# MINUTES LANCASTER COUNTY BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS BUDGET MEETING TUESDAY, MAY 14, 2019 IMMEDIATELY FOLLOWING THE BOARD OF EQUALIZATION MEETING COUNTY-CITY BUILDING

Location Announcement of Nebraska Open Meetings Act: A copy of the Nebraska Open Meetings Act is posted. The Vice Chair noted the location of the Open Meetings Act and opened the meeting at 9:50 a.m.

#### **AGENDA ITEM**

#### 1) County Engineer (703, 21, 22)

Dennis Meyer, Budget and Fiscal Officer, reviewed the County Engineer General Fund (703) budget in which the expenses increased 4.79% and there are no revenues (Exhibit A). The Engineer's Office has budgeted for one additional Survey Technician.

Regarding the Bridge and Special Road Fund (21), expenses increased 51.72% and revenues increased .87% (Exhibit B). The budget increased \$4,000,000. Meyer said the majority of the revenue is due to transfers from the General Government Fund (6120). The Engineering cash reserve of \$2,200,000 will be used for projects during the upcoming fiscal year.

Pam Dingman, County Engineer, added the S. 98<sup>th</sup> Street project will be reimbursed 80% through the federal government by the Department of Transportation.

The Highway Fund (22) expenses increased 16.93% and revenues increased 6.27% (Exhibit C).

Dingman stated the current year's Funds 21 and 22 may need to be amended to increase spending authority. Amending the budget will not affect property tax.

Dingman reviewed her Budget Request presentation (Exhibit D). She said the State is out of rock and therefore, the County is bidding from Kansas.

Dingman noted an error in the presentation on the Design Engineering slide. The slide should read "S. 98<sup>th</sup> Street (Old Cheney Street to A Street) and S. 98<sup>th</sup> Street (A Street to O Street)". These projects were submitted to the Lincoln Metropolitan Planning Organization (MPO) and approved in the Transportation Improvement Plan (TIP).

She also stated the maintenance department will be reorganized to have two districts with one employee group focused on bridge and structure maintenance, and one focused on grading and maintenance stabilization. The reorganization would allow for greater efficiency both in employee duties and addressing road issues. Funds for the reinstatement of an additional labor crew are budgeted in Fund 21.

Regarding box culverts, Dingman explained the process is not necessarily quicker than designing a new bridge as there are environmental permits that are needed. She added \$490,000 will be moved from the current year budget to the next fiscal year for box culverts.

With large amounts of construction needs from recent weather events, Dingman stated construction bids have significantly increased.

When asked about the sufficiency ratings for bridges, Dingman said it is a summation of functionality classification of the bridge and the Federal Highway Administration process. The highest rating is 100 on a 100-point scale. The Long-Range Transportation Plan hopes to address bridges with a 50 or less rating.

Dingman thanked Ron Bohaty, Road Maintenance Superintendent; Larry Legg, Civil Engineer IV; Angela Zocholl, Administrative Services Officer; Amy Kavan, Account Clerk II; and Ken Schroeder, Chief Deputy County Surveyor for their support.

Schorr exited the meeting at 10:40 a.m.

Vest asked if increased efficiency was anticipated if new equipment were purchased. Dingman answered yes as they would not be waiting for contractors or replacement parts. She said many hours are lost due to equipment breakdowns.

Dingman said there are funds to study the Engineering buildings to gauge building replacements.

#### **OTHER BUSINESS**

Meyer will distribute an updated budget hearing list for the remaining hearings.

# Engineer: Price Tag On Bridges \$9 Million

It may cost more than \$9 million to repair and replace Lancaster County's inadequate bridges, County Engineer Marvin Nuernberger said Tuesday.

Nuernberger outlined work needs during the County Board's Tuesday morning staff meeting.

A computerized analysis of bridges in the northern half of the county has been completed, he said, and a similar analysis of the southern half is to be finished this week.

Based on analysis results, Nuernberger estimated it will cost \$100,000 to install corrugated metal pipe culverts and \$500,000 to install concrete box culverts to replace some of the inadequate bridges in the county's northern half.

On top of that, he said, it will cost \$4 million to build new bridges at about 90 locations in the northern half.

"I believe it's fair enough to say that the northern and southern halves are similar." Nuernberger said.

He hopes to complete pipe culvert work throughout the county this fall, he said, adding that he will begin work on the box culverts next spring.

Nuernberger says there are more than 500 bridges in Lancaster County and, he was reported as saying earlier, about 90% are unsafe. Twenty-three in the northern half have been closed and he expects the same results in the southern half.

After apprising the board of the needed bridge work. Nuernberger said he will ask the county for emergency appropriations.

In all, the County Board cut \$600,000 from Nueraberger's requested 1975-76 budget. That, said the engineer, will delay the bridge work indefinitely. "If we had it," he said Tuesday, "we could move" Needs according to Task Force Study \$9 million a year for 20 years to close the gap.

# 40 Lancaster County bridges may be closed

Up to 40 county bridges in Lancaster County may be colosed as a public safety we precaution in the wake of a fixed collapsed bridge earlier this week.

Nuernberger said farmers and truck drivers are violating the posted weight limits on the weakened bridges.

The collapse of a 60-foot bridge over the Olive Branch of Salt Creek southwest of Lincoln marks the fifth time a rural bridge has fallen down during the last four years, Nuernberger said he will close all weakened bridges with posted weight limits of five tons or less.

The county engineer said he has replaced about 300 bridges since he took office nearly four years ago. Most of them were smaller bridges and the ones remaining to be replaced are larger, he said.

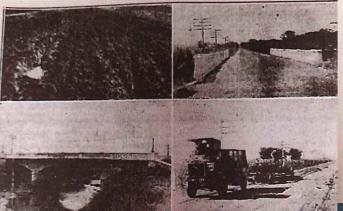

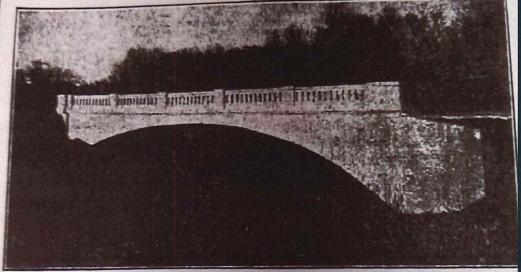
