The Mid-Year Budget Review meeting was convened at 8:05 a.m.

Kerry Eagan, Chief Administrative Officer, disseminated a copy of a letter regarding the allocation of funds for the Lincoln-Lancaster Women's Commission. (Exhibit 1)

**MOTION:** Campbell moved and Stevens seconded approval of a letter regarding the allocation of funds for the Lincoln-Lancaster Women's Commission. Stevens, Campbell and Workman voted aye. Hudkins and Heier were absent from voting. Motion carried.

#### 2002 Lincoln Independent Business Association (LIBA) Breakfast Meetings:

Stevens reported he had a conflict and would not be able to attend the January 29<sup>th</sup> LIBA breakfast meeting.

Campbell agreed that she would attend the meeting in place of Stevens on January 29<sup>th</sup>.

# AGENDA ITEM

1 MID-YEAR BUDGET REVIEW - Dave Kroeker, Budget & Fiscal Officer

# a. Mid-Year Status of Expenditure Budget

Kroeker reviewed the projected needs for additional appropriations from County agencies, noting he had additional documentation from District Judge Karen B. Flowers, Norm Agena, County Assessor and Stephen Rowoldt, Chief Probation Officer for County Court Probation (Exhibit 2).

Eagan clarified that he did not authorize Judge Flowers to purchase new chairs, instead he directed her to visit with the Purchasing Department.

**MOTION:** Hudkins moved and Campbell seconded to request Don Killeen, Property Manager, to evaluate the need for the purchase of new chairs for law clerks in District Court and to notify Judge Flowers that the requisition for the chairs be held unless they have already been purchased. Stevens, Campbell, Hudkins, Heier and Workman voted aye. Motion carried.

Kroeker stated the total request of all agencies, excluding the requests by the County Assessor and the District Court Judge, are \$3,726,000 and noted that \$3,916,000 is available in the budget. He also explained that the \$1,500,000 in the Contingency Fund would be used for salary increases.

Kroeker distributed documentation entitled *Lancaster County Payroll Data for Fiscal Year 2002* and *Lancaster County Payroll Data Year for Fiscal Year 2001* (Exhibit 3).

Campbell said the requests for increased funding for salaries was being driven by increases in benefits and salaries, not because of hiring additional full-time employees.

Stevens, Campbell, Hudkins, Heier and Workman voted aye. Motion carried.

- Lancaster County Building Fund Budget (Page 3-1) Will need approximately \$500,000 of the \$1,049,652 allocated for the new Lancaster County Juvenile Detention Center to pay the remaining bills after the bond funds have been spent. The remaining \$550,000 can be applied to Debt Service for Fiscal Year 2003.
- Keno Fund Collections and Keno Fund Budget Fiscal Year 2002 (Page 3-2 and Page 3-3) All projects may not be completed this fiscal year and it is anticipated that excess projects should not be a problem. \$994,000 fund balance, as of December 31, 2001.

- **MOTION:** Hudkins moved and Campbell seconded to fund the trial preparation software (WINFORCE) for the County Attorney's Office from the micro computer fund. Stevens, Campbell, Hudkins, Heier and Workman voted aye. Motion carried.

Kroeker stated the lid bill allows for a 2.5 percent increase, plus growth. He stated last year's growth was four percent. At some point, Kroeker said, the County will need to slow down spending or look at revisions in the lid bill law.

Kroeker also reported that there would be no change in State Aid or in the Inheritance Fund and that there would be an increase in Cash Reserves and a decrease in Interest Income.

Kroeker noted the biggest unknown would be in Line Item 26, General Fund Cash Balances.

Campbell said she felt future funding for Lancaster Manor, Corrections and Mental Health will be challenging.

Campbell also stated she feels the local political subdivisions will need to speak to the Legislature in the future about providing a trigger mechanism which would allow for cities and counties growing at certain rates. She explained there is a great difference between counties/cities who are not growing as compared to those whose population is greatly increasing. Those differences, she said, demand that there be more latitude in lids.

#### County Court Probation:

**MOTION:** Campbell moved and Stevens seconded to place on a Tuesday County Board agenda the consolidation of the Lancaster County Probation Budget (674) and the District Probation Budget (672) because of the merger of the departments on January 1, 2002. Stevens, Campbell, Heier and Workman voted aye. Hudkins was absent from voting. Motion carried.

Kroeker reviewed the agency requests for additional appropriations (see *Mid-Year Budget Retreat, January 24, 2002* (Pages 5-1 through 5-6).

**MOTION:** Campbell moved and Heier seconded to approve the list as presented on the anticipation of additional appropriations that are allotted for in the Contingency Fund. Stevens, Campbell, Heier and Workman voted aye. Hudkins was absent from voting. Motion carried.
