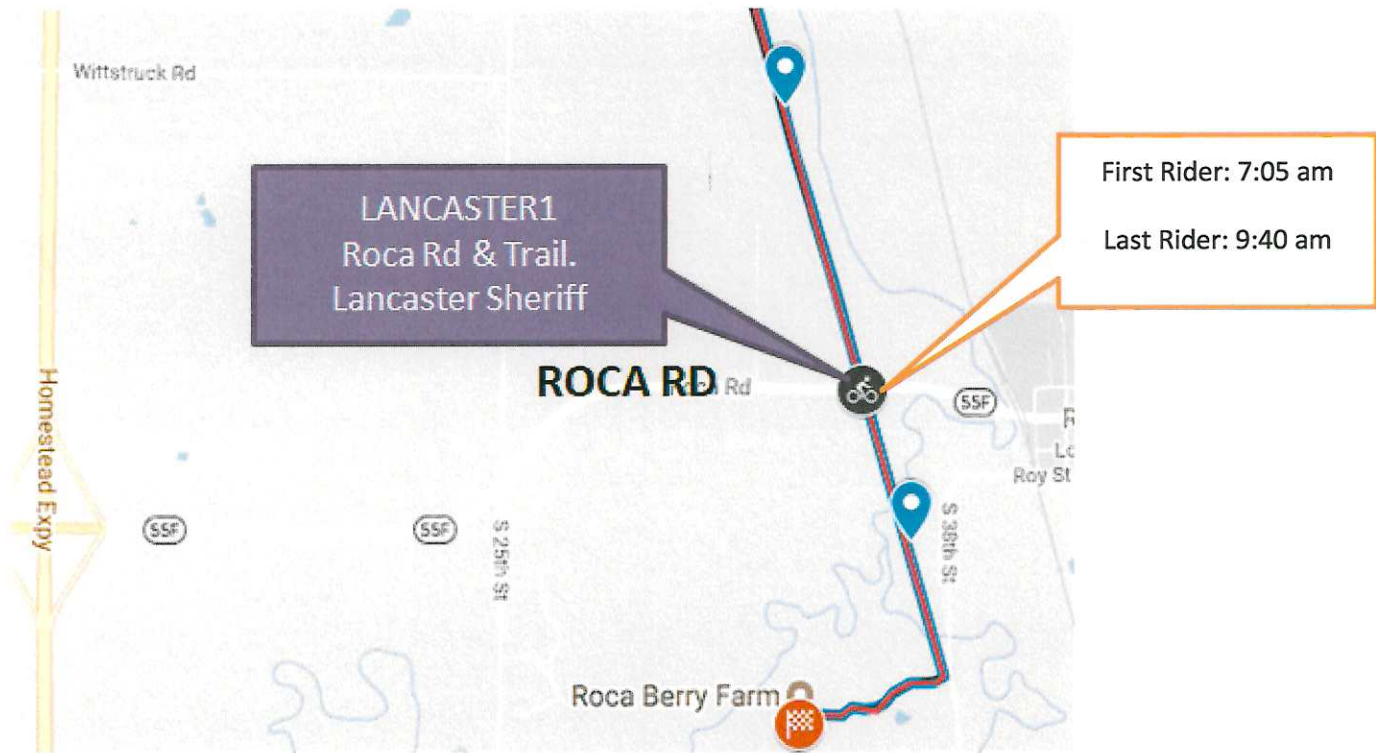

## **Emergency Action Plan & Contingency Planning Outline**

On January 25<sup>th</sup>, 2019 Ben Cohoon with Pink Gorilla Events meet with the Director of Lancaster County Emergency Management (Jim Davidsaver) to discuss an Emergency Action Plan & Contingency Plan in-case of severe weather during the event.

- The following document is our internal plan that came out of that meeting in the off chance that severe weather would happen on event weekend.
- Lancaster County Emergency Management team agreed to continue to advise us leading up to the event. As outlined in the overview with procedures Wednesday, Friday and potentially Saturday.
  - This system will provide us with the best resources in the county to make the best decision for the most people.



# Emergency Evacuation & Potential Severe Weather Plan

## Race Week

- Connect with Lancaster County Emergency Management team on Wednesday
  - Determine if severe weather likely. Based upon type of weather and information go to Weather Event Trigger chart.
    - Start plan for loop course Saturday and Sunday Out/Back.
- Connect with Lancaster County Emergency Management team on Friday
  - If severe weather is likely. Determine type, location and timeline.
    - In act plan for loop course Saturday and Sunday Out/Back.

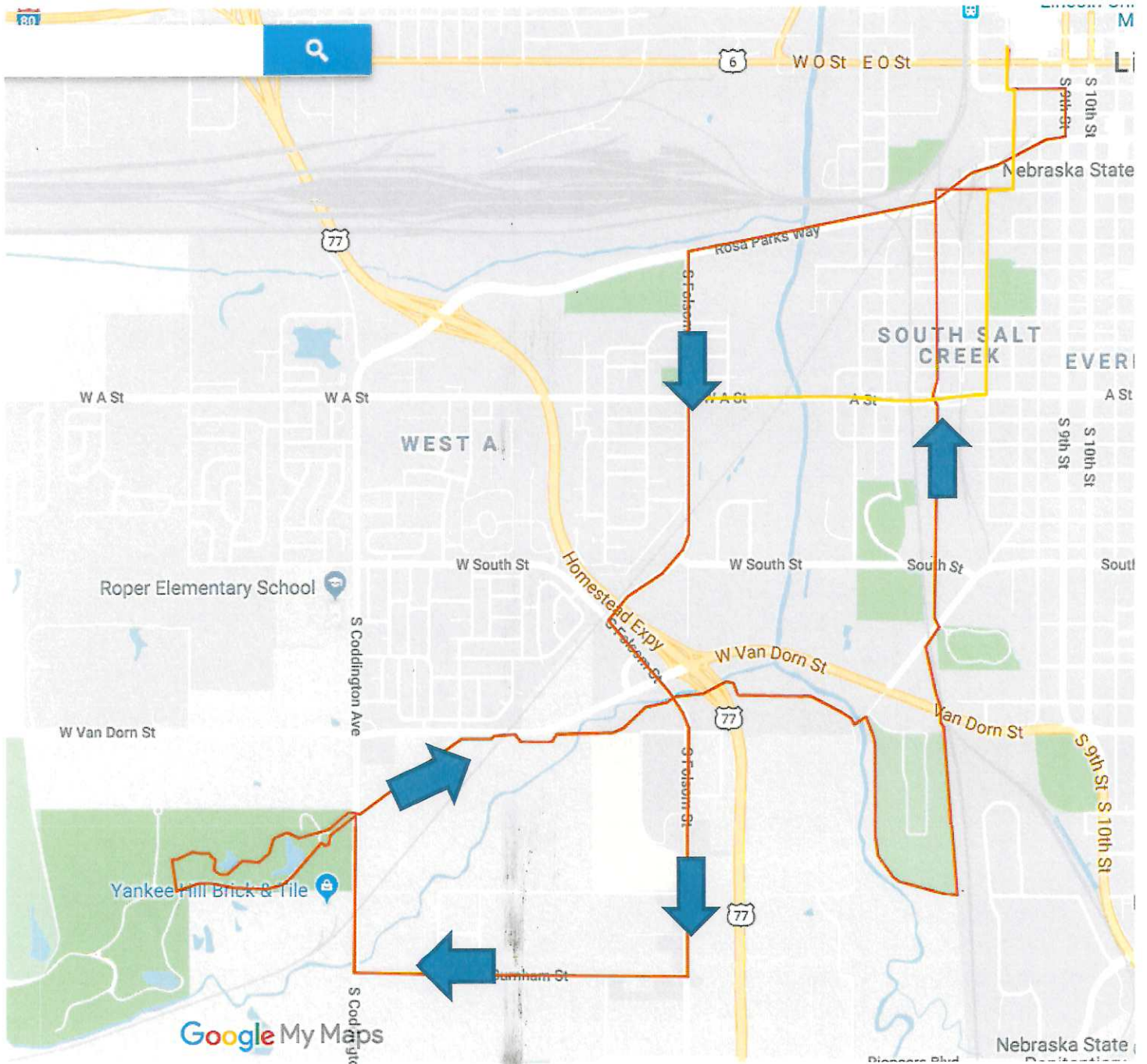

# Contingency Loop Saturday

Severe storms pose a high enough threat for to the festival in evening hours.

1. Keep start time the same at 1:30 pm
2. Turn route into a loop. On-street section the same. Only change in police plan is 2<sup>nd</sup> location for LPD officers & extend Canopy Street Closure
3. After done rider. Participants can drive to Roca if weather events are later in evening.

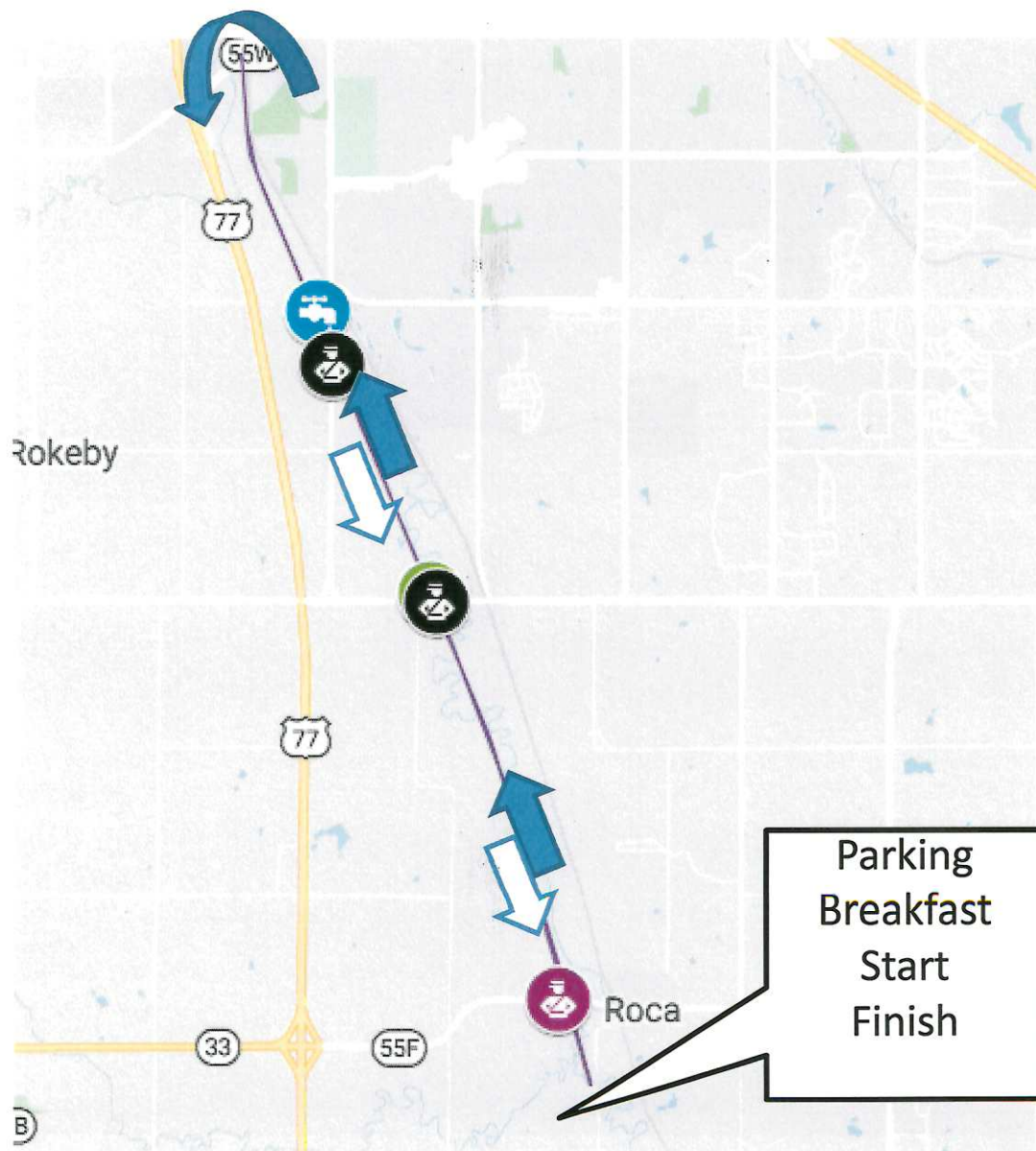




# Contingency Out & Back Sunday

Riders do a loop on Saturday but weather is perfect on Sunday.

1. Riders, their vehicles and bikes go to Roca Berry Farm
  - Park cars on Roca Berry Farm property like they do for Pumpkin Season.
2. Breakfast served between 7:00 am and 9:00 am (same as scheduled)
3. Riders have option to do an out and back route on bike trail

# Emergency Evacuation & Potential Severe Weather Plan

## Step 1: 7 Day Out Weather Check

Check NOAA.gov 7 day forecast and determine the percent chance of rain and any potential severe weather.

If calling for rain over 50% or chance of severe weather

- Pre-prepare traffic control, race crew for potential loop course and vehicles drive to festival.
- Contact emergency shelters and secure keys and information

If calling for rain 0%

- Contact emergency shelters and secure keys and information. But tell them that unlikely will need shelters

## Step 2: 36 Hour Weather Check

Check with Lancaster Event Emergency Management.

- If Severe potential threats will have a face to face meeting with Lancaster Event Emergency Management.
- Thunderstorms likely but Tornados are not outlined
  - Call NOAA Nebraska number and ask for likelihood of tornado producing conditions
    - If suggest that it is a potential. Keep the Emergency Evacuation Buses and coordinate details as such with bus company and emergency shelters.
- If Tornados are possible
  - keep the Emergency Evacuation Buses and coordinate details as such with bus company and emergency shelters
- If 0% chance of Severe Thunderstorms
  - Cancel Emergency Evacuation Buses and keep the Standard Return Shuttle and pay the \$50 per bus cancellation fee.
  - Outline extremely unlikely will use emergency shelters.

# Emergency Evacuation & Potential Severe Weather Plan

## Weather on Event Day

In case we experience a weather emergency, we will be in touch with each of you through an emergency text message, the event phone app and social media channels. We will send this text message out to the number that you provided during registration. Please follow the instructions given to you to help you remain as safe as possible.

## **Pre-Ride Saturday | At Staging or Start Line [City of Lincoln]**

If at the start of the ride a weather emergency is possible. The event organizers may delay the start of the event, modify the event or even cancel the event. As outlined above we will be in touch via text message.

If a severe storm watch or warning happens between 11 am and 1:30 pm on Saturday before bike riders leave Lincoln.

- There is enough public buildings in Lincoln's Haymarket that participants can safely be at an emergency shelter.
- Since the event hasn't officially started participants will be spread out ranging from their home to event parking. We will notify participants of the weather and tell them to seek shelter at nearest storm shelter and to wait for further instructions about the start of the race.

## **While Riding**

If event directors start the ride and a severe storm watch or warning occurs in on the 20 mile course between 1:30 pm and 5:00 pm the following procedures will be implemented and relayed to participants.

The event will follow different procedures dependent on if a watch or a warning is issued. In addition different procedures will be followed if the watch or warning is a Thunder or Tornado.

**Tornado Watch Definition:** Be Prepared! Tornadoes are possible in and near the watch area. Review and discuss your emergency plans and check supplies and your safe room. Be ready to act quickly if a warning is issued or you suspect a tornado is approaching. Acting early helps to save lives! Watches are issued by the [Storm Prediction Center](#) for counties where tornadoes may occur. The watch area is typically large, covering numerous counties or even states.

**Tornado Warning Definition: Take Action!** A tornado has been sighted or indicated by weather radar. There is imminent danger to life and property. Move to an interior room on the lowest floor of a sturdy building. Avoid windows. If in a mobile home, a vehicle, or outdoors, move to the closest substantial shelter and protect yourself from flying debris. Warnings are issued by your [local forecast office](#). Warnings typically encompass a much smaller area (around the size of a city or small county) that may be impacted by a tornado identified by a forecaster on [radar](#) or by a [trained spotter](#)/law enforcement who is watching the storm.



# Emergency Evacuation & Potential Severe Weather Plan

## Weather Watch Procedure While Riding

**Thunderstorm Watch:** Participants will be notified that the area is under a Thunderstorm Watch and the Emergency Weather Management alert will be linked to their text message.

Riders will be advised of the storm and to be prepared and ready to take proper precautions and seek shelter.

- Miles 0 to 15 (Start to Saltillo Rd) | Nearest enclosed shelter will be nearby in adjacent business or building
- Miles 15 to Finish (South of Saltillo Rd) | Nearest enclosed shelter will likely be Roka Berry Farm

### **Tornado Watch:**

**If tornado watch is potential will do a loop course or cancel the event depending on when the watch will start. as outlined.**

Participants will be notified that the area is under a Tornado Watch and the Emergency Weather Management alert will be linked to their text message. Riders will be advised of the storm and the action that the race is taking either to adjust the course to a loop prior to the Tornado Watch threat begins or cancel the event and provide credit to next years ride.

## Weather on Event Day

In case we experience a weather emergency, we will be in touch with each of you through an emergency text message. We will send this text message out to the number that you provided during registration. Please follow the instructions given to you to help you remain as safe as possible.

## Severe Weather Warning Procedure While Riding

### Tornado Warning

- If a Tornado Warning is issued and participants happen to be riding they will be told to seek immediate shelter in a building or under and notified that the area is under a Tornado Warning. The Emergency Weather Management alert will be linked to their text message. **(We should not be in this situation with all the advanced coordination with Lancaster Event Emergency Management)**
- In addition the Thunder Storm and Lighting Warning text will be provided.

### Thunder Storm or Lightning Warning

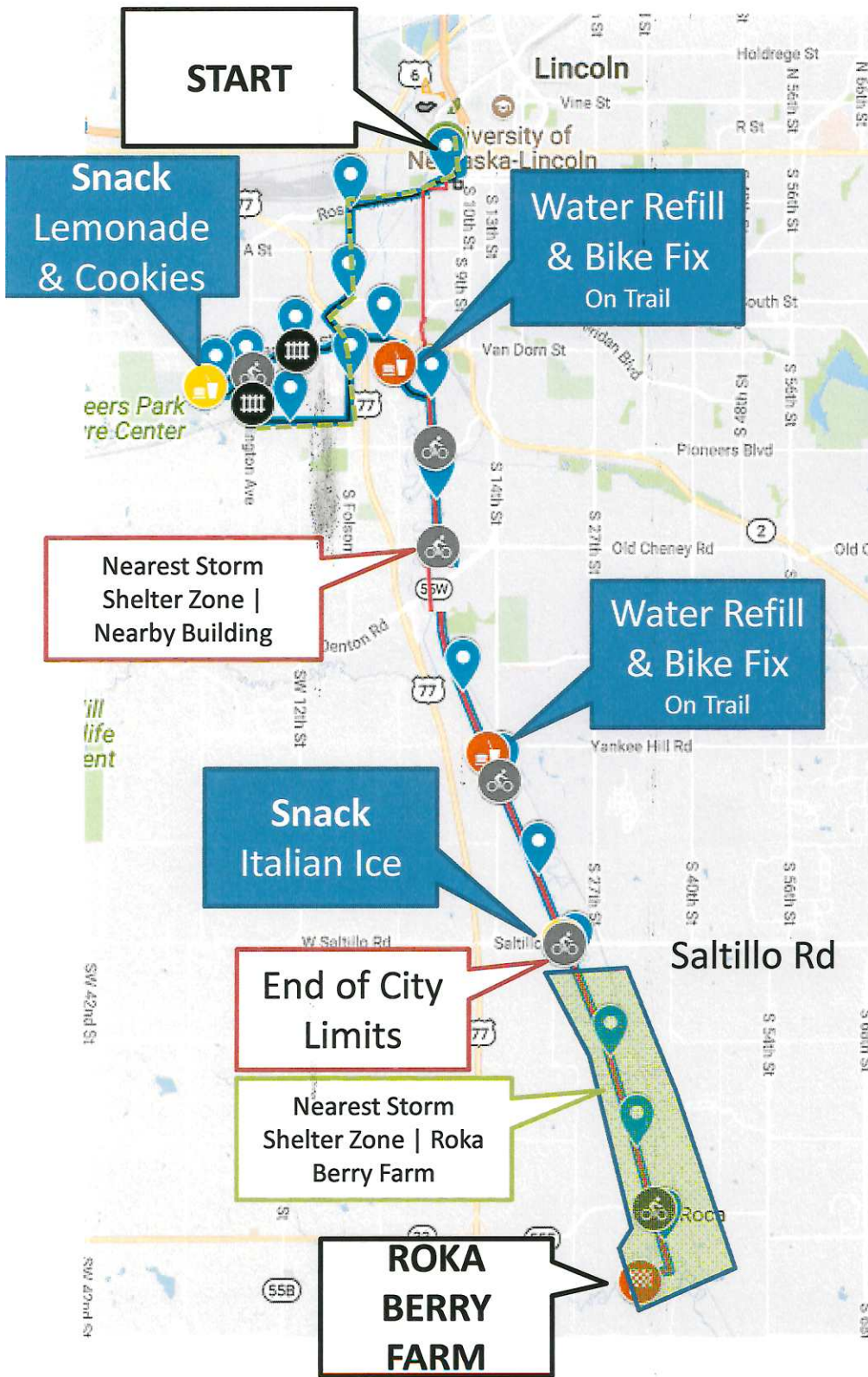
- If Lightning strikes within 10 miles participants will be told to seek immediate shelter and follow the guidelines.
- Flash to Bang – When you see lightning count the number of seconds until you hear thunder. Sound travels at approximately 1 mile in 5 seconds, so a count of 15 seconds means the storm is about 3 miles away. **YOU SHOULD SEEK SHELTER IF THE TIME BETWEEN THE FLASH AND THE BANG IS 30 SECONDS OR LESS**
- “When thunder roars, go indoors!” is a mantra reflecting that an inside location is safest. Sadly, you are not safe anywhere outside, however sometimes; you may not have a choice.
- If you are at Roka Berry Farm find enclosed shelter at one of the several event barns at the property
- If you are on the course and there is no enclosed shelter
  - i. Do not shelter under isolated trees – better to go for a denser grove of shorter trees if possible
  - ii. Avoid water
  - iii. Avoid metal objects (including metal bicycles)
  - iv. If there is no structure where you can seek shelter, find a relatively low spot or ditch and crouch down as illustrated here – this position is called the “lightning crouch” – Notice that the heels are together – this is important because the lightning can transfer from one heel to the other and go back into the ground rather than passing through your body.
  - v. Do not keep riding your bicycle!
  - vi. Do not lay flat on the ground – this is dangerous because if lightning hits the ground, it will travel through the ground and if you are laying down, the current could travel through the full length of your body
  - vii. When riding, you can seek shelter in building, a barn near the road, a front porch of a house, or a local business. Often if you knock on the door of a house, they will allow you to stay in their garage or front porch.
  - viii. Stay inside until 30 minutes after you hear the last clap of thunder.

If you are caught in a lightning storm and if you feel your hair stands on end, your skin tingle, or you hear crackling noises, crouch on the ground with your weight on the balls of the feet, your feet together, your head lowered and ears covered. Some experts recommend placing your hands on your forehead and your elbows on your knees to create a path for lightning to travel to the ground through your extremities rather than through your core (heart)


This letter is regarding a request for a Special Events Permit from Ben Coohon with Pink Gorilla Events, "Radler Bike Race" on the Jamaica Trail and county roads. The race will take place on August 3<sup>rd</sup> between the hours of 8:00 am and 4:30 pm and August 4<sup>th</sup> from 6:00 am to 1:00 pm, will include approximately 1000 participants. The event will start on Saturday August 3<sup>rd</sup> from R Street to Canopy Street in Lincoln and finish at 4:30 pm at the Roca Berry Farms in Roca. The ride will begin again on Sunday August 4<sup>th</sup> between 7:00 am and 1:00 pm. Participants will use the Jamaica North Trail first before exiting onto roads within the city limits of Lincoln.

In examining the application for the "Radler Bike Ride" we recommend the following:

- 1) Prior to the event, the organizer must review the course to determine potential problems that could endanger participants and equipment. The organizer is responsible for noting these problems to the participants, and if severe enough, shall cancel the race.
  - 2) Crowd control and spectator parking must be addressed. Adequate parking, restrooms, and spectator space must be provided to avoid parking and spectator spill over onto the road and assure safe conditions. Parking and other associated facilities shall be located off highway right of way, unless established vehicle parking areas, such as park and ride lots, are available.
  - 3) Event organizers are responsible for clean-up of the race course after the event. This includes removal of water bottles, food bags, and other race litter along the course.
