1 APPROVAL OF THE BOARD OF CORRECTIONS MINUTES OF THURSDAY, AUGUST 11, 2005

2 POPULATION STATISTICS

A. Population Comments

Mike Thurber, Corrections Director, reported a 9% increase in the average daily population this quarter with the largest increase at the Lancaster Correctional Facility (LCF). Total bookings have decreased by 16% and total lodgings have decreased by 13%. He said an average of 30 inmates are being housed at the Platte County Detention Facility each day, which has helped to keep the average daily population numbers down.

Hudkins asked where the County stands with Jail Standards.

Thurber said Jail Standards was informed that the Board has asked for a prearchitectural design. The Jail Standards Board approved the corrective action.

3 DEPARTMENT ACTIVITIES

A. Good News Jail & Prison Ministry

Thurber said Rev. Morgan is developing a new service for Native Americans and is trying to recruit community volunteers.

B. Mental Health Jail Diversion Program

Thurber said the program has diverted 89 individuals. He said 21 remain active and 6 are in transition.

C. In-House Projects

Thurber said inmate crews have worked on county road clean-up and assisted with installation of rural address signs.

Touch screen systems have been installed and contractors are converting and installing a new cameras and recording and card reader systems.

D. New Business

Thurber said a total of 47 inmates have been held at the Platte County Detention Facility at a cost of \$43,000. He noted that \$90,000 was allocated for the project.

Stevens suggested that the Board raise the issue of a regional correctional facility at the Southeast Nebraska Association of County Officials (NACO) District Meeting.

Thurber said nine architectural and consulting firms were represented at the prearchitectural tour of the jail. Proposals must be submitted by November 30, 2005.
